AS WE GATHER

Although we are ending Advent, when today's Psalm orders, "Be lifted up, O ancient doors, that the King of glory may come in," we might think of Palm Sunday. But when it says only those with "clean hands and a pure heart" can follow, perhaps it is singing of our Lord's ascension back up through heaven's gates. How can we possibly follow Him there? We can't as we are, without clean hands and pure hearts. But today's Gospel quotes the prophecy that "they shall call His name Immanuel (which means, God with us)." Because of God's gracious presence now and our Savior's sacrifice for us already accomplished, Paul can write that the believers in Rome (and Christians everywhere) "are loved by God and called to be saints." Jesus' birth marks the day when He set in motion the cleansing we all need, of our hands, our hearts, and our minds. Lift up your heads, O gates. We are following our King!
