Lectionary Summary: "Wisdom is justified by her deeds" (Matt. 11:19), and the true wisdom of God, Christ Jesus, the incarnate Son, justifies us by His deeds. He prepares His way by the preaching of repentance, but He has suffered the violence of the Law and voluntarily handed Himself over to violent men, in order that we may eat and drink with Him in His Kingdom and "remain in the house forever" (John 8:35). He is "a friend of tax collectors and sinners" (Matt. 11:18–19), and He has rescued us by His grace from the slavery of sin and death. By the proclamation of His eternal Gospel "to those who dwell on earth, to every nation and tribe and language and people" (Rev. 14:6), "the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law" (Rom. 3:21), "that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus" (Rom. 3:26). And by the hearing of that Gospel of Christ Jesus, "whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith" (Rom. 3:25), "you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free" (John 8:31–32).

Reformation Hymn Service Matins LSB 219

The 95 Theses which Martin Luther posted on the castle church of Wittenburg, Germany October 31, 1517 were an invitation to a *Disputation on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences*. This began a chain of events which led to the Protestant Reformation. Today we remember and rejoice at the clear articulation of the Christian faith which reclaimed central truths of the Bible that we are saved by God's Grace Alone though Faith in Jesus Christ Alone such faith is based on Holy Scripture Alone. May God keep us steadfast in His Word and that faith.


