Be Strong and Courageous—"Well Fed"

August 2025

We all understand the vital role food plays in our lives. Just as nutritious meals help our bodies function and thrive, God provides nourishment for both our physical well-being and, even more importantly, for our souls. Just as we do not worry about what to eat for our bodies, God promises to feed our souls with His perfect forgiveness.

Our sin-sick souls desperately need this forgiveness. The Lord's Supper removes the sickness, allowing us to live in peace and righteousness before our Lord and Savior Jesus, who died and rose to secure this very forgiveness for us. And before His sacrifice, Jesus instituted this sacred meal for His Church—a meal that makes our souls whole and healthy. Mark 14:22-26 states: "And as they were eating, he took bread, and after blessing it broke it and gave it to them, and said, 'Take; this is my body.' And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he gave it to them, and they all drank of it. And he said to them, 'This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many. Truly, I say to you, I will not drink again of the fruit of the vine until that day when I drink it new in the kingdom of God.'" At Good Shepherd, we receive this life-giving food—Christ's body and blood—weekly, except for eight designated worship services throughout the year. Christ truly feeds us, ensuring we are forgiven and empowered to share the Gospel with others.

As we receive this meal, our dedicated Altar Guild prepares the elements for worship. The wine, bread, and all the Holy Communion Vessels include:

- **Chalice:** The single cup our Lord blessed and from which all drank when He instituted the Sacrament of the Altar. It is also called the cup of blessing, the cup of the Lord, the common cup, and the Communion cup.
- **Paten:** The plate for the bread, designed to fit with the chalice and large enough for distribution. It symbolizes the "one bread" broken into pieces, often called wafers or hosts.
- **Ciborium or Pyx:** Containers for additional wafers. The ciborium is shaped like a covered chalice, while the pyx is a round covered box, also known as a host box. Sometimes the ciborium is used for distribution in place of the paten, though the paten is still used for consecration.
- **Flagon:** A container for additional wine. Large cruets are sometimes used in its place.
- **Communion Cups:** Small, individual cups, often glass or plastic, used to hold the consecrated wine.

We are blessed to have recently updated our Holy Communion vessels. We have added a new Flagon, Paten, and Chalice, wonderful replacements for vessels that have served faithfully. On July 13th, these elements were blessed at Worship for the highest good of our souls.

However, while these vessels are important, what is most crucial is that the institution of the Lord's Supper is conducted precisely as Christ has given it to the Church: with the Words of Institution according to God's Word and at His command. We believe that we truly receive Christ's body with, in, and under the bread, and Christ's blood with, in, and under the wine for our complete forgiveness. Strength and courage are the direct results of receiving the Lord's Supper. We go forth in the assurance of our forgiveness and the courage to stand before the judgment seat of Jesus, knowing we are worthy of eternal life through Him. As you come to receive the Lord's Supper, take a moment to notice the vessels used, and more importantly, remember that Christ Himself is truly present there for you! May God continue to bless you richly.

Convention Highlights and upcoming events.

The North Wisconsin District was represented by over one hundred attendees from the eighteen zones. A bus starting in Green Bay had forty-five women and one pastor load up on Wednesday morning enroute to Omaha, NE for the Convention. With stops in Wausau and Chippewa Falls, the Lamers bus traveled to lunch in Lakeville MN then onto



Omaha. The group on the bus stayed in Carter Lake IA, a geographic oddity just outside of Omaha.

Thursday was a day of sightseeing and servant events. Many went on tours of chocolate makers, lavender farms, or historical Omaha while others worked forming Braille pages, onesies, and VBS bracelets at the CHI convention center. Choir practice took place right before the Delegate orientation. After orientation, caucuses began for Districts to meet as one body before the events of Convention. At the NWD caucus, President Joan provided important information, and the meeting was topped off with a signing of the paperwork for the brand new LWML NWD Endowment Fund. The evening meeting was the opening of the convention and a worship service with Holy Communion for over three thousand participants!

