

Good News of Grace

John 15:5 "I am the vine you are the branches, If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit apart from me you can do nothing."

This time of the year we will begin to see a great deal of effort going on with the goal of producing a crop. In fields, gardens and orchards labor is put forth with the goal of producing a crop. The Bible reminds us that God our heavenly Father also has a goal for us as his children. In John's gospel, Jesus speaks of God's goal being for us to be fruitful branches of the Living Vine. Jesus said, *"this it to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit."*

In agriculture we realize that completing various tasks isn't the ultimate goal. Having the garden perfectly tilled or the fertilizer put down isn't the final goal. The tasks serve the greater goal of fruitfulness. So also when it comes to being fruitful branches of the Living Vine it is important to keep the ultimate goal in mind.

For example, the goal is not simply to be forgiven of sin. Certainly Jesus speaks of the branches being pruned or cleaned. God desires us to be cleansed of sin. But that cleansing is in order to prepare us to be fruitful. Jesus also did not say that God's purpose for us is that we be happy. Or at least not happiness in our own short sighted view of what will make us happy. No like a gardener prunes the fruitful vines so that they will be even more fruitful so we are often chastened and disciplined so that we might be even more fruitful.

The purpose is not simply to get us to heaven. Certainly St. Peter speaks of *"the*

goal of your faith, the salvation of your souls.” Heaven is our home. But I think we need to be cautious if we speak of this as our goal. We need to think for a moment, why does God want us in heaven? Again it is not so we can sit around on clouds being “cloud potatoes.” No, the goal of our going to heaven is so that we might there fully realize and accomplish the purpose for which we were created without the hindrance of our sinful nature. Our goal is not simply to get into the door of heaven. What will we do in heaven?

Our goal is to serve the living God and praise him. As Saint John pictured heaven for us in the book of Revelation saying, “*his servants will serve him.*” Serving God is their joy and delight in heaven.

If it will be our goal to serve the living God and praise him in heaven for all eternity, why would our goal be any different now? As Saint Paul said, “*So we make it our goal to please him, whether we are at home in the body or away from it.*” The saints in heaven delight to serve God. Can our goal be any different? This is what we were created for.

As fruitful branches of the living vine we live out our purpose. The fruit God seeks is described in the book of Galatians as *the fruits of the Spirit*. These fruits are *love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.* (5:22) The book of Hebrews speaks of righteousness as the fruit of God’s discipline. In the book of Colossians, St. Paul speaks of good works as fruit. He says, “*We pray this in order that you may live a life worthy of the Lord and may please him in every way: bearing fruit in every good work, growing in the knowledge of God.*” (1:10)

Fruit is the visible expression of invisible faith. We can’t see the electricity that powers our home appliances, but we can see the results of that or the lack of results in some cases. The electricity causes lights to burn, fans to turn, televisions to operate.

As we abide in Christ, we may not see him or the faith that connects us to him. But we certainly can see the results in our lives as the power of Christ transforms us. Jesus said that through the bearing of much fruit we show ourselves to be his disciples. John said that this is how we know that we belong to the truth. There is no other possibility for those who remain in Christ. Jesus said, “*If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit.*” As we go about our day to day tasks, may we keep our goal in mind and seek to serve God faithfully. Pastor Buchhorn

FUTURE PLANS

As we continue to move toward our new normal, we rejoice that we are able to begin to make plans for our congregational life following the time when COVID casts such a long shadow over us. We thank God for granting healing to many who have suffered under COVID's effect, for protecting our congregation and community from a major outbreak and thank you all for your cooperation in adjusting our practices for the well-being of our fellow members. In their most recent meeting, the board of elders approved a plan for continued steps toward our church life as we move out of the pandemic. Some of those changes have already been implemented and others will be delayed until June when the majority of those desiring to be immunized will have been fully vaccinated.

Changes you will have already noticed.

- The hymnals and Bibles have been returned to the pews, along with the small attendance registration pads.
- While social distancing is still encouraged, the ropes helping to guide that will be removed on the south pews but will remain in place on the north side of the sanctuary.

Beginning in June the following is being planned.

- Communion distribution at the communion rail will resume.
- Disposable communion cups will still be used.
- Greeters, lay-readers, and robed acolytes will resume service.

For the foreseeable future until we know more about the duration of immunity and the effect of variants.

- Offerings will still be gathered at the doors without passing an offering plate.
- The common cup will not be used for communion distribution.
- Livestream of Sunday morning services will continue.

For those with health concerns the Saturday evening small group family communion hour will still be offered through May and will be re-evaluated as we approach summer. If you have questions or concerns about these plans, please contact an elder or one of the pastors.

Mission Council Minutes

April 19, 2021 7:30 p.m.

The Mission Council at Grace Lutheran Church met at 7:30 p.m. on Monday, April 19, 2021. The following members were present: Jerry Echtenkamp, Deb Jensen, Justin Anderson, Pastor Buchhorn, Angie Beiermann, Dwight Mock, Neal Greenwald, Chad Janke, Brian Frevort, Megan Dubbs, and Pastor Erik.

The meeting was called to order by Jerry Echtenkamp.

Pastor Buchhorn led a devotion and prayer.

The minutes from the March 8, 2021 Mission Council Meeting were reviewed. It was moved by Justin and seconded by Chad to approve the minutes. The motion was approved.

