Lent Theme: 2024-Honest Repentance

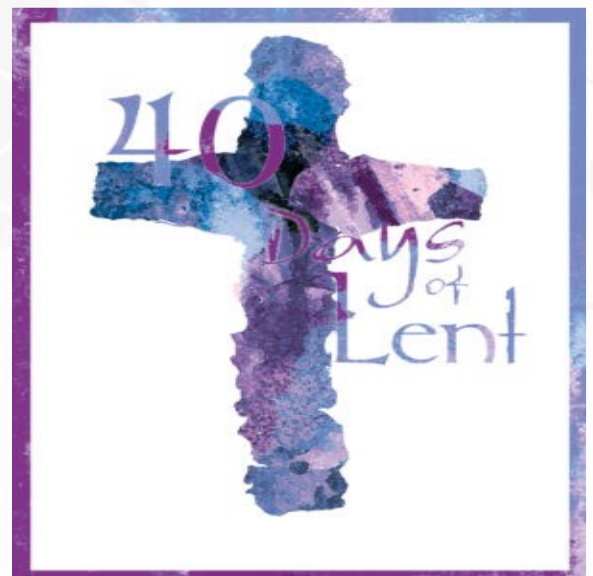
HONEST REPENTANCE (Midweek Lent Series)

Repentance starts with being honest before God and ourselves about who we are. When it comes to sin, everyone has a natural impulse to hide, but repentance means finding the courage to be honest. It also means having faith in the promise of forgiveness. But being honest about faith means recognizing that faith is contested on many sides not only by society, but by our own experiences, and sometimes even by the actions of God himself.

Finally, repentance means becoming more human, not less. Because our thoughts, desires, and actions are so linked with sin, it is easy to view repentance as fighting against our humanity as if holiness meant trying to stifle as many of our natural human impulses as possible. But honest repentance recognizes that sin is the thing that stifles our humanity, while repentance results in our natural impulses functioning more as God designed them.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

God has certainly blessed us richly in our Lutheran education ministry here! The Preschool through 8th graders led the advent worship on December 20th as their Christmas program. They sang hymns, led the liturgy, read the Old Testament and Epistle readings, and even played handbells with the high school students. We're so grateful to all our Sunday school teachers, Bible study leaders, and all of you who participate in the various opportunities that we offer here.

Looking ahead to 2024. Baptism is an important part of our faith Stepping stones here at Good Shepherd. Everyone who was baptized here in 2023 will have a small reception during fellowship hour in the community

room. Sunday School is about to become even more music-filled! I became familiar with Tonal Bells (painted metal beginner bells) when Lizzie was in 4K and I have had the chance to lead several groups of younger children in learning hymns on these bells. The board of family education has purchased an extended set – plus tonal chimes!! – for our younger students to begin learning to play bells and chimes. We will add this music time to their weekly Sunday school class. In January we begin studying the life of Jesus (to match Gospel lessons in church) and will end the month by celebrating Lutheran Education Week on January 28. Watch for more details about the celebration!

Confirmation resumes and it's hard to believe that Palm Sunday is less than three months away for our 8th grade confirmands! 7th and 8th graders continue to study the catechism, do memory work, take worship notes, and serve in worship through acolyting, taking the offering, running the PowerPoint, etc. We're so grateful for all who help, especially those who did extra work during Advent and Christmas services!

Youth group is preparing for National Youth Gathering in July 2025. The always-anticipated annual Spaghetti dinner will be held on February 4, 2024. We have sign-up forms for donations available in the hallway now. Thank you in advance for your generous support! We will begin a couple of new Bible studies on Sundays; Youth (and parents) can sign up for whichever topic and times work best for you. First and Third Sundays at 11:45 a.m. at Panera on KK – we will study the hidden Gospel messages in cultural topics such as the music of Taylor Swift, the Netflix show "Stranger Things", the popular movie franchise "Star Wars", and many more topics. The Second and Fourth Sundays of the month we will meet at church at 6:00 p.m. to discuss Mental and Emotional well-being as Christians. We will use the devotional book "Living Life, Living Faith" by father-son duo, Ed and Aaron Grube. Sign up information will be available on the bulletin boards in the hallway outside the Youth room. We will continue our well attended Wednesday night youth group from 6:00 - 8:00 p.m. now that we've celebrated Advent and Christmas. Pizza and soda is available for purchase – encourage your youth to attend and bring a friend!



My responsibilities here are more than just children or youth ministry. I am here to help with lifelong Christian education. Women of Good Shepherd, we have the opportunity to participate in the Women Rejoice annual women's conference in Elkhart Lake again this year. This is an opportunity for us to bring daughters, nieces, granddaughters, and friends to gather around God's Word and to fellowship with each other as we grow in our faith. Your Past Does Not Define Your Future LCMS Stewardship Ministry: lcms.org/stewardship

New Year's is a celebration of the past and the future. We take stock of the past with thanksgiving and sometimes even relief (that it's over), and we look to the future in hope and anticipation, and perhaps with some worry, for what it holds.

The point is that New Year's celebrations remind us of who we are as opposed to who we would like to be, what we have done in comparison to what we want to do. It reminds us of our accomplishments, but mostly it reminds us of our failures. What we've lost. Who we've lost.

St. Paul writes: "The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work.

St. Paul tells us that the Lord will both supply and increase what we need to give to the church for its work in the world. He tells us that this work God does in us will enrich and bless us in every way, and through this, will produce thanksgiving to God. With this in mind, here is some practical advice to help you take stock of your giving in years past and change what needs to be adjusted, improved, or done away with altogether.

First, attend the Divine Service to receive God's gifts of forgiveness, life and salvation. He wants you — all of you (Matt. 22:20–22).

Second, pray for the Lord's help. Go to the throne of grace and ask for strength and wisdom to follow His bidding faithfully (John 15:1–16).

Third, consider what the church is and what the church does. The church is a place of mercy. It inhales the mercy of the Father by the death, resurrection and ascension of His Son through the preaching of the Gospel and the Sacraments. It exhales this mercy in love toward neighbors. You are a member of the church, of God's family. Thus, you are not only a recipient of God's mercy, but a bearer of that mercy for the life of the world. You spread that mercy through the generous giving of your income to support the work of the church in the world, as the Israelites did in the Old Testament (Lev. 27:1–34).

So, don't let your past define your future. Rather, commit for the year a generous proportion of your income, which is God's gift to you for this body and life.
