A Little Luther: Today's quote comes from a sermon on the Epistle lesson about the proper motivation for good works. "[God] wants no work which flows from an unwilling spirit and no service which is wrung from a sullen heart. He wants glad and cheerful service to God. The man is worthless who will not be invited and incited by such sweet and winning words about the mercy God so superabundantly conferred and bestowed on us in Christ to imitate with pleasure and delight this divine example to the glory of God and the benefit of his neighbor.
