So he called ten of his servants and gave them ten minas. 'Put this money to work,' he said, 'until I come back.' Luke 19:13

In the gospel of Luke Jesus told the story of a man who was going away on a journey . Before he left, he entrusted his servants with a portion of his wealth and gave them the instruction: *"Put this money to work until I come back."* As the story continues, we are told that some used the wealth well. Sadly at least one servant did not put the wealth to any use. The story tells how the master responded to the servants' use of his resources in his absence.

As servants of God we are a part of the same story. God is the owner of everything. Through our natural gifts, abilities and the blessings that come through work we have been entrusted with a part of God's wealth. This wealth was given to us with the instruction to use it for God's purposes.

God's word tells us that of all that God gives to us we are to first of all return a portion to Him. In the Old Testament, God explicitly commanded that his people were to give a tithe or 10% of what they received. In the New Testament a similar principle is articulated. Paul told the Corinthians concerning their offering *"On the first day of every week, each one of you should set aside a sum of money in keeping with his income."* He also told them: *"Each man should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver"* 2 Cor. 9:7. Following our giving to God we are to use remainder to provide for our own needs, the needs of our family and others.

Faithfulness in this task of handling earthly wealth is a training ground for other areas. Jesus said, *"Whoever can be trusted with very little can also be trusted with much, and whoever is dishonest with very little will also be dishonest with much. So if you have not been trustworthy in handling worldly wealth, who will trust you with true riches? And if you have not been trustworthy with someone else's property, who will give you property of your own? No servant*

can serve two masters. Either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will be devoted to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and Money” Luke 16:10-13.

We faithfully care for the goods of the Master because it is our duty. But there is more. Jesus’ words remind us that faithful management brings reward. The one who is trustworthy in the small thing proves they can be trusted with larger things. Faithfulness in the care of another’s property leads to property of our own.

It is a privilege to be able to manage a part of the Master’s wealth for Him. In our management we are allowed to experience the truth of Jesus’ words *“It is more blessed to give than to receive”* Acts 20:35. The extent of that blessing was seen in Jesus’ story as those who had faithfully used the master’s wealth were told, *“Well done, my good servant”* and they were given charge of cities.

It is good for us as God’s people to consider what we will do with the wealth of the master which has been entrusted to us. May God rightly help us to clearly understand His will for us and gladly and freely give as He has inclined our hearts.

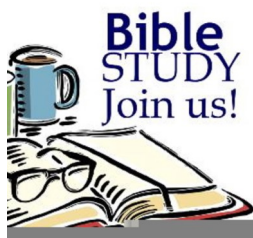

Free Meals – Grace Lutheran

Grace Lutheran Church hosts weekly free meals for students, Sunday nights at 7:30 at Cup of Grace Coffee Shop.

When describing the event, vice president of the Lutheran Student Fellowship, Symphony Jareske, described the event as, "Pretty much just a free meal to whoever just wants to come, regardless of affiliation of church." The weekly meal has been going on for the past few years at Cup of Grace Coffee Shop and has given meals and fellowship to many students. Their goal is to provide a space for students to get a free meal when they otherwise might not, as well as to provide fellowship and a place to spread their ministry.

The meals vary week to week. Pastas, potato bars, and pizza were just a few meals listed by Pastor Erik Christensen. "I'll have all the ovens going and heating any food up probably around 6 to 6:15...and then 7:30 we're pulling food out of the ovens and getting it on to their plates," said Christensen. During that time, the church also offers a Bible study for any students interested, led by different pastors and students.

Grace Lutheran Church, an affiliate of Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, has also been offering many additional opportunities for fellowship. Jareske listed activities such as movie nights, bonfires, painting nights and pumpkin carving as more opportunities for the community. When asked how it affects their ministry, Jareske said, "overall, the church group itself has led to more college students going to the church."

The dinners are continuing to be held throughout the semester and are expected to have more students coming to eat there as they progress. In regards to the growing numbers, Pastor Christensen said, "God provides. He has an awesome way of giving us exactly what we need when we need it."

Grace Lutheran Church

September 12, 2022

The Mission Council at Grace Lutheran Church met at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, September 12, 2022. The following members were present: Pastor Buchhorn, Lowell Johnson, Angie Beiermann, Chuck Potosnyak, Louise Green, Chad Janke, Brian Frevert, Jerry Echtenkamp, Megan Dubbs, Diana Langemeier, and Michelle Ekberg.

The meeting was called to order by Jerry.

Pastor Buchhorn led with an opening prayer and small devotion.

The minutes from August 8, 2022 were reviewed and approved; moved by Louise and seconded by Chuck. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report – Louise Green

Budget request forms were sent out for soliciting input for the 2023 budget proposal.

The Financial report was reviewed. A motion was made by Brian to approve; Chad seconded. Motion carried.

Elder's report – Chuck Potosnyak

The Board of Elders met on August 29, 2022. Pastor Buchhorn opened the meeting with prayer. Official Acts included the wedding of Peyton Janke and Brittney Unger on August 13, 2022, officiated by Pastor Erik. Junior Confirmation/Midweek has begun with classes starting on August 31, 2022. Rally Day was held on August 21, 2022, and was successful. Campus Student Ministry had seventeen students in attendance at the last meeting. The Fall Pastors' Conference is scheduled for October 10-11, 2022 in Norfolk, Nebraska. The Pictorial Directory Project is scheduled for November 8-12, 2022. On September 6, 2022, a representative

from the company will be at Grace for a preliminary meeting. Volunteers are needed to help with this effort. Salary recommendations for the 2023 budget were approved. The Elders conducted an annual review with Pastor Buchhorn and Pastor Erik. The Elders recommend to the Mission Council give consideration to hiring a part time Media Assistant. Pastor Erik will be on vacation September 20-24, 2022 and Pastor Buchhorn will be on vacation September 26-October 7, 2022. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.