Friday morning started with a banner processional. President Joan walked in with the banner made by our own Carolyn Berg! Each banner expounded on the theme of the convention, "Growing in God's Grace." Delegates were then asked to vote on bylaw changes and the Mission Goal. Keynote speaker - Reverend Kris Whitby gave a memorable address on how God has put His name on us at baptism. Friday's evening festivities included a vendor show where attendees could sign up for prizes and sing karaoke. Evening Bible studies were offered by Donna Snow and Deb Burma. They were so well attended (Standing room only) expect more in Oklahoma City (2027 Convention site).

Saturday started with a flag processional of the eighty-seven nations that LWML has supported ministries in with their grants over the 82 years. Mission Grant voting results were announced. In the afternoon, delegates voted for officers. A motion was made from the floor of convention to fully fund our partially funded Mission grant. The results were almost unanimous and the new mission goal of \$2,622,270.00 was adopted. Singer Comedian Jennie Williamson topped the evening off as the Saturday entertainment.

Sunday's events were bittersweet as many had to say good-bye. Officers were sworn in - including Anne Hartman as Vice President of Gospel Outreach. A sending service was filled with songs and a message from Reverend Burma.

So much jam packed into 4 days, there is no room to list them all. Bible study, Mission in Action speakers, Introduction of committees, messages from LWML Canada and Australia and a visit by LCMS President Rev Matthew Harrison. Jesus' transforming presence

"But Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, 'Look, Lord! Here and now I give half of my possessions to the poor, and if I have cheated anybody out of anything, I will pay back four times the amount.' Jesus said to him, 'Today salvation has come to this house, because this man, too, is a son of Abraham. For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:8-10 NIV).

Who knew, all those kids sitting in Sunday school were getting a lesson in stewardship! Generations of children have very often heard lessons based on the familiar account of Zacchaeus. The diminutive tax collector's curiosity surrounding the person and ministry of Jesus is what the Holy Spirit used to set him on a collision course for a total stewardship transformation. This transformation, according to the text of Luke 19, is not just about this life. This stewardship transformation is about eternity as well!

Remember the story: Zacchaeus was a tax collector. Do not think of friendly neighborhood IRS agents. This was more like a toll booth operator, but the governing authorities did not set the toll. They would contract men to staff roadside booths and tax the commerce that was passing along the road. This was an enterprise full of greed and graft. The tax collectors would take as much as they could and only pass on a portion to the government. The rest did not go into the community chest either! It went into the pocket of the tax collector.

This is why the people had such disdain for *Jewish* tax collectors. They were seen as both crooks and traitors. They were crooks in that they extorted their compatriots and others in the toll process. But worse, they were seen as traitors because their efforts supported the occupying Roman authorities. That is the real reason that the people would not make way so that short Zacchaeus could see Jesus.

For this reason, he runs ahead and climbs a tree. He had heard all the stories. He wanted to see this Jesus with his own eyes. Mercy is on display. This hated crook and traitor gets a direct audience with Jesus — at Jesus' own request! Jesus invites Himself to Zacchaeus' house. This is where the transformation is about to take place!

Notice how Jesus does it. He does not preach a three-week sermon series, nor does He ask Zacchaeus to make a pledge. There is nothing programmatic about Jesus' approach. But Zacchaeus is completely transformed! The transforming force is the very presence of Jesus!

Direct time with Jesus takes a crooked, selfish, criminal and makes him the most faithful steward.

This new life of stewardship is marked by the promises made. First, he gives half of his ill-gotten gains to the poor. These are people whom he would not have defrauded at all! Yet, after spending time with Jesus, they are His first concern. Only after this does he double the requirement of the Levitical law on fraud. And what does Jesus say is the result? Salvation!

Doing the acts of stewardship does not save. Rather, the faith in Jesus that is created by the Holy Spirit is what saves! This is critical for us to confess. Failed stewardship can and will cut you off from God. The only antidote for failed stewardship is the presence of Jesus.

We do not need to run ahead and climb a tree for this presence of Jesus. He makes Himself available to us every week in the Divine Service. He speaks His Word of invitation to us in the pages of Holy Scripture. This, and this alone, transforms us from sinner to saint, from owner to steward of all that belongs to the Lord.

Do you want to become a more faithful steward? Spend more time with Jesus. Make the Divine Service a weekly priority. Feast on Christ's body and blood weekly! This is the great gift that brings salvation from God's House to yours!


