**YEAR TO DATE AUG 2020 General Fund Contribution Recap**

- ◇ YTD 2020 general fund contributions were \$420,604
- ◇ YTD 2020 actual expenses were \$364,516
- ◇ Comparable YTD 2019 general fund contributions were \$402,047
- ◇ Comparable YTD 2019 actual expenses were \$431,831
- ◇ YTD 2020 budget expenses were \$484,309
- ◇ YTD 2020 general fund contributions were **\$63,704 LESS** than the approved budget.

**FINANCE UPDATE ON THE GOVERNMENT LOAN (PPP)**

We received the PPP loan back on May 12, 2020, for \$69,100 from the United States Small Business Administration, loan services provided by Fox Communities Credit Union. The government (SBA) said that those funds in order to be forgiven could only be used for salaries and utilities, that is what those funds were used to pay.

The PPP is a **loan** from the government until such time the United States government tells us it is a grant. That time is not now. Fox Communities Credit Union advises that we wait for a clear path for loan forgiveness; this is expected to be forthcoming when the US Senate/House agrees to a deal; the timeline for this is not known.

The PPP loan is not considered contributions because it would be misleading to claim a one-time government aid package as contributions, making year-over-year comparison meaningless. This loan is not reported in our monthly update to the congregation because they are not considered contributions.

As of September 15, 2020, the total amount of the loan has been used as designated.

**What do we do:**

The Board of Finance is fiscally responsible for our church. The Board of Finance is committed to budgeting, monitoring, and controlling how church funds are handled. Good Shepherd has the necessary resources to fulfill its mission, vision, and strategy. The Finance Board is tasked with handling all aspects of Good Shepherd's finances. A couple of the primary responsibilities are highlighted here:

**Financial Reporting:** Systematic reporting helps the church see how it is performing financially. Weekly reports are generated to track financial contributions that are made, with a recap being provided in the following week's bulletin (both for the previous week and on a year-to-date basis). Monthly reports are generated and reviewed to track contributions in relation to both budgeted expenses and actual expenses. Systematic reporting helps the church see how it is performing financially.

**Budget Preparation:** The Finance Board supervises the preparation and control of the budget. Considerable time and effort is expended, preparing, and presenting the annual budget.




**TRUNK OR TREAT EVENT:**
