


WOW Suppers

KISS THE PIG

Thoughts from Pastor Bryant

"For I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures," -1 Corinthians 15:3-4

Happy Easter! Christ is Risen! Well, almost. I'm writing this while we're still in the midst of Lent. We haven't even made it to Palm Sunday or Good Friday yet. And yet I can say with confidence that Christ *is* risen. This message of Jesus' death and resurrection was of "first importance" for Paul and the apostles. It became central to their proclamation and the Christian faith that we still share with the world. They believed that this message about these events that we observe during Holy Week and Easter fundamentally changed everything about their lives and the world itself.

Are there events in your life that you can point to as life changing? Are there moments where you can honestly say your life was never the same afterward? In my life, I would point to things like meeting my wife or the births of my children, or maybe my ordination day. It's hard for my kids to imagine it, especially with my graving hair and beard I'm sure, but there was a time before I was a pastor and a father and a husband! There are also tragic or sad events that I could include. I can remember my life before a loved one's death and the life I now live on this side of that loss. On a more global scale, we now can think of our "pre-pandemic" lives or for those of us a bit older, a "pre-9/11" world, or for those even older, maybe "pre-Vietnam War" or "pre-Kennedy assassination." We speak of all of these historical events in the past tense. We talk about the world before they happened and the world after they happened, but the events themselves remain in the past.

When we think about Easter, if ever there was a world or life changing event, that first Sunday morning of resurrection was it! In the Western world, the Romans eventually recognized the centrality of this event by rearranging the way we mark time itself. Most people know that the abbreviation "B.C." stands for "Before Christ." Since Latin isn't taught much anymore, not many know what "A.D." stands for. When I ask them this, most of my Confirmation students guess "After Death." It's actually an abbreviation for "Anno Domini" or "Year of the Lord." In more modern times, some scholars have implemented a shift to the more secular "BCE" and "CE" for "Before the Common Era" and "Common Era." You can rebrand it all you want, but the fact of the matter is, we now delineate the passage of time on earth between the years before Jesus' life, death and resurrection and the years after it.

As Christians, we go even a step further. We don't talk about Jesus' resurrection only in the past tense, as something that only occurred a long time ago in a far away land. We don't simply say that Jesus was resurrected or even that Christ has been raised. We use the present tense to talk about the resurrection because we believe that his resurrection changes everything, including our present. In fact, when we proclaim, "Christ is risen!" what we mean is that time itself has changed for us. Our "Alleluias!" of rejoicing echo alongside all who have celebrated this remarkable event throughout all of history. Our voices join the heavenly chorus that reverberates throughout the cosmos. There is no longer what happened "back then" or even what "will happen" tomorrow. We are living in a new day of resurrection! That's right, Swifties, we're in our resurrection era, and it's going to last for all eternity! Behold! Everything has been made new! Christ is risen indeed!

I don't know if you are up to date on the latest children's programming but a beloved cartoon at our house is "Bluey". It follows a family of blue heeler dogs in Australia. There are two little girl pups, Bluey and Bingo. Plus a mum (Chili) and Dad (Bandit). It has been praised and criticized, as almost everything, for its portrayal of family life, parenting, and tackling all kinds of issues. Personally, I love the show. It shows family life in a way that does not just center on kids being silly or experiencing emotions while growing up but it also shows the adults doing the same, which I think we often forget about as adults. It is joyful while also tackling things everyday families deal with.

I have often wondered why we are not more joyful at church. Yes, the world is a hard, cold place. Full of horrible, awful things happening but that should be even more reason to be joyful in church. I think this is one of the reasons I love the show "Bluey" so much. It does not shy away from the difficulties of childhood or life in general, instead it embraces them while still embracing the whimsical moments of life.

Easter is a time we get to live into the balance of those two realities of our lives and of the world. After all, we hear in the gospel texts about how on Easter morning the women who came to the empty tomb where terrified, hopeful, rejoicing, and scared! The gospel is hopeful for all people that in the harshness of this world, new life can be found. New life can be found because Jesus rose from the grave and destroyed the power of death over our lives forever.

Many people cannot rationalize a God of love and grace with a God who still allows horrible things to happen in this world. Kids with cancer. Wars and poverty. Abuse. Violence. I'm not sure there is a way to rationalize it other than to be joyful in the face of those things. I'm not talking about not taking them seriously. All of the hardships we encounter in this life are serious matters, but it does not mean joy cannot be found. Joy that comes from knowing God walks with us through those horrific events. Joy in knowing while the world is broken because of people's sinful human nature, we get to do our best to be the hands and feet of Christ out in the world. "Weeping may last for the night, but joy comes in the morning."

-Psalm 30:5-Death does not last forever, resurrection to life eternal is just over the horizon. And that is something worth celebrating every day! Dare I say even being whimsical about in this world, to know that because Christ lives we too will live also.

WELCA Scenic Valley Conference Spring Gathering