Deb Jensen presented the Financial Reports for March 2021. It was moved by Chad and seconded by Dwight to approve the financial reports. The motion was approved.

The Board of Elders met on April 5 with all elders in attendance. The board completed the Bible Study from the "Shepherding our Strays" series and will continue with the workshop materials prepared by the synod in coming months. The membership transactions were reviewed these included the addition of six new members via adult confirmation, the addition of seven junior confirmands to the list of communicant members, one new member received by affirmation of faith and another by transfer. No membership losses were reported. Upcoming weddings were reviewed. Confirmation and midweek activities were reviewed as another year of instruction will be drawing to a close in April. Campus Student Ministry activities were also reviewed. The District Pastor's conference was held online March 8 & 9 with a circuit discussion group in person at Cup of Grace. The Elders are continuing progress toward their goals. The board approved a plan for resumption of more normal church practice. This included some immediate changes and more changes planned for June after the majority of those who are desiring vaccination will be fully vaccinated. This plan was published in the bulletin and will be in the May newsletter. The Lent/Easter services were reviewed. Missionary Daniel Conrad was scheduled to present during our Bible class on April 18 via zoom.

Trustee Report, Justin Anderson- Justin will be coordinating getting the lawn sprinklers started up. Zach's Heating and Cooling was working on a bid for a water softener and water heater replacement. Consideration is being given to replacing the kitchen hot water heater with

two forty gallon tanks since there are occasionally issues with capacity in high demand times. Justin will forward the bid on to the mission council as soon as it is available. A list of needed repairs/upgrades for the Fishers of Kids building is being prepared for work this summer. A similar list is being prepared for Cup of Grace to be completed before we switch tenants.

Campus Ministry, Jerry Echtenkamp spoke with Pastor Erik for the report. Everything seems to be going good and will be wrapping the year up. A bonfire is being planned at Pastor Erik's house. Officers have been chosen along with the new tenant at the cup of Grace. The leadership team of the campus ministry group is working with Pastor Erik on plans for next school year.

Altar Guild - Chad Janke - Extend a thank you to Craig Evans for installing the new faucet in the sacristy.

Endowment - Pastor Conrad's virtual Bible class presentation over the weekend was well received. It was hoped that perhaps other of our mission recipients might be able to do a similar presentation so we can better know their circumstances and needs. Pastor Buchhorn has followed up with Pastor Conrad about how our congregation might help meet the needs for practical support items for training Latin American national pastors.

Memorial Fund - Deb Jensen - KimBerly Hansen reported to Deb. The memorial fund has \$2970.00 in the bank. There was a memorial of \$25.00 to the Kitchen Fund.

Evangelism - Neal Greenwald reported the new Connect to Disciple class will begin Sunday 4/25. These training materials are a part of the re:Vitality program.

Angie Beiermann reported the preschool board will take a day in the spring and fall and clean the windows at Fishers of Kids. Due to lower enrollment numbers and easing COVID concerns there will not be a need for a paid part time aid for the fall classes. Volunteers would still be welcome. Plans for the preschool graduation recognition on May 7 were discussed. A list of items to be completed at the preschool during the summer was being worked on. The preschool will have a field trip to the planetarium on the last day of school.

Old Business:

Ongoing Facility Projects-

The Main Street sign was further discussed. A motion was made, seconded and passed to move forward on the project with SignTech from Yankton doing the work. The sign is to be repainted and a new

monochrome display panel and software will be installed. The money for this project is to come from the endowment fund. Progress is being slowly made on the project to replace the wooden east doors of the church sanctuary. The new doors are to include the stain glass windows from the present doors. Justin received a bid from Stanley Steamer for cleaning the hall carpets in the education wing along with the offices, conference room and large meeting room at a cost of approximately \$600. Motion was made by Dwight and seconded by Neal to approve the bid. Thanks to everyone who came out and helped with the spring clean up day.

District circuit items - The Circuit pastors continue to meet regularly. The church at Winside and Martinsburg are awaiting the upcoming seminary call day to see if their calls will be filled. Keep the sister churches in prayer and continue to pray that God will raise up workers to serve in His harvest field.

Live streaming is still doing good.

Derek Jereske is scheduled to begin his 1 Year DCE internship this summer. Our choir director Micah Schut is also graduating and will be moving. We would like to do a thank-you and send off brunch for these talented young men on May 16. Pastor Erik's 5th ordination anniversary will also be observed.

New Business:

Motion made by Justin and seconded by Brian to approve payment of regular salary for an hourly worker required to quarantine due to COVID exposure. The motion passed.

Interim plans were approved for the Financial secretary position. Due to illness our present financial secretary has had to step aside from that role. Since this is a position of trust and requires the ability to responsibly handle confidential information it seemed good that this task be given over to those who have been elected to positions of trust in the congregation. After discussion to fill the immediate need for someone to count and post church offerings, it was decided to establish a schedule of offering counters from the mission council members and elders to assist with this task. They will count and deposit the offering each week. The Mission Council also agreed with a plan to ask a different member to assist with the posting of the offerings in the church financial record keeping system.

The meeting closed with the Lord's prayer.

The Next Meeting is scheduled for May 10, 2021.
