- The West (Rome) split off in 1054.

 Otherwise, fallible.

Formal Principle cont.

• "God is the only source of infallibility, and since God the Holy Spirit inspired the Bible, it only makes sense that God the Holy Spirit may infallibly interpret it. Jesus Christ promised to the Church's first Bishops, the Apostles, that the Holy Spirit would guide them (i.e. the Bishops) into all truth (John 16:13); therefore, the Orthodox Church continues to interpret the Holy Bible that it compiled and canonized according to past 2,000 years of oral, liturgical, ecumenical, and experiential God-inspired interpretation; and also in regards to the patristic teachings of the Holy

 - Absolution

- Generally considers everything in and of the church to be a mystery or a sacrament
 - Baptism
 - Chrismation
 - Lord's Supper
 - Confession/Reconciliation
 - Ordination
 - Matrimony
 - Holy Unction
- Sacramentals

Assurance

LCMS

- Points you to the means of grace:
 - Baptism
 - Lord's Supper
 - Absolution
- Not based on you or your works, but on God and what He has done for you.

- We are never assured of our standing with God.
- An Orthodox Christian answers the question, "are you saved?" by saying, "I was saved, I am being saved and (God willing) I will be saved"
- Doing our best to practice our faith in our lives, live in communion with God, and accept His love for us, could be considered an assurance.

Church and Ministry LCMS Eastern Orthodox

- Church as the Body of Christ
 Kingdom of Christ is the
- Visible and invisible church
- Marks of the Church Preaching and the sacraments
- One divinely instituted office – the Preaching Office or the Office of the Keys
- Auxiliary offices are rooted in the Office

- Kingdom of Christ is the visible church founded by Christ
- A visible organization of bishops: Bishops, Deacons, Presbyters.
 - **Apostolic Succession**
 - All other Christians are outside of the Church, though the Spirit may still work in other denominations
