AS WE GATHER


In his letter to the Christians in the city of Philippi, Paul spoke of the exalted Lord Jesus Christ. He wrote that, having completed His saving work, Jesus was to be worshiped by all people. OLD TESTAMENT READING (God promises salvation for His people.)

Isaiah 62:1-7

For Zion's sake I will not keep silent, and for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her righteousness goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a burning torch. The nations shall see your righteousness, and all the kings your glory, and you shall be called by a new name that the mouth of the LORD will give. You shall be a crown of beauty in the hand of the LORD, and a royal diadem in the hand of your God. You shall no more be termed Forsaken, and your land shall no more be termed Desolate, but you shall be called My Delight Is in Her, and your land Married; for the LORD delights in you, and your land shall be married. For as a young man marries a young woman, so shall your sons marry you, and as the bridegroom rejoices over the bride, so shall your God rejoice over you. On your walls, O Jerusalem, I have set watchmen; all the day and all the night they shall never be silent. You who put the LORD in remembrance, take no rest, and give him no rest until he establishes Jerusalem and makes it a praise in the earth. This is the Word of the Lord.

EPISTLE (Faith comes from hearing.)

Romans 10:11-17

For the Scripture says, "Everyone who believes in him will not be put to shame." For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all, bestowing his riches on all who call on him. For "everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." But how are they to call on him in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in him of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone preaching? And how are they to preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who preach the good news!" But they have not all obeyed the gospel. For Isaiah says, "Lord, who has believed what he has heard from us?" So faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ. This is the Word of the Lord.

HOLY GOSPEL (Jesus commissions His disciples as His witnesses.)

Luke 24:44-53

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke, the twenty-fourth chapter.

People: Glory to You, O Lord.

(The Gospel is read.)

Then [Jesus] said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures, and said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ should suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that repentance and forgiveness of sins should be proclaimed in his name to all nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things. And behold, I am sending the promise of my Father upon you. But stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high." Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and lifting up his hands he blessed them. While he blessed them, he parted from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshiped him and returned to Jerusalem with great joy, and were continually in the temple blessing God. This is the Gospel of the Lord.

MISSION SEQUENCE

Pastor: Our mission togethe

Our mission together is vigorously to make known the love of Christ by word and deed. That calling is reflected in the next hymn, "We Are Called to Stand Together," a text written by contemporary British hymnist Martin Leckebusch. The first stanza reminds us that as we carry out our Gospel mission, we are united with Cod's people from conturing age. We sing stanza.

with God's people from centuries ago. We sing stanza 1.

HYMN "We Are Called to Stand Together"

Pastor:

The word "apostle" indicates that an individual has been sent out with a special mission. Among the very first apostles of Christ was the disciple Thomas who, according to long-standing tradition, took the good news of salvation all the way to India. Centuries later, the first Lutheran missionaries to India were Bartholomaeus Ziegenbalg and Heinrich Pluetschau, sent in 1705 by Danish King Frederick IV to Tranquebar on the southeast coast of India. Remembering these pioneers of the faith, we sing stanza 2.

HYMN "We Are Called to Stand Together"

LSB #828 v. 2

Pastor:

The fact that the message of Christ was brought to the ancestors of many members of today's Lutheran churches can be attributed to St. Boniface. Known as the apostle to Germany, Boniface was born in 680 in Devonshire, England. Originally named Wynfrith, he made an initial missionary journey to the northern coast of Germany in the year 716. Three years later, he went to the German heartland territories of Bavaria and Thuringia and created a structure for the establishment of churches in the German lands. He is gratefully remembered as a faithful herald of the Gospel. Together we sing stanza 3.

HYMN "We Are Called to Stand Together"

LSB #828 v. 3

Pastor:

Another missionary to northern lands remembered in the names of many churches, societies, and educational institutions is St. Ansgar. Born in France in 801, Ansgar followed the call to mission northward to Scandinavia in 826. He built the first Christian church in Sweden in 829 and was consecrated archbishop of Hamburg in 831, from which he continued his outreach to the Scandinavian countries. Remembering the missionaries of centuries past such as Ansgar, whose efforts brought entire nations to confess that Jesus is Lord, we sing stanza 4.

HYMN "We Are Called to Stand Together"

LSB #828 v. 4

Pastor:

Many missionaries were active in bringing the gospel to English-speaking lands. St. Augustine (or Austin) of Canterbury led a group of forty monks from Rome across the English Channel to Britain in the year 597. They were well-received by the local pagan King Ethelbert and in time established a church center in the area of Kent. As a missionary bishop in Ireland, St. Patrick brought the Gospel message to the Irish people. Originally from a Roman settlement in England, Patrick devoted much of his life to sharing the Gospel in Ireland throughout the first half of the fifth century. His life of witness was a blessing in his generation and long beyond that time. Remembering our call to stand together with the missionaries of each century, we sing the final stanza.







POST-COMMUNION THANKSGIVING


Pastor:


