Hebrews 4:7 Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion.

If you are a sports fan you no doubt have seen many teams or racers who got off to amazing starts only to fall short of the ultimate goal of winning the game or finishing the race. Among the examples might be the 2009 Denver Bronco's in professional football who started the season 5-0 before going on to lose 8 of the next 10. Or the 2003 Minnesota Vikings who started an impressive 6-0 only to go 3-7 the rest of the way and miss the playoffs.

As disappointing as those seasons are for fans, there is a worse failure by far. The book of Hebrews points us back to the Exodus and reminds us of the people God delivered from Egypt by His mighty hand. Talk about an amazing start! But you know for the most part those people so graciously favored by God, did not enter the promised land. In spite of God's gracious and saving action on their part, because of their sinful disobedience and rebellion, the bodies of most of them were strewn across the desert. They did not reach their goal. They never made it to the promised land.

In our Wednesday morning Bible class we have been studying about Saul, the first king of Israel. Saul was an impressive young man without equal among the Israelites--a head taller than any of the others. He started so well. But before it was all said and done, he like the Israelites in the wilderness was rejected by God because of his disobedience. The Bible declares, "*Saul died because he*

was unfaithful to the LORD; he did not keep the word of the LORD and even consulted a medium for guidance, and did not inquire of the LORD.” (1 Chron. 10:13-14).

Is it any wonder that over and over again in Jesus’ words to the churches in the book of Revelation, the promises are made to the one who overcomes and to the ones who are faithful even unto death. Falling short is too common a story. Sadly, it is a story we still see. How many of those who start so well on their Christian walk fail to finish well? Think back to those you were confirmed with, how many are still diligently and faithfully following the Savior. Too many seem to stop short of the goal.

In each case where someone comes up short or gives up, it seems something got in the way which prevented the individual from finishing well. In some cases it was **pride** that got in the way. The Bible tells us: *“Saul set up a monument for himself” 1 Sam. 15:12.* The same was true for another failed king named Uzziah. We are told *“After Uzziah became powerful, his pride led to his downfall.”* Another pitfall is **dishonesty**. Lies supplant the truth in our hearts. Perhaps the most dangerous are the lies that we tell ourselves.

When we lie to ourselves we will tend to want to avoid those who know the truth including our God. People who did not finish well often began to listen to someone other than God. Saul tried to replace the priests, he later turned to others like the witch at Endor rather than the living God when he didn’t hear what he wanted to hear from God or when God did not act on his timetable. Uzziah’s sin of pride led him to think that he could take the place of the priests at the temple so he went to offer sacrifices himself. When he did this 80 priests confronted him to say, *“It is not right for you, Uzziah, to burn incense to the LORD. That is for the priests, the descendants of Aaron, who have been consecrated to burn incense” 2Chron 26:18.*

Burning incense at our own altar, following the inclinations of our heart and ignoring the Word of God. Ignoring the church and making up our own religion. If we were to listen closely to our God today, would he tell us this thing going on in your life, “It is not right for you.” There are as many ways to get tripped up as there are people. Is there any hope of being able to finish well?

Thankfully, the book of Hebrews tells us *“the promise of entering his rest still stands.”* As you read these words today, that promise still stands.

These words bring with them the promise of rest which comes as we trust in the completed work of Christ on our behalf. That we have been allowed to see this day, means that it is not too late so long as our hearts have not been hardened to the message. One day it will be too late. but today is not that day.

Today hear his voice. Listen to God. As we listen and His Word reveals some sin, today is the day to confess that sin to Him lest we our hearts become hardened. This admission to God that He is right deflates sinful pride.

By our own strength we will not be able to finish well. We find our help in the Lord who in his mercy has already finished the course for us. Hebrews tells us, *“Let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us. Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of our faith, who for the joy set before him endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God”* Heb 12:1-2. Jesus has already finished the race. It is his completed race that is credited to us through faith. In Jesus rather than having our sin remembered, we have another hope.