Committee Reports:

Trustee Report –Lowell discussed an on-demand water heater with Ellis Plumbing; more information will be looked into. The odor issue at Cup of Grace is being further investigated.

Campus Ministry- A brief discussion was held concerning funds designated for Mercy Meals. During the pandemic, events were not able to be held at Cup of Grace. Additionally, student funding which previously was used for this effort is no longer available. Post pandemic the cost to bring an event to Wayne significantly increased and in the interim the facilities in Norfolk for this work were upgraded. For these reasons, it is hoped that a recommendation can be brought to voters on sending any previously collected funds designated for Mercy Meals on to be used for this purpose without hosting an event in Wayne.

Monies given from the District convention to support campus ministry in Nebraska should be received soon. Volkman's from Norfolk will be called to help isolate the cause of odor at the Cup of Grace. There have been 8 students coming for Bible study and 17 for Sunday supper.

Memorial Fund- A total balance in the Memorial Fund for the end of this month is \$2,048.19.

Education- The Sunday school children took a vote regarding their mission project during this Sunday school year. Symphony will provide a quart jar to collect cash/change from the students and will donate the earnings to the Wayne Food Pantry.

Preschool-from Megan- A 'thank you' to Jerry, Lowell, Dwight, Pastor Erik, Pastor Buchhorn, Chad Sebade, and Chad's son for assistance with playground work. Swing set has arrived and will be ready for assembly. Pea gravel is being sought for the fall zone. New chairs for the preschool have also arrived. A Tuition Assistance request for \$50 per month for a total grant of \$400 was received. A motion was moved by Chuck to approve this request; seconded by Megan. Motion carried.

No other reports were given.

Old Business:

Ongoing facility projects- Angie Hansen has begun to repaint the exterior doors; first coat has been made. Women's restroom changes will hopefully begin soon. Install vent cap on north side of the education wing-repair lower-level bathroom ceiling will be completed once the roofing company comes. Lighting in the library area have been fixed by Lowell. The northwest stairwell is still needing lights changed. Checking for source of the water leak in the basement fellowship hall AC room during heavy rains. The wall in the preschool classroom is needing repaired and paint touched up.

Building security cameras for the church are still be investigated.

Approval was sought for the placement of a decorative Scripture verse sign in the basement between the serving windows. A motion approving this was made by Michelle; and seconded by Megan. Motion carried

District & Circuit Items- Both pastors are registered for Fall Pastors' Conference to be held October 10th & 11th, 2022 in Norfolk.

2022 Voters' meeting will be November 13, 2022. It is the goal to mail the budget and agenda by October 13th. A budget meeting will take place on September 25 at 7pm to prepare a draft of the proposed 2023 Budget. The Mission Council will then be asked to approve the proposed budget at their next meeting prior to it being included in the mailing.

Nomination progress is slow. Names and volunteers are needed. Vel's Catering will be contacted for the meal during the voters' meeting.

Church Custodian Contract expires September 30. Our present custodians are willing to continue and have been doing an excellent job. A motion was made by Louise; seconded by Chad to approve the contract for another year at a total salary of \$16,488. Motion carried.

The Senior Dinner is scheduled for September 18 following the late service. Invitations were sent and have had around 45 RSVP. A motion was made by Michelle; seconded by Louise to approve a \$200 honorarium for this year's entertainment. Jackie Owens will be the presenter and has a story on aprons. She and her guest will join us for the dinner meal.

New Business:

Pictorial Directory Project: Thank you to the volunteers who agreed to coordinate the Pictorial Directory Project; Louise Green, Grace Kanitz, KimBerly Hansen. Photography will be November 8-12. Online appointment sign-ups have begun. In person sign-up will begin in October.

Synodical Covention Lay Delegate Nomination: Our circuit forum representative Deb Jensen has consented to be nominated for this. It was moved by Louise and seconded by Angie to submit Deb Jensen as our congregation's nominee for consideration by the Circuit Forum. Motion carried.

Budget Requests: In addition to presently funded ministries request were received by the Mission Council to consider the following possible additions to the 2023 budget:

Part-time audio/visual assistant, this person would be responsible for running the video and sound equipment at each service. This was motioned by Louise; seconded by Chuck. Motion carried.

Congregational funding for church book bags. There is a desire to add additional materials to the children book bags available for use by smaller children during worship. This would allow the materials to be changed out seasonally in keeping with the church year. It was requested to consider adding \$500 to the annual budget for this purpose. A motion was made to include this request in the 2023 proposed budget by Louise; seconded by Diana. Motion carried.

Pianist for Saturday evening services. The Saturday Family Communion services generally have no music or only unaccompanied singing. The request was to add funding for a pianist to play for some of the services. Moved to include funding for this item in the 2023 proposed budget by Chuck; seconded by Louise. Motion carried.

A request to include installation of an irrigation system in the front yard of the preschool was discussed. A preliminary bid for the project indicated possible cost of \$2,300. A motion was made to added this item to the 2023 proposed budget by Louise; seconded by Lowell. Motion carried.

Guest Preacher: Pastor Paul Flo our Siouxland Hispanic Minister will be our guest preacher at both services on October 16th. A portion of our endowment funds are given towards the Siouxland Hispanic Ministry in South Sioux City. The preschool will be singing at the late service on this date as well.

The meeting closed with the Lord's prayer.

The next meeting is scheduled for October 10, 2022 at 7:00 pm.
