Harvest Time

This is a wonderful time of the year to be in Nebraska. The crops in the fields surrounding our community have grown under the watchful care of farmers and reached maturity. Now the harvesting has begun. The Bible frequently uses harvest imagery to teach lessons about God and life in God's kingdom.

One of those laws of the harvest is that "you reap what you sow." Those who desired to harvest corn this month, needed to plant corn seed in the spring, those who wanted soybeans needed to plant soybeans. You can't plant one and then seeing changes in the market decide half way through the growing season to change the crop into something else.

The Bible says something similar is true for our lives. Paul in Galatians 6 verse 7 wrote: **"Do not be deceived: God cannot be mocked. Whatever a man sows, he will reap in return."** (Gal 6:7)

According to that image, the words we say and the things we do are like seeds being sown. Paul goes on to give examples, he said, **"Whoever sows to please their flesh, from the flesh will reap destruction; whoever sows to please the Spirit, from the Spirit will reap eternal life."**

This basic law is true in farming and in life. You reap what you sow. If you stir up trouble, you will get trouble. We no doubt have seen how some of those seeds grow. For example, we have seen how the little lie

grew and grew into a full-scale deception. Similarly, if you sow seeds of a God pleasing life, it yields a harvest of righteousness.

During harvest time it is good to think about the seeds that were sown that yielded the crop we now see. It is good to ask what kind of seeds we are presently sowing in life. Will your words be a source of encouragement in the life of another or a burr under their saddle? If they grow to maturity will it be a cause of joy or sorrow?

Sadly we have to admit that we too frequently have sown to please the flesh and rightly should reap destruction. But our hope for the day of the final harvest is our Lord Jesus who only sowed good and yet he willingly took up punishment we deserved so that we might share in eternal life. The most important seed we sow will be to tell others about the hope we have in Christ who forgives sins and gives eternal life to all who believe. May He strengthen you to sow good seed through your life.

Grace Lutheran Ladies Aid met Sept. 8, 2021, with 13 members and Pastor Christensen in attendance. Pastor Christensen led a Bible study entitled "Joy In His Presence". Joy comes in viewing the Lord's grace as we savor an appreciation for the small things of life. We learn of His love in and through the study of His Word as Bible readings are read to enrich our lives. Christian Growth Chairman, Jan Casey, shared a reading entitled "The Waiting Room" taken from Psalms 62:5.

President Rhonda Sebade led the group in reciting the LWML Pledge. Minutes were read and approved. The Treasurer's report was given and filed for audit. Mites were collected and this month's Mission focus was the Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch located in Minot, North Dakota. Since 1952 the Ranch has touched the lives of more than 34,000 at-risk youth and their families.

A box of cards will now cost \$6.00 and individual cards will cost \$1.00.

Plans were made for LWML Sunday Oct. 3. Grace Kanitz and Jan Casey will be greeters at the 8:00 A.M. service and Mary Lou Erxleben and Rhonda Sebade will be greeters at the 10:30 A.M. service. Ladies Aid will also sponsor The Lutheran Hour broadcast. Mary Lou Erxleben will put out the large mite boxes for congregational giving.

The Fall Rally will be Oct. 19th at St. Paul's, Winside. Nominations for offices of secretary, treasurer, vice president, and Christian growth will take place at the Nov. meeting. Mary Lou Erxleben and Rhonda have completed the rough draft of the constitution for merging Evening Circle and Ladies Aid. Members were asked to review it and further discussion will take place at the next meeting.

The birthday song was sung for Pastor Christensen, Beverly Hansen, Ellen Heinemann and Mary Lou Erxleben. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer

Deaconess Kelly’s work quickly began to bridge many of the gaps that often hinder a child’s healing. Nearly all of the female residents and many of the male residents have been traumatized at the hands of a male figure. This simple reality creates immediate trust issues that can be difficult for a child to bridge, especially when dealing with a male chaplain. The Word of God helps to heal the walls of broken trust. September 13, 2021

The Mission council at Grace Lutheran Church met at 7:30 p.m. on Monday September 13, 2021. The following members were present: Jerry Echtenkamp, Deb Jensen, Justin Anderson, Pastor Buchhorn, Angie Beiermann, Dwight Mock, Chuck Potosnyak, Chad Janke, Brian Frevert, Pastor Erik, Neal Greenwood, Heather Reinhardt, and Megan Dubbs.

The meeting was called to order by Jerry Echtenkamp.

Pastor Buchhorn led a devotion and prayer.

The minutes from August 9, 2021 were reviewed. It was moved by Angie and seconded by Justin to approve the minutes. The motion was approved.

Deb presented the financial reports for August 2021. It was moved by Chuck and seconded by Chad to approve the financial reports. Motion carried.

