Our Attitude Toward Work

In preparing to record some devotions for the local radio station, I came across this devotion from a book entitled "God's Word for Today" by O. Hallesby. It was written almost 100 years ago but the thoughts expressed are timeless. As we prepare to observe the Labor Day holiday, may we give thought to the attitude we take toward our work whatever that work may be.

"And whatsoever ye do, in word or in deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him." COLOSSIANS 3:17

This is one of the many passages of the Bible about our daily life and our daily work. The Scriptures tell us that our daily work is a service unto God, yes, a means by which others may be saved—even those who are hard to win.

In Luther's day to marry and establish a Christian home was not considered holy, but to remain unmarried and enter a cloister, on the other hand, was holy. To be a mother was not holy, but to be a nun was. To do one's daily work was not holy, but to make pilgrimages and give gifts to monasteries and churches was.

In this connection, too, Luther brought to light once again the Biblical view: God looks on the attitude of our hearts. In the daily life of the faithful Christian there are therefore no acts which in themselves are holy and others which in themselves are unholy. No, all our deeds are well-pleasing to God if they are done in the right attitude of heart; to the glory of God in Jesus' name, in love toward God and in zeal for the welfare of others.

Luther says therefore that it is just as well-pleasing to God that we sweep the floor as it is that we preach the Gospel, provided that both are done in the right attitude of heart. Whether we are to sweep or to preach is simply a question of the gift of


grace that God has given us.

Do your ordinary daily work, therefore, and rejoice that through it you are rendering a spiritual service every day. By so doing you shall also win souls for God, even the hardest. You shall win those who, the Scriptures tell us, cannot be won by words.

May God bless your labor and help us in our various vocations to serve Him and others.

Alaska Mission for Christ 2023

The 2023 Alaska Mission for Christ theme was based on John 1: 16 "For from His fullness we have all received grace upon grace."

We were blessed to spend another summer in Alaska as Alaska Mission for Christ long-term volunteers. What better place to be during a hot sweltering Midwest summer than the cool low- to mid-50s and 60s with almost daily drizzle during the 20-hours of sunlit days of Alaska. We stayed in a classroom at Anchor Lutheran School, just feet away from where the teams spent the night. (A wonderful accommodation for a retired teacher and pastor to spend a summer!) We daily rejoiced at God's majesty when we saw the mountains and ocean, and the profuse abundance of God's creation in this place-trees, flowers, and animals. The greatest blessing was working with the people--the teams coming and going through Anchorage, and the church and school that has become like family--Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church and Anchor Lutheran School.

AMC had close to 55 teams and over 400 volunteers serving in villages, some on the road system, but most in villages only accessible by air. These teams often have to go on a grocery shopping trip and haul all they need with them as groceries are not available for purchase in these wild remote locations. What IS readily available are opportunities to share God's love through Vacation Bible School, Fine Arts, Sports, Work & Witness projects, and Teen Camp. In fact, during Teen Camp this summer, about 30 teens were flown in from their remote villages to spend time hearing God's plan of salvation at this place north of the Arctic Circle. It was with great joy that six of these teens were baptized during the week!

It is our job to greet teams from all over the lower 48 at the airport, help them get supplies as necessary, have orientation and devotions with them, and arrange for a night of rest at either Anchor Lutheran School/ Beautiful Savior Lutheran Church in Anchorage or Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Chugiak. Other teams go directly to Fairbanks or Juneau. When they arrive in their destination villages, some of these servant teams stay in public schools that may have no heat or hot water and the temperatures dip into the upper 30s to low 40s at night.

We are thankful for the prayers of many of you for our safety driving to Alaska, the months serving there, and our return trip.

"Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness. For the Lord is good; His steadfast love endures forever, and His faithfulness to all generations" (Ps. 100:1-2, 5).

Mission Council for Grace Lutheran Church met at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, August 24, 2023.

The following members were present: Craig Evans, Ron Sebade, Pastor Buchhorn, Dwight Mock, Chuck Potosnyak, Lowell Johnson, Diana Langemeier, Louise Green, Michael Temme, and Michelle Ekberg

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Craig Evans.

Pastor Buchhorn led with an opening prayer and small devotion.

The minutes from July 11, 2023 were reviewed; motion to approve by Chuck; seconded by Pam. Motion carried.

Treasury Report

Louise Green presented the financial reports for July 2023. Michelle moved to approve; Diana seconded. Motion carried.

