November 2023

"On Eagles Wings" Composer Jan Michael Joncas wrote the song after he and a friend, Doug Hall, returned from a meal to learn that Hall's father had died of a heart attack. Father Joncas doesn't recall if he ever met Hall's father, but he remembers wanting somehow to console his friend. In the days preceding Hall's father's wake, Father Joncas returned to his parents' house in Minnesota and composed the song on his guitar, sketching out a melody line and accompanying chords. The now-famous hymn debuted at the wake.

**Handbells:** On Sunday, the handbell choir plays 2 pieces, both arrangements by John Behnke. The first one is “For All the Saints” and the second is “Behold a Host, Arrayed in White”. At the beginning of “Behold a Host”, you will hear a sustained sound from a few ringers called ‘singing bell’.

The singing bell technique is adapted from singing bowls found in Asia (Himalayan Bowls in Tibet, Nepal, and India; rin gongs in Japan), a tradition that dates back to the tenth century or before. Rather than being inverted or rung with a handle, these bowls sit with the bottom resting and the rim facing upward. The outer edge is then rubbed with a stick, with the resulting vibrations creating the unique sound. A similar sound happens when you rub your finger around the rim of a wine glass.

For handbells, this technique is used with a wooden stick or dowel. The sound is produced when you rub the dowel around the outside rim of a handbell in a circular motion.

**Choir:** The choir will sing next on Thursday, November 9. Choir meets on Tuesdays at 6:45 p.m. Please join us on Tuesday nights as we sing praise to the Lord!

# Stewardship

is heart work



Like other areas of discipleship, stewardship is not a destination but a journey.

Every faculty you have, your power of thinking or of moving your limbs from moment to moment, is given to you by God. If you devoted every moment of your whole life exclusively to His service, you could not give Him anything that was not in a sense His own already. – C. S. Lewis, *Mere Christianity*

In a recent blog on stewardship, we asked the question, “What does stewardship look like in our lives today?” Unfortunately, many Christians today only associate the idea of stewardship with sermons they have heard about church budgets and building programs.

Bill Peel over at The High Calling recently wrote an excellent essay entitled Leadership Is Stewardship. His essay can help us build a framework to begin unpacking this biblical idea of stewardship.

Peel suggests that there are four important principles about biblical stewardship we must understand:

1. The principle of ownership. The psalmist begins the 24th psalm with, The earth is the LORD’s, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it.

2. The principle of responsibility. In explaining responsibility, Peel writes,

Although God gives us “all things richly to enjoy,” nothing is ours. Nothing really belongs to us. God owns everything; we’re responsible for how we treat it and what we do with it. While we complain about our rights here on earth, the Bible constantly asks, What about your responsibilities? Owners have rights; stewards have responsibilities.

3. The principle of accountability. A steward is one who manages the possessions of another. We are all stewards of the resources, abilities, and opportunities that God has entrusted to our care, and one day each one of us will be called to give an account for how we have managed what the Master has given us.

4. The principle of reward. In Colossians 3:23-24 Paul writes: Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord Christ you are serving.

The Bible shows us in the parables of the Kingdom that faithful stewards who do the master’s will with the master’s resources can expect to be rewarded incompletely in this life, but fully in the next.

As Christians in the 21st century, we need to embrace this larger biblical view of stewardship, which goes beyond church budgets or building projects, though important; it connects everything we do with what God is doing in the world.

We need to be faithful stewards of all God has given us within the opportunities presented through his providence to glorify him, serve the common good and further his Kingdom.

Please prayerfully consider your commitment to Good Shepherd Lutheran Church and its mission to seek and serve. Consecration Sunday is **November 19<sup>th</sup>**.

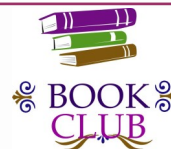

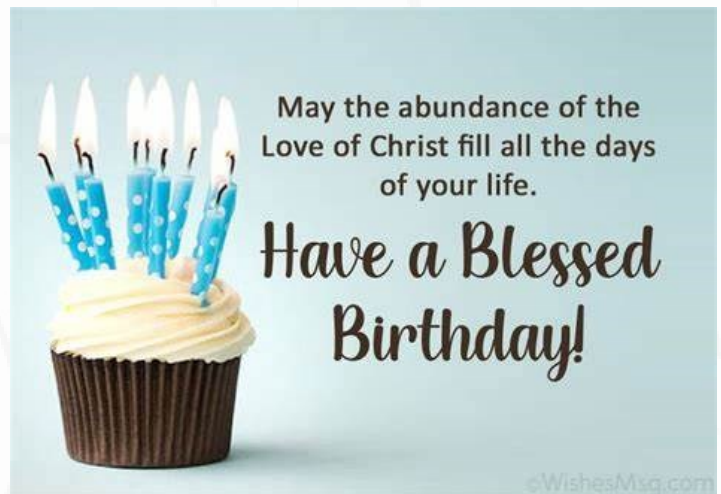
