**REJOICE EXCEEDINGLY!** This is the Christmas season, and a small but important part of Jesus' birth is the visit of the wise men. Their visit is recorded in the second chapter of Matthew's Gospel. Following the star, inquiring at the king's palace, informed by the priests where to find the Child, they trudged with determination to Bethlehem, bringing with them the gifts they planned to present as they worshiped Him. Contrary to the messages we hear in the commercials and even the seasonal songs, the entire focus for Christmas should be the birth of Jesus, the Savior of the world.

Along with doing all the wonderful things that are good to do at this time of the year, including visiting the sick and the shut-in, baking goodies for food banks, sharing financial resources with those in need, and all the shopping and caroling and everything else, let's find our joy in seeing the star. That star points us to Jesus and leads us to the Cross. May God grant us the same determination and faith that the wise men had when they traveled to honor Jesus. Let us open our treasures and worship Him with our best and most precious gifts as the Wise Men did.

As the Star of Bethlehem guided the wise men, may the light that is the Light of the world guide our thoughts, words, and actions now and in the New Year.