God offers to us the fruits of Christ’s work by the power of the Holy Spirit. It is that spirit who gives strength to those who are being tested. It is that Spirit through the means of grace, the word of God and the Sacraments who strengthens us so that we can finish well.

May God help us so that at the end of our race it may be said of us that we finished well. May we like St. Paul be able to say: *“The time has come for my departure. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day--and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing”* 2Ti 4:6-8.

Alaska Mission for Christ Mission Trip to Camp Bingle

If you love a great adventure, being in God's beautiful outdoors, serving other people, and are at least 18 years old then you can't beat a weeklong trip to the Last Frontier at Camp Bingle! Join Pastor Erik and the team on this amazing Mission Trip that is currently being scheduled for May 14th thru May 21st, 2022! At Camp Bingle, which is located on Harding Lake and an hour from Fairbanks, we will be doing Habitat for Humanity type construction work, as well as regular maintenance on already existing structures. This trip is open to all skill levels from complete novices in construction to those who have made a career in the field. The total cost for this trip would be approximately \$700 including airfare to Fairbanks, transportation to and from Camp Bingle, food, and lodging. There is a requirement of a \$100 deposit to secure your spot on the trip. That deposit should be turned into Pastor Erik by December 5th along with a medical release form that he will get to you upon request. Lastly, Alaska Mission for Christ requires that all who serve in this opportunity be fully vaccinated by the time they arrive in Alaska. For further details please speak to Pastor Erik about this opportunity as well as the chance to visit Pastor Carl and Darlene Lilienkamp in Anchorage at the end of the week. The cost of this portion of the trip is not included in the price above, but plans are being made for cost effective lodging to assist during that time as well. Again, our hope is we can take a great group of adventurous people who are ready to serve our neighbors in the north!

Mission Council Minutes

October 11, 2021

The Mission council at Grace Lutheran Church met at 7:30 p.m. on Monday October 11, 2021. The following members were present: Jerry Echtenkamp, Deb Jensen, Pastor Buchhorn, Angie Beiermann, Dwight Mock, Chuck Potosnyak, Chad Janke, Pastor Erik, Neal Greenwood, Heather Reinhardt, and Megan Dubbs.

The meeting was called to order by Jerry Echtenkamp.

Pastor Buchhorn led with prayer.

The minutes from September 13, 2021 were reviewed. It was moved by Chuck and seconded by Neal to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

Deb presented the financial reports for September 2021. It was moved by Dwight and seconded by Megan to approve the financial reports. Motion carried.

Elder's report - Chuck Potosnyak – The Board of Elders met on October 4, 2021. Pastor Buchhorn opened the meeting with prayer. Jim Kahler died on September 30, 2021 and a graveside service was conducted at Greenwood Cemetery on October 6, 2021. Bonnie Sandahl died on October 3, 2021 and her funeral service will be held at Grace on October 11, 2021. Junior Confirmation and Midweek classes are going well. A Wednesday night class for high school students is being planned from 7:45-8:45 p.m. At this time, it will meet once a month. The Sunday School is planning an October Fall Fest for October 30, 2021, which will offer games, activities, and films. Due to high costs, our students will have the option of packaging Mercy Meals at the Orphan Grain Train in Norfolk, Nebraska, instead of Cup of Grace. The District Pastor's Conference will meet October 21-22, 2021 in Kearney. A Reformation service is planned for 3:00 p.m. on October 31 at Immanuel Lutheran in Laurel. There was continued discussion of appropriate follow up with inactive members. A letter from Synod President Matthew Harrison was shared concerning the synod's stance on the COVID-19 vaccines. The church sign has been repaired and is working. The new church doors are completed. Pastor Erik will be on vacation November 12-15, 2021 and Pastor Buchhorn will be on vacation December 1-8, 2021.

Committee Reports:

Trustee Report -per Jerry Echtenkamp-Zach's came to provide an estimate for the 3 air conditioner units needing to be replaced and recommended the Council contact a company that replaces larger, commercial size units. Jerry and Justin will be contacting two companies to come and provide estimates for the possible replacements.

