#### **ACKNOWLEDGMENTS**

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Advent is a time of preparation for celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. Many people use Advent to stay focused on the true meaning of Christmas before the holiday rush takes over. The advent wreath symbolizes newness, eternal life, and the death and resurrection of the promised Messiah.

The wreath has 5 candles: 3 blue or purple, 1 pink, and 1 white. Here's a quick rundown of what each candle represents:

- The first blue candle is the HOPE candle, reminding us of the anticipation for Christ's coming.
- The second blue candle is the FAITH candle, symbolizing Mary and Joseph's journey to Bethlehem.
- The pink joy candle represents the world's JOY at Jesus' birth.
- The final blue PEACE candle reminds us of the angels' message of peace on earth.
- The CHRIST candle, placed in the center, symbolizes purity, holiness, and victory in Jesus.
