**Zion French African Church** began its mission in 2017 at Good Shepherd under the leadership of Pastor Gui. Today, this new mission is already worshipping an average of 65 people each Sunday. We have celebrated several weddings, hold Sunday School and Bible Classes, and the mission has a great choir. Two leaders have identified to attend the Ethnic Immigrant Institute of Theology at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis to become the pastors. Good Shepherd, the North and South Wisconsin Districts, and Benediction in Milwaukee are excited about this mission and are seeking partners to help in training these men for the ministry. We are asking for your prayers and as you are led by the Spirit, to support. The financial costs of the seminary education for these two men., which will be more than \$13,000 a year for a grand total of 52,000 for four years. Our goal is to have the funding in place by March 2021 to ensure that they can begin their training in the fall of 2021. Would you please consider becoming a partner in this mission and ministry? Good News of Great Joy

Well, here we are at the time of the Church year, which is centered on anticipation, Advent. This is the beginning of the Church year and Advent and it is all about anticipation based upon God's declaration, God's promise of a Savior!

This year our theme has been "Jesus our Shepherd" based upon King David's words:

### **Psalm 23 The LORD Is My Shepherd**

The LORD is my shepherd;  
I shall not want.  
He makes me lie down in green pastures.  
He leads me beside still waters.  
He restores my soul.  
He leads me in paths of righteousness for his name's sake.  
Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death,  
I will fear no evil, for you are with me;  
your rod and your staff, they comfort me.  
You prepare a table before me  
in the presence of my enemies;  
you anoint my head with oil;  
my cup overflows.  
Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me  
all the days of my life,  
and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD forever.


We end Advent with Christmas. The realization by faith that the anticipation of a Savior is over and that He has come. The Savior announced by the Angels and worshipped by the shepherds. David writing Psalm 23 has this Good News of great joy in his heart! Notice, that no matter what would happen in His life, the Lord is His Shepherd! This is Good news of great joy indeed!

This, I would argue, means that we, like David, always have good news in our life, no matter what. This is not some self-therapy or self help or glass half full type of mental trick, but rather the truth. Jesus is the Good News which gives great joy! So much joy that when we are reminded of our greatest enemy death which exists because of sin, even this enemy has lost, it is over. Jesus came into this world to save sinners, to be the Shepherd the world needs, and He succeed by His death and resurrection! All who believe in Him have this Good News of great joy that lives today and forever.

## Music News

Thanks be to God for all of his many blessings He gives to us, including the most important gift of all, His son Jesus! In this season of Advent, one thing that we focus on is reconciliation. Reconciliation is the restoration of what has been broken. As sinners, we are broken and in need of a Savior. Throughout these weeks in Advent we sing "The Quemapas Carol." Each stanza of this carol announces our reconciliation to the Father in Christ. In the chorus we sing:

God's own Son is born a child;  
God the Father is reconciled.

This is great news for us who are in need of a Savior. Jesus comes to us in the form of a baby boy. He mends the broken relationship between us and God the Father. As we think about Christ coming, we can examine ourselves, acknowledge our sin with contrition, and trust that our sin is forgiven for the sake of Christ. Because Christ came for you and me, we are forgiven and reconciled to God the Father. Because we have been forgiven, we can forgive each other. Jesus mends our broken relationships. We can be certain of our reconciliation and our salvation. This certainty is not dependent on us and anything we can do. It is certain because it is dependent on Jesus humbling Himself to take on human flesh and being born of a virgin. Jesus lived, died, and rose again for us, and so we eagerly wait for the day when He will come back again.

## Finance Board

As the year comes to a close, we have hope for the future. With the advent of a covid vaccine on the horizon and getting control of the pandemic with it, we look to God now and for the future, both in difficult times and in good times. This year has been challenging for most.

The Board of Finance spends a great deal of time and effort in planning and developing the budget for the coming year at church. It is presented to the Church Council for recommendation to the congregation for voter approval. The whole purpose of creating a budget is to help make it easier for Good Shepherd Lutheran Church to achieve our mission and vision for the future and enabling us to spread the Good News-God's Word.

On November 15th, 2020, the voters assembly approved a budget of \$733,004, which was inclusive of a fourth called staff. The congregation identified a definite need that another pastor was needed for our congregation. Within this budget, \$50,505 was designated for missions. Our mission payments to the District help spread the Word and support the District's needs along with national and worldwide reliefs. Also included in the budget are salaries, insurances, educational materials, publicity, utilities, building and grounds maintenance, leases, office supplies, custodial upkeep and cleaning, mailings, and benevolent endeavors. All areas are included in the budget to maintain the functioning of our church.

We must never lose sight of our church's mission, i.e., *To teach and reach others through God's Word and Love*. Each of us must ask oneself what can I do as my part in this mission. It begins with each person taking responsibility and ownership as a member of Good Shepherd. We all have the ability to share and time to volunteer those gifts and financial resources to share. But it begins with a heartfelt commitment to the Lord. What can or will you do?

### Our December Care Focus

We think of basic human needs as clothing, food and shelter. However, during this time of limited social engagement, we realize that connection and relationships are also necessary in our lives. In December, we are focusing on **connecting**. At Christmas we celebrate the joy that God came to earth to be in relationship with us! Not only to be our Savior, but also that we might know Him better – on a personal level. For most of us this separation from family and friends is only temporary due to the pandemic restrictions. But many live with this unmet need everyday. You probably know of someone who is home bound, or in a care center, or a hospital. Those who are homeless or in prison also deal with loneliness every day.

We connect with each other as part of our church family when we come to worship, attend a Bible Study or a volunteer group. That isn't happening as regularly now and you are probably realizing that you are missing the opportunities to be together, to celebrate together in times of joy and to console each other in times of sadness.

Fortunately we are blessed with organizations in our community who reach out to connect those who need assistance, and maybe just a listening ear. Good Shepherd also has a "Friendship Club" where home bound members are contacted regularly by another congregational member. LEAVEN delivers services and resources to help people improve their lives and realize their potential. COTS helps individuals transition to self-sufficiency and independent living. B.A.B.E.S. focuses on helping young families develop good parenting skills. Pillars provides shelter, support, and solutions to address housing needs in the Fox Cities. Fox Cities Salvation Army has multiple programs connects people with needs with solutions.

Here are some suggestions on how your family can focus on the need for connecting and take action to satisfy this need. First of all, talk about it as a family and give thanks for the people in your lives, especially the one who first told you about God's love for you. Then :

Chose an ornament off the **Giving Tree** in the church hallway and bring the gift back before Dec 13<sup>th</sup>. Most of the above mentioned agencies have requests for their clients included.

**Write a note or give a call** to another Good Shepherd member who you haven't seen in a while – or one you've been wanting to meet.

Take the time to **add a personal note** to your Christmas cards this year.

Have a **Blessing Bag**, provided by LWML, handy to give to someone you don't even know.

**Reach out** to someone you haven't been with in quite a while and reminisce about a memorable event.

Let us (the church office, the board of human care, or your elder) know if your church family can assist you in a time when we all feel a bit isolated.
