- **A** The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law.

- A That victory remains ours by a God-given faith and hope. That hope is kept alive as we daily repent of our sins and remain in the promises of God. For, if we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us.
- But if we confess our sins, God, who is faithful and just, will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Silence for reflection on God's Word and for self-examination.

Receive His assurance of pardon this day as we celebrate Jesus' victory over sin, death and the grave.
