- Roughly 280 million members worldwide
- Comes out of the Methodist holiness movement
- Charles Parham and William Seymour are key founders
- Major historical, founding event: Azuza Street Revival
- Church of God, Assemblies of God, and the International Church of the Foursquare Gospel (etc.)
- First Assembly of God, Lee's Summit, with thanks to Pastor Roger Horne
- 39 across Kansas City (6 Assemblies of God)

Material Principle

 - Baptism of the Holy Spirit accompanied by the necessary sign of speaking in tongues
 - Restoring the four blessings of the full Gospel:

 - Christ as Coming King

- Not based on you or your works, but on God and what He has done for you.

- Point to Romans 8
- His Spirit bears witness with ours that we are children of God
- Put on the new man
- Work out your own salvation
- Marriage contract illustration
- Deciding to operate with the fruits of the Spirit
- Personal determination

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Miscellaneous

- That was 1st Wave, a.k.a. Old Pentecostals (12% of Pentecostals)
- Neo-Pentecostalism 2nd Wave (33%) and 3rd Wave (55%) have great diversity, but are very charismatic movements
- 2nd Wave aka the Charismatic movement, saw Pentecostal teaching and practice enter into other denominations. A notable tradition is the "Word of Faith" (name-it-claim-it) movement.

Miscellaneous

- 3rd Wave Signs and Wonders movement, teaches power evangelism, that the preaching of the gospel must by necessity be accompanied by signs and wonders for a person to respond in faith. Hence, the focus on miracles, healing, speaking in tongues.
- The 7-Second Prayer (decision)
 - Lord Jesus, forgive me of my sins, come into my hear, and give me new life. In Jesus' name, Amen.
