Signs of Spring?

After enduring several months of wintry weather, I would imagine that many of us are looking for signs of spring. Already I have heard reports of robin sightings and the earliest glimmers of frost relief. The thermometer is more regularly topping out above freezing and the days are getting noticeably longer. Spring is coming.

I got to thinking about this not only because I am ready for springtime to get here, but because of the season of Lent. The word "lent" as it refers to this season of the church year is derived from the Anglo-Saxon words *lencten*, meaning "spring."

Spring brings with it transformation, renewal and new life. The same is to be true for our observance of the season of Lent. The forty days leading to Easter have for centuries been marked as a time for God to be at work in us even as He is at work in the world around us.

Practically how will that happen? Just like certain rituals that go along with spring like cleaning the yard and preparing the field or garden, there are some traditional spiritual disciplines of Lent. Among these disciplines are fasting, prayer, and giving. Certainly, Jesus warns us about the potential to misuse these activities in the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 6. He said, "*Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven*" (Mt. 6:1). But Jesus also assumes that these are the things which believers in God will be engaged in. So He goes on to say, "*when you give to the needy, ... when you pray, ... and when you fast*" (Mt. 6:2, 5, 16). His point was to avoid the misuse but not the activity itself.

In spring we look for the ground which has been frozen solid to thaw. Lent is a season for thawing of hearts which have been hardened by sin. That was part of the reason for fasting. The benefit of the spiritual discipline of fasting was not in the outward act. In Isaiah 58 we read about people who were going through the formalities of fasting but their hearts were still turned away from God and others. In response God says, *“Is not this the fast that I choose: to loose the bonds of wickedness, to undo the straps of the yoke, to let the oppressed go free, and to break every yoke? Is it not to share your bread with the hungry and bring the homeless poor into your house; when you see the naked, to cover him, and not to hide yourself from your own flesh?”* (Is. 58:6-7). This optional discipline was to help us have greater empathy for those for whom the fast was not optional because they were poor or oppressed.

Spring is a time for growth. So for us the season of Lent is a time to grow. The Bible speaks of growing in grace and in the knowledge of the Lord (2 Pet.3:18). It reminds us grow up into salvation (1 Pet 2:2). We are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ (Eph 4:15). The means through which that growth occurs is through the pure spiritual milk God provides in His Word. We grow as we speak the truth in love and by giving room for God’s truth to be spoken to our own hearts.

Therefore, like spring is a time for planting seeds, Lent is a time for the Word of God to be placed into our hearts. In spring we rejoice in the lengthening days, so for us Lent is a time to spend more time basking in the light of Christ through reading, studying and meditating upon his Word. During this season you are particularly encouraged to join us for our midweek worship opportunities where we spend extra time considering the story of Jesus’ journey to the cross and ultimately to the empty tomb.

May God be at work in us all to bring about the Lenten transformation He desires.

Side dish food items such as salads and desserts will be requested from congregation members. We would also like to thank and recognize Pastor Lilienkamp during the luncheon for the additional service he has provided during the absence of an Associate Pastor.

The current computer for the Associate Pastor is in need of an upgrade. A laptop would be a more suitable solution as Pastor Erik will be spending time between the church and Cup of Grace. It was moved by Chad and seconded by Dwight that up to \$750.00 be allocated for the purchase of a new laptop from the new equipment portion of the budget. Motion carried.

A bid in the amount of \$5,120 for Pastor Erik's moving expenses from Bekin's Van line was received. This amount is consistent with amount budgeted for this purpose in the 2020 budget. It was moved by Justin and seconded by Deb to accept the bid to cover Pastor Erik's moving expenses. Motion carried.

Currently the preschool has several keys to open different doors of the building. To make entering the preschool more efficient Pastor Buchhorn has suggested having a locksmith come to place the same key lock for all doors. Brian Frevert will look for locksmiths in the area.

A Circuit Bible Institute for the Wayne Circuit is planned for February 16 from 2:00-5:00 p.m. at St. John's in Wakefield, NE. The topic for the forum is "Who Do You Say That I Am?"

Plans will continue to progress on reviewing insurance bids on the church property and liability insurance. Jerry, Justin and Pastor Buchhorn will act as an insurance subcommittee to review the bids and bring information back to the Mission Council for further action.

New Business:

A gift was given from the Don Baker estate to be used for mission purposes. Since the Endowment Fund of the congregation exists to receive gifts for the same purpose, it was moved by Chad, and

He grew up in Hamilton, Texas with close family influences including his great grandmother, grandparents, aunts, and uncles. He remembers attending St. John Lutheran Church in Hamilton, Texas as one big family unit almost every Sunday, and this really taught him

the importance of a strong life in worship to Jesus Christ!

From a young age Erik has enjoyed playing and watching baseball games. He also enjoyed hunting, fishing, and being outdoors with his Dad, Granddad, and his Great uncle Jim. It was on these hunting trips that Erik's appreciation and interest for American history grew. While he credits all of the men in his family for their part in helping foster this appreciation, he especially thanks his Great Uncle Jim for spending countless hours telling him about his involvement in World War II. Thanks, in a large way to these conversations Erik decided to attend Texas A&M and enroll in the Corps of Cadets after his graduation from Hamilton High School in 2007.

As a freshman at Texas A&M Erik participated in the Corps of Cadets while studying Computer Science. Erik thought of becoming a computer programmer in the Air Force, until he realized that God was calling him down a different path. 
