Qualifications

- Member of Grace Lutheran Church or another WELS congregation
- Patience and love for people with all levels of ability
- The ability to attend Jesus Cares events
- Good organization and communication skills

Responsibilities:

- 1. Make final decisions such as cancellations for bad weather.
- 3. Help schedule Jesus Cares special events (ie. ice cream social).
- 4. Schedule, organize, and attend JCM Team meetings.
- 5. Attend and help where needed at JCM events (currently once a month).
- 6. Contact each JCM team member each May to ask if they would like to continue to serve on the JCM Team.

Time Commitment:

- 1-2 hours per month for monthly event during the months of September through May.
- 2 hours per team meeting, scheduled every couple of months as needed, plus time to create meeting agendas.
- 2-year commitment. He/she may then either choose to continue to serve for a year at a time after that, or step down from the position at that time.

Relationships: The JCM Coordinator works with the Pastor, JCM partners and other JCM leaders, Worship Elder, and the members and visitors we serve in connection with this ministry.

Training: Training will be provided by the outgoing JCM Coordinator.
