The Lord's Supper: As we come to the Lord's Supper we both receive and proclaim. We receive into our mouths not only bread and wine but the very body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Through our participation in this Holy Meal we proclaim his death until He comes. By our participation in the sacrament at this congregation which is a member of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, we are indicating our agreement with the confession of the LCMS. We request that only those who share this confession and are instructed in the sacrament take part today.

A Little Luther: The Reformation restored to the church true teaching about God's saving grace. Today's quote is a warning not to let the message of grace become an excuse for sin. "For although God has promised forgiveness, as Augustine says, He has not promised that you will certainly return after the fall. Thus neither Saul nor Judas returned. To apprehend grace does not lie without our power, and you do not know whether you will be able to accept the forgiveness offered. Therefore we should fear God, who hates presumption as well as despair.... You should avoid both of these sins. Do not say: A propitiation and expiation for sin are on hand. Therefore I shall go on sinning without fear. You should not continue to live in such security, for it is possible that despair may overwhelm you before you apprehend God's mercy. You do not know the hour of your death, nor do you know whether the devil will lay his hands on you before you repent or may overcome you before you have room or time for conversion." WLS ¶ 4231