Elder's report - Chuck Potosnyak – The board of Elders met September 13 prior to the Mission Council Meeting. Membership changes were approved including one addition by baptism and one loss by death. Two weddings were performed by the pastors since the last meeting. It was reported by Pastor Erik that midweek classes were going well. Sunday school reorganized their class groupings. The pastors are registered to attend the District Pastor's conference in Kearney Oct. 21 & 22 and a circuit forum meeting is scheduled to be held at Grace, September 26. Goals and projects for the year are continuing. Due to the continuing concerns with the COVID variants it was decided not to make further changes in revised worship practices at this time. The Board will meet prior to the end of the month to consider salary recommendations for the pastors to include in the 2022 budget proposal.

Committee Reports:

Trustee Report - Justin Anderson – Justin and Jerry are still looking at solutions to fix the leaking sanctuary AC pan.

Campus Ministry - Pastor Erik reported that every week there are new attendees at the Sunday evening suppers. Pastor Erik always welcomes congregation members to join the students for supper or volunteer to assist with the evening. Pastor Erik also helped organize a concert, Jake Gill at the Willow Bowl on-campus which was also was a fundraiser towards our youth attending the National Conference this summer.

Endowment-The committee plans to meet at 7:00 p.m. on October 11 to discuss the distribution of endowment funds.

Memorial Fund - Deb Jensen - Memorial Fund has \$3, 750.19. The kitchen has been busy serving families for funerals and social activities. Some of the youth in our congregation were able to help at a Saturday funeral and received very positive feedback for how much help they provided.

Education - Pastor Erik reported that the Sunday school classes were combined into Kindergarten/1st, 2nd/3rd, 4th/5th and 6th/7th/8th. They have started a new curriculum called "Answers in Genesis".

Preschool Angie Beiermann - Current enrollment is 6 students for the Monday/Wednesday/Friday class and 8 students for the Tuesday/Thursday. The first day of classes will be Sept. 7. New carpet has been installed. Joey Niemann came to look at leveling of the ground in preparation for a new swing set. The preschool committee is still looking at different types of swing sets to purchase.

No other reports were given.

Old Business:

Ongoing Facility projects-

SignTech from Yankton has ordered the parts to refurbish the Main street sign. The sign is anticipated to head out on the truck by the end of this week. Dwight worked with the SignTech representative to remove the panels of the sign to be painted. The sign will have the amber letters and will stay the same color and size.

East door project - The new doors have been constructed. The stained glass panels in the present doors have been removed for restoration before reinstallation in the new doors.

Church AC Programmable Thermostats-Justin is still in communication with Zach's to replace Sanctuary, upstairs education wing and office thermostats to programmable units. Speaking with Zach's it would cost an estimate of \$350.00 per unit to install.

District Circuit items - Circuit Forum will be held at Grace on Sept. 26. Both Pastor's plan to attend the District Pastor's Conference on Oct. 21-22 in Kearney. The District Convention has been rescheduled for June 24-25, 2022.

Continuing COVID precautions – The board of Elders is continuing to monitor practices as we move past the worst of the pandemic. If there is input which would be helpful in this regard speak to a pastor or board member.

Financial - Thanks to everyone who has assisted in the counting. Currently we are still looking for volunteers in November. A more permanent schedule will be discussed at our Annual Voter's Meeting.

Repairs on the church car continue to be a concern . The Council may have to consider replacement of the car or mileage reimbursement in the

future.

Annual Voter's Meeting-The meeting is set for November 21 at noon.

The Agenda and 2022 Officer nominations will be approved at the Oct. 11 Council meeting. Budget input requests have been distributed by the Treasurer and asked to be returned by Sept. 26. The Council will hold a budget meeting on Sept. 26 at 6:00 p.m. at Cup of Grace to discuss requests made. Jerry will be contacting Vel's to cater the meal for the annual meeting.

The Senior Dinner that will be held on Sept. 19 was discussed further. KimBerly Hansen will be organizing and planning the entertainment for the dinner.

The Preschool custodian position was advertised and three applications were reviewed by the Council through email. A vote was taken through email and Sarah Greenwald accepted the position and started last week.

New Business:

A generous gift in the amount of \$15,000 was received with the request to be used for a special project. Pastor Buchhorn suggested possibly using the funds to replace the 3 sanctuary AC units. Justin will be in contact with Zach's on a replacement estimate for further discussion.

The Natural Gas company is preparing a new contract on a fixed rate to be reviewed and discussed by the Council. With fluctuating temperatures in the winter a more even rate may suit our budget needs better.

The meeting closed with the Lord's prayer.

The Next Meeting is scheduled for Oct. 11, 2021.
