Rejoice in Repentance

March 2024

This is impossible, isn't it? Rejoice or Joy in repentance? Repentance means that we have sinned. We have transgressed the Law of God in our thoughts, words, and deeds. Repentance requires honesty about this reality. Honest repentance is necessary and helpful, honest repentance is difficult and a struggle. Who me?

Yes, you! This is what Nathan the prophet said to David after he sinned by having Bathsheba as his wife and not repenting. Coveting, murder, and sexual immorality were the sins most notable. God sent Nathan to convict David the King who did not care about his sins. God knew and David needed to repent, he did. Joy in repentance? Did David feel this way? Maybe not at first, but what good would it be to deny or reject the truth? So, he repented, and his repentance is recorded in Psalm 51.

Psalm 51:1-10

Create in Me a Clean Heart, O God

Have mercy on me, O God,
according to your steadfast love;
according to your abundant mercy
blot out my transgressions.
Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity,
and cleanse me from my sin!
For I know my transgressions,
and my sin is ever before me.
Against you, you only, have I sinned
and done what is evil in your sight,
so that you may be justified in your words
and blameless in your judgment.
Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity,
and in sin did my mother conceive me.
Behold, you delight in truth in the inward being,
and you teach me wisdom in the secret heart.
Purge me with hyssop, and I shall be clean;
wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.
Let me hear joy and gladness;
let the bones that you have broken rejoice.
Hide your face from my sins,
and blot out all my iniquities.
Create in me a clean heart, O God,
and renew a right spirit within me.

Repentance is not necessarily easy, but it is always necessary. Thankfully, mercifully, God does not treat us as our sins deserve because He forgives. This is why Jesus came into to this world. Jesus bore our sins on the cross, suffered, died, and rose from the dead. In Him, in Jesus, by grace through faith, God creates a new heart, washes us clean from all our sins. When we repent, we receive comfort and joy in Jesus' words in Luke 15. Luke 15:7

Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance. Heaven rejoices, you and I rejoice in our merciful and forgiving God. Joyful repentance is God's gift to the world in Jesus and His forgiveness!

Lent Theme: 2024-Honest Repentance

HONEST REPENTANCE (Midweek Lent Series)

Repentance starts with being honest before God and ourselves about who we are. When it comes to sin, everyone has a natural impulse to hide, but repentance means finding the courage to be honest. It also means having faith in the promise of forgiveness. But being honest about faith means recognizing that faith is contested on many sides not only by society, but by our own experiences, and sometimes even by the actions of God himself.

Finally, repentance means becoming more human, not less. Because our thoughts, desires, and actions are so linked with sin, it is easy to view repentance as fighting against our humanity as if holiness meant trying to stifle as many of our natural human impulses as possible. But honest repentance recognizes that sin is the thing that stifles our humanity, while repentance results in our natural impulses functioning more as God designed them.

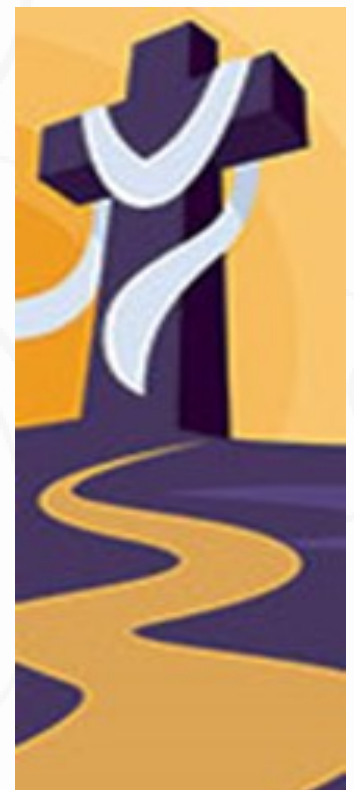

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

This month's focus for Christian education is Small Groups. Do you know what a small group is? Have you ever participated in a Small group Bible study? Was it at church or in a home?

Small group ministry happens in many different ways but it is a few people who gather together for Bible study and fellowship.

Why Small Groups? By gathering in a small group, you get to know others well and form deep friendships. It builds up the church by creating a "family" of people that we aren't directly related to. In a small group, people can have discussions where everyone participates.

Who can join a Small Group? Anyone! The value of small groups is that they can form around an interest (mission, evangelism, music, etc), an age grouping (Young Adults, parents, empty-nesters, retired, etc), or a few people who want to invite some new members so they can get to know others better. We also encourage participants to invite new people each week and "grow" their small groups. When a group becomes "large" its members have the option of splitting into new smaller groups.

Where do Small Groups meet? Anywhere! We have rooms available at church for small groups to meet in the evenings or on the weekends. Some small groups meet at a leader's home. Some small groups meet at a different member's home each time. It is entirely up to the group to decide what works best for them. I've been in different small groups and each one was hosted in a different way: church, homes, and even a coffee shop. It's flexible for the group's needs.

When do Small Groups meet? That is determined by the leader and the rest of the group. The day, the time, and even the frequency of how often you meet is all flexible depending on the needs of your group.

Who can lead a Small Group? Anyone who is interested can talk to me about a Small Group! If you have never led a Bible study before, I have a lot of resources to help you. If you'd like to start a Small Group, I am happy to order materials for you.

Are you interested in getting to know others better and digging deeper into God's Word? Talk to me and let's get something started!

Cherish What God Has Given

In the Small Catechism, Luther follows a pattern when explaining the Ten Commandments. With each commandment, there is something prohibited, and something commanded. There is something wrong which must be avoided, and there is something right which must be done.

The one time this pattern is not followed is with the Sixth Commandment.

“You shall not commit adultery. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we lead a sexually pure and decent life in what we say and do, and husband and wife love and honor each other” (SC I).

Here, the catechism focuses solely on the positive: we should live in a chaste and decent manner in both word and deed, and husbands and wives should cherish and honor one another.

This is the key stewardship insight that runs through all of the Christian life: Everything that we have has been given to us by God. We deserve none of it. All of it comes to us by God’s fatherly kindness and open-handed generosity. If I know that everything I have — every possession, every relationship, every ability — is a gift from God, then my perspective changes. All of these things are both gifts to be cherished, and things that I should direct towards God’s purposes. My possessions should be shared generously according to how God has called me in my family, church and community. My spouse should be cherished, loved and encouraged in faith. My children are on loan from my own Heavenly Father, and I have but a brief time to show them the path of righteousness. My neighbor is a gift from God so that I can imitate His kindness toward me.

No matter the gift, everything has been given to me by God so that I may participate in His own goodness and open-handed generosity.