Elder's report - Chuck Potosnyak reports,

The Board of Elders met at 7:30 p.m. on August 7, 2023. Pastor Buchhorn led the Elders in our continuing study of the Large Catechism. Membership losses included Mardelle Hallstrom, who died July 9, 2023, in San Antonio, Texas. A graveside committal service was

conducted July 29, 2023 at Veterans Cemetery in Wayne. Junior Confirmation/Midweek classes are scheduled to resume August 23, 2023. Junior Confirmation expectations were reviewed and approved by the Elders. A full slate of teachers has been identified for Sunday School instruction. Plans are in place for Rally Day on August 20, 2023, which will be held at the sanctuary. Bibles and Catechisms will be presented to the 3rd and 6th grade students in the 10:30 a.m. service. Students will return to Wayne State classes on August 21, 2023. Grace is registered to participate in a Business Expo on campus August 20 and a Student Organization Recruitment event of August 22, 2023. A meal schedule has been posted for Cup of Grace Sunday night dinners. The youth have a camping trip planned at Camp Luther on September 8-9, 2023, and also have plans for participating in a Pack Away Hunger event October 14, 2023 at Mercy Meals in Norfolk. The Call Committee is continuing its search for Parish Assistant. Benefit Plan changes must be made by September 15, 2023. The Elders approved keeping the same Benefit Plan in place.

Committee Reports:

Call Committee- The committee is continuing its search process to identify and interview potential candidates until a suitable candidate has been found.

Trustee Report — Roof leak from the bell tower into the sanctuary still awaiting caulking, while undertaking this job the bell support needs repair. It will require the lifting of the bell and replacement of the bell mount. Repairs in the lower-level bathroom ceiling along with repairs and wall touch ups in the Preschool Sunday School room are needing completion. The lawn sprinkler system expansion at the preschool approved earlier in the year was installed in early August. Heating issues in the restrooms and conference room upstairs in the education wing is still in progress. A leak into Pastor Buchhorn's office when it rains will be investigated further by Lowell and Craig. Sunday School teachers have requested to personalize their rooms by painting some of the walls. This request was approved by Mission Council members.

- Campus Ministry- Wayne State began classes on the 21st of August.

 Dan and Bonnie Hansen have volunteered to host and coordinate
 Sunday night meals. The first meal was held on August 20 with 8
 students in attendance. Chuck and Pastor had a table set up at the
 college; many connections were made with students regarding
 Grace Lutheran Church and the Cup of Grace. The large screen television has been installed. Thank you to Lowell and Craig!
- **Auxillary (Altar Guild/LWML): (Pam)** Altar Guild will be putting together Crismon kits for members to make if they wish. More advertising will be coming regarding this opportunity.
- **Endowment** The 1 year CD is maturing August 22, as previously approved those funds will come back to a local account to be disbursed this year. A recommendation for possible disbursements will be discussed before the next council meeting.
- **Memorial Fund** Louise reports from KimBerly Hansen. The memorial account has \$2,440. Jason Biermann wired the ovens as a donation in honor of his grandfather, Merlin Biermann.
- Education (Sunday School, Midweek, VBS, Children Programming) Diana reports that the Sunday School teachers met tonight. All teaching positions have been filled. Thank you to all who will be teaching this fall. Rally Day seemed to go quite well. Thank you to the Elders and Kitchen Sisters for assisting with the meal. A big 'THANK YOU' to Payton and Brittney Janke for providing the meat and grill.
- Preschool-from Megan- Preschool has had orientation. Currently there are one or two slots available for the T/TH class. Preschool blinds and porch repainting has been in the works. Thank you to all those who helped. Window removal and shelving in the northeast room has been completed. There was a discussion regarding the driveway curb cut at the preschool. Two options were presented by Lowell and bids from Sebade Construction were given. Option 1) Leave the 18x19 driveway (\$2,200) from the street to the sidewalk. Option 2) replace the curb (\$2,700). A bid was presented also for the entire sidewalk on the west side of the preschool to be replaced (\$3,400). These items of discussion were tabled for a future meeting.

Stewardship/Finance: Mike has no new reports.

Administrative Handbook: Louise reported July items have been completed.

Evangelism/Publicity/Community Engagement: Grace Lutheran Church and The Cup of Grace was represented at the College Welcome Day. The event had positive feedback.

Fellowship/Kitchen: The new oven has been installed. "Thank you" to Craig and Neal. The kitchen served 170 at the funeral on Saturday, August 19, with Vel's catering the meat. They served 120 for the Claussen funeral on Monday, August 21. The Senior Dinner is scheduled for September 17. Mission council will help serve the meal and entertainment from 'The Sunsations'. Ron made a motion to provide a check of \$200 for the Quartet entertainment; Louise seconded. Motion carried. 'Thank you' to all who helped serve on Rally Day Sunday.

New Business:

Choir rehearsals will be on Thursday nights with director Daniel Oldenkamp. Valerie Knight will direct Bell Choir. Both will commence following Labor Day.
