- ♦ and, provide opportunities for spiritual growth and involvement.



Fearless Savior

December 2023

Isaiah 7:14

Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

Matthew 1:21

She will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

Luke 1:30-31

And the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. And behold, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus.

Prophecy and fulfillment, God promised to save His people, the world, and He delivers. DO NOT BE AFRAID!

Do not be afraid! This is what we are told by others who are confident that we are not in danger. The words spoken by a confident parent during a storm. A tour guide driving up a steep mountain. A teacher before you give a report in front of the class. You can trust them, they say, they love you, they have experience, they will protect you and keep you safe.

Jesus is born is the Gospel of Christmas. In the Gospel of Jesus we hear, DO NOT BE AFRAID. God is confident in His Word and confident in His promise. God knows our need, He knows our sin, and He knows its judgement.

We are afraid, as we are confronted by our sin laid out in the law. We are afraid knowing that if sin remains, eternal death awaits. We are afraid knowing that we can not remove sin and its judgement, death.

God proclaims, DO NOT BE AFRAID, for unto born this day in the city of David is the Savior who is Christ the Lord! Jesus is born taking on flesh and blood, like you and me only without sin. Jesus comes into this sin wrecked world FEARLESS. He knows the enemies; He knows what He must do. Jesus knows the cost and He is willing to pay it, as only He can do.

Jesus is FEARLESS. Jesus enters Jerusalem where sinful men deride and torture Him. Jesus enters Jerusalem without an escape plan. Jesus enters to bear our sin and pay the price that our sins deserved. Jesus enters to suffer, shed His blood, and die. Jesus is laid in tomb.

Jesus is VICTORIOUS. Three days after His death, the women went to the tomb and were greeted:

Matthew 28:5-6, "But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you seek Jesus who was crucified. He is not here, for he has risen, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION







This month's focus for Christian Education is Sunday school because we've got an amazing group of young people at Good Shepherd. They are active in worship, music, and learning together. They worship together each week in opening chapel. I'm so impressed with how much of the opening chapel service liturgy that even the youngest kids can lead without any help! When the high school kids who are teachers/helpers were delayed getting into the sanctuary one week, the younger students noticed and asked where they were. I love that they notice and they care! When we sing songs together in worship, the older kids are willing to lead actions and actively participate. Do you know how rare that is? What a blessing to have kids who model and genuinely enjoy themselves. When we separate into groups after opening chapel, the 4th, 5th, and 6th graders have music time with Jacob. He does such a great job of teaching music skills to them with both singing and bell ringing. One of the best ways to keep people in church throughout their lives in to get them involved in some sort of choir – and Jacob is outstanding at laying the groundwork for them. After that group finishes their music time, the 7th through 12th graders have a chance to work on bell music as well. In the time when kids aren't playing music, they have terrific teachers who lead the lessons and build on the Bible story that we introduced in chapel, have time to journal/discuss their faith (youth group), and give them time to do art projects or play in the gym. I know that as a church we all appreciate and love teachers – and this year's group is worthy of our thanks for the time and care that they show the kids. Finally, may I brag about our high school kids? Some participate in the Sunday school lessons of journaling/discussion and music with Jacob. Some of them participate by volunteering as teachers or helpers in the classrooms. All of them are so kind to the younger kids, so enthusiastic about Sunday school in general, and such incredible role models to those around them. I know that many of you remember the days of a crowded basement full of kids and we praise God for those times. However, relationships are the key to happy, active kids who stay connected to their faith for a lifetime. Sometimes we build deeper relationships with smaller groups of people. God has blessed us with a family atmosphere and a multi-aged group of kids who are growing in their faith together! I know that as the younger kids grow up, I pray that they will continue to participate in our Sunday school programs and serve the church in choirs, as acolytes, helping with screens, or any other ways that they see the older kids serving today.

The Measure of Our Generosity

If you open up the Small Catechism, you'll find a shortened version of the Third Commandment: "Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy." But if you look up the list of the Ten Commandments in Exodus, you'll find the full version:

Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. (Ex. 20:8–11)

Why did Luther shorten this commandment for the Small Catechism? Was it so that the kids wouldn't have so much to memorize? No, it was because Luther knew that all the details of the Third Commandment were part of the "shadow" of the Old Testament (Col. 2:16). Or as St. Paul puts it, there is "letter" in the Old Testament law and "spirit" (2 Cor. 3:6). The details of not working on Saturday were fulfilled by Christ. That part of the Sabbath regula-

tion no longer applies. But the spirit of the law does remain: We need to dedicate sufficient time each week to hearing God's Word and giving it honor and respect. Or as Luther sums it up in the Small Catechism's explanation to the Third Commandment: "We should fear and love God so that we do not despise preaching and His Word but hold it sacred and gladly hear and learn it."

The same sort of analysis applies to our giving. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Israelites to give a tenth of their income to the Levites so that those men could dedicate their lives to serving in God's house, teaching the people, conducting worship, etc. In the New Testament, there is a rigid requirement listed about handing in your tax forms to church to make sure you've given enough. But the mandate to have a full-time ministry, which is the spirit of that law concerning tithing to the Levites, is right there in 1 Corinthians 9:14: "The Lord has ordained that those who preach the Gospel should make their living from the Gospel."

The New Testament church's job is significantly larger than the job of Old Testament Israel. We are commanded to preach the Gospel to all nations. There was only the temple to maintain in the Old Testament, but we have churches, schools, universities, and seminaries, plus missionaries everywhere. So you tell me: Can we really undertake the work of the ministry if our giving doesn't even measure up to Old Testament levels of generosity?
