

Pastor Seabaugh's Message: "Fearless Love"

Love is love. This is a commonplace saying in our world today. I think for many they hear it and respond okay, that works. But the more I consider these words, I cannot help but say, what does this mean? Is it just being Lutheran or is there something else? Lutherans are "cool" with love. We can quote John: 3:16, and that is the point, isn't it?

Rather than love is love, the saying that should take its place is God is love. The best way to fully understand something or to get it right is to go to where it all begins. So, God is love, but what does this mean? 1 John 4:7-11

Beloved, let us love one another, for love is from God, and whoever loves has been born of God and knows God. Anyone who does not love does not know God, because God is love. In this the love of God was made, manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him. In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

God is love, and we rejoice in His love every day. The fact that we were dead in sin and hopeless and lost, rightly deserving this judgment because of sin, God loved us. God did not turn His back on us and leave us as He could or should. No, God promised and delivered for us the Savior, His Son Jesus. Jesus bore the cross, caring our sins, suffering, and dying that by His sacrifice in innocence, we could receive His innocence. This is what we have now, by faith, for Jesus who died is now risen from the dead giving forgiveness of sins, eternal life, and salvation Romans 5:7–8 For one will scarcely die for a righteous person – though perhaps for a good person one would dare even to die – but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

In this love, God established a place in our heart by faith. In this love we actively, daily conduct God's mission to love others as we have been loved. What does this mean? Love is defined as "do whatever you want, how you want to do it, no string attached." But that is foolishness, since God has shown us His love, He also has given how we can demonstrate that love in a way that is faithful to Him through His Word. Outside of His Word is darkness, is sin, and is death, no love at all.

Fearless love is not love as YOU want, but as God has first loved you! God the Father did not withhold His Son. Jesus did not withhold His life. With the help of the Holy Spirit, we love fearlessly. We love by faith God who has created, redeemed, and sanctified us. We love our neighbor according to God's Word as ourselves.

Love is love, nah, we can do better, God is love!

Hymn Study

"Thy Strong Word" (LSB 578), is the Hymn of the Day for February 5, the Fifth Sunday in the Epiphany season. The hymn was written by Martin Franzmann upon request for the commencement service at Concordia Seminary in St. Louis on October 7, 1954. Originally 4 verses, 2 more verses were written to make it long enough for the processional. From 1955 to 1997 and many times after, it was sung as the processional

hymn for the commencement services at Concordia Seminary.

This hymn fits very well in the Epiphany season, also known as the day and season of light. Light serves as the main image in "Thy Strong Word." The word "light" is seen all throughout the hymn. In the first verse, we sing of light that was called in existence by the creating Word. Verse 2 speaks of Christ, the light of the world who "breathed Thine own life-breathing breath." In verse 3 describes God as "bright." Verse 4 talks of the radiance of the cross, where darkness and death are conquered by the "bright redeeming light" of the Gospel. Verse 6 brings all of these images of light together.

"I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). Jesus is the true light that has conquered the darkness of sin, death, and the devil. Let us live in the light of Christ, praising God for all he has done for us and for giving us "Thy Strong Word."