Campus Ministry – Pastor Erik reported the South retaining wall at Cup of Grace is in need of some repairs. Justin and Jerry will go access what repairs needed to be completed.

Endowment-The Endowment Fund Administrative committee met at 7:00 p.m. tonight to discuss the distribution of endowment funds. The committee recommended that the approval of five gifts to support missionaries be put on the voters' agenda. These include four mission efforts previously supported: Pastor Conrad in Mexico, Pastor Flo and Siouxland Hispanic Outreach, Jesus Our Savior Preschool in Winnebago and Lutheran Hour. The committee also plans to contact Mission Central for additional missions to support.

Memorial Fund - Deb Jensen - Memorial Fund has \$5, 563.19. The kitchen has been busy serving families for funerals and social activities. Ideas are being generated for ways to utilize the memorial fund.

Education - Pastor Erik reported that the Sunday school teachers started the first chapter in their enrichment study of the book Joining Jesus on His Mission. A Reformation/Fall Fest is being planned for October 30, starting at 5:30 p.m. with games and activities and a movie starting at 7:00 p.m. till 9:00 p.m. Sunday School is also starting to get ready for the Christmas program.

Preschool Angie Beiermann - Preschool reported 1 new enrollment. A bid is being sought for leveling some of the playground in preparation for a new swing set. The preschool committee is still looking at different types of swing sets to purchase.

No other reports were given.

Old Business:

Ongoing Facility projects-

SignTech from Yankton installed the new main street sign on last Monday, October 4. A big thank you to Dwight Mock and his brother Galen for helping with the installation of the sign and re-painting of the old sign. It was moved by Heather and seconded by Angie to make the final payment of \$8,100 to SignTech. Motion carried. The cost and the logistics of disposing of the old electronic sign was discussed. It was moved by Deb and seconded by Dwight to approve the disposal of the old sign to an interested party. Motion carried

East door project – The new doors have been completed and installed. Our thanks to Ray and Theresa Jensen along with their daughter Megan who coordinated this project in memory of Matt Jensen.

Church AC Programmable Thermostats- Zach's has replaced the upstairs education wing and office thermostats with programmable units.

District Circuit items - Circuit Reformation service will be held in Laurel on October 31 at 2:00 p.m. Both Pastor's plan to attend the District Pastor's Conference on Oct. 21-22 in Kearney. The District Convention has been rescheduled for June 24-25, 2022.

Continuing COVID precautions – The board of Elders is continuing to monitor practices as we move past the worst of the pandemic. If there is input which would be helpful in this regard speak to a pastor or board member.

Repairs on the church car continue to be a concern. The Council may have to consider replacement of the car or mileage reimbursement in the future.

Annual Voter's Meeting-The meeting is set for November 21 at noon. The meal will be catered by Vel's Bakery featuring bar-b-que sandwiches, cheesy potatoes and a vegetable. The agenda, 2022 Officer nominations and budget that will be presented at the meeting and on the ballot was discussed and reviewed. It was motioned by Chuck and seconded by Angie to approve the agenda and 2022 Officer nominations as presented. It was motioned by Chad and seconded by Deb to place the proposed 2022 as presented on the agenda. Motions carried.

In discussing the budget, it was noted that the janitor's contract was renewed for October 2021-September 2022 at a salary of \$16, 008 for the year. This action was approved in late September through an email vote of the majority of the Mission Council.

The Senior Dinner was held on Sept. 19. Thank you to KimBerly Hansen for organizing and planning the meal and entertainment and the dinner along with other volunteers who helped make this event as success.

The fixed rate contract for Natural Gas has ben signed and begins in November. This will suit our budget needs better with the rising costs of natural gas.

New Business:

Various, small maintenance projects were discussed and will be looked into from the Council for solutions.

The meeting closed with the Lord's prayer.

The Next Meeting is scheduled for November 8, 2021.
