## PASTOR SEABAUGH'S MESSAGE

### The Shepherd of Love

As most of you know, a theme has been developed for our life together at Good Shepherd. The theme is Jesus our Shepherd based upon Psalm 23:1, "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want." This month which celebrates Valentine's Day affords us with the opportunity to talk about our Shepherd of Love.

Love is wonderful isn't it. To say that you love someone, or something is about having such high regard for this person or thing that you can't live without them. David in our text is saying just that about the Lord. David was right! David, although he was chosen by God to be king, was a sinner. You and I share this with David. And being in sin means that you cannot or should not be loved. Why or how could someone love another who is unfaithful, a liar, a cheat, a murderer, and adulterer and so forth?

While we would say the answer is that no one should be loved who meets the criteria of sinner, God looked upon the world, and although corrupted by sin, chose to love it anyway. David knew this love as God's promise to save the world. A world that dead to itself, God chose to intervene and make it alive again. A job that only He could do, a job to send His Son, the Shepherd to this world to give His life to redeem, to buy back, all people. This is the love that David boasts about, the Shepherd of which he lacks nothing.

However, this love being received was not going to be easy. Jesus, the Shepherd came, and faced our enemy the devil and all his temptations and was not overcome. He came to this sinful world and all its temptations and was not overcome. As the writer to the Hebrews reminds us, "for we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every respect has been tempted as we are, yet without sin." All this so that He by giving His innocent life as the payment for our sins, we would free from the judgment of sin to eternal death. We know that He accomplished this loving act for us, as His resurrection wonderfully proclaims.

Today, when it comes to love many will try to compare love as to how to show or display the greatest love. Many will be agony trying to figure this out for Valentine's day, but the love that our Shepherd Jesus showed to us by coming and dying for us is unmatched! John 15:13, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends." Our Shepherd held nothing back when it came to show and give us the love that we need! A love that is made evident through His forgiveness. A love received by His Word and Sacraments. A love that empowers us to love our neighbor as we have been loved.

Good Shepherd was formed in the love of this Shepherd in 1962 and we will soon be celebrating 60 years in His loving arms! One great hymn that summarizes this love so beautifully is hymn 709, The King of Love My Shepherd is:

- 1 The King of love my shepherd is,  
Whose goodness faileth never;  
I nothing lack if I am His,  
And He is mine forever.
- 6 And so through all the length of days,  
Thy goodness faileth never;  
Good Shepherd, may I sing Thy praise;  
Within Thy house forever!

Jesus is our loving Shepherd! As we continue through this year, we will remember to give thanks for this Shepherd!

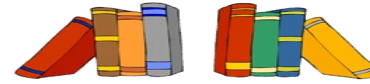
