## Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!

2 Corinthians 9:15

In the month of November our thoughts rightly turn to Thanksgiving. Once again we have seen the bounty of a fruitful earth being gathered in from the fields around us. God's blessings of sun and rain, soil and seed are once again have led to filled barns and bins.

Most of the blessings for which we give thanks are easy to describe. The explanation to the First Article of the Apostles' Creed in the Small Catechism for example lists some of them as "body and soul, eyes, ears and all my members, my reason and all my senses....clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, wife and children, land, animals and all I have."

The catechism goes on to remind us that these gifts come to us "only out of fatherly, divine goodness and mercy, without any merit or worthiness in me." And rightly concludes, "For all of this it is my duty to thank and praise, serve and obey Him."

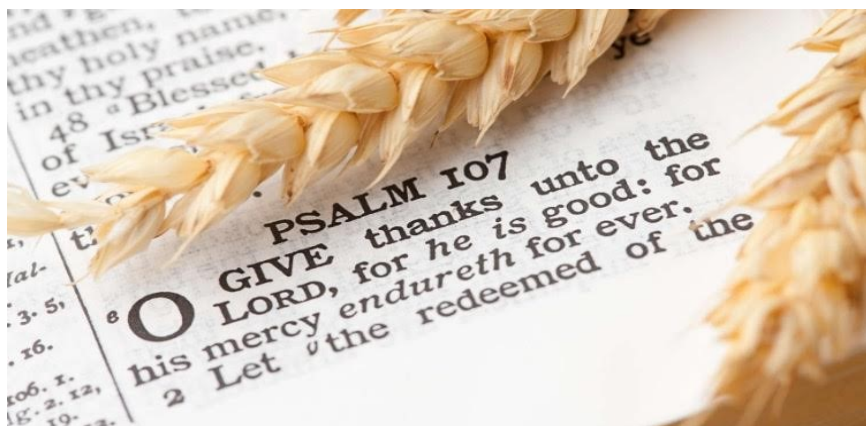
But as we form our own personal lists of things which we are thankful for, the list is incomplete if we think only of the things we can see or the eyes we see them with. St. Paul reminds us of this in the book of 2 Corinthians where he writes, "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" He reminds us of a gift that is so astounding and amazing it is "indescribable". The context of this verse helps us to begin to understand what that gift is.

Paul spoke of the "surpassing grace" God gave to the Corinthians. God had worked a miracle in the hearts and souls of the people of

Corinth. He had transformed them from selfish and self-centered people who thought only of themselves to a caring and supportive fellowship who were concerned for the needs of others. They showed that concern by freely and generously giving to help others. They did this because of the indescribable gift given to them and to us when God gave us Jesus. Jesus selflessly gave himself to us. His gift changes us.

Motivated by the love of Christ, the Corinthians learned to rely upon the provision of God and trusted that “God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work” (2 Co. 9:8). They came to experience the truth, “You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and... your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God” (9:11). Because their hearts had been changed by the grace of God, the Corinthians took the blessings they had been given by God and shared them.

As we prepare for a national day of Thanksgiving at the end of the month, as we count our blessings, do not forget the indescribable gift of Jesus. Remember also the gift which is ours by being a part of the communion of saints, the Holy Christian Church. As we see reflections of Christ in the generous and giving hearts of those around us, we have all the more reason to thank God for all of his gifts, even those that are beyond description. *With thanksgiving, Pastor Buchhorn*

# CHILDREN'S *Sunday School*

## Grades 2-3

A big hello from Tasha Forsyth and Chuck Potosnyak and all the students in the second and third grade classroom! The first few months of Sunday School classes have certainly gone quickly. We have been learning many things so far. Our lessons each week have been covering stories from Genesis. We have learned how God called Abraham from his home to a new home that He would show him. He promised Abraham that his offspring would be as many as the stars in the sky. We saw how Abraham obeyed and trusted in God, even when he was told to sacrifice his own son, Isaac. God never wanted him to sacrifice Isaac, only to test him. Abraham showed his great faith in the Lord, just as all of us should do each day. We learned about the twin brothers Esau and Jacob, and how Jacob tricked his father Isaac to bless him instead of Esau. Currently we are learning more about the story of Joseph, Jacob's favorite son, and how his brothers sold him into slavery. Despite that happening, Joseph also showed great faith in God. God helped deliver him and made him the second most important man in Egypt. All of these stories from Genesis have taught us that God can be trusted and never, ever, will leave us. With each of our lessons we have an activity, art project, or game. We like doing all of those things. One of our most fun games had to do with the story of Rebekah drawing water from a well. We did a water bucket relay. Two teams of players had to take a cup of water from one bucket to another bucket. Water was splashing everywhere! We also practice singing songs and also playing bells. We will be doing songs in church from time to time, so we hope you can see us perform. Each Sunday has been a great time to learn more about God and all He does for us.

## **Minutes of Special Called Voters Meeting**

October 8, 2023 @ 9:15am

The meeting was called to order by Congregation Chairman Craig Evans with 44 voters present. Pastor Buchhorn opened the meeting with a devotion, prayer and hymn.

A review of the candidate search process was given by Chuck Potosnyak. He described the process of communicating with the district office, searching a database of candidates, refining the list by a committee review of Commissioned Minister Information forms to gauge which candidates might be a good fit for our congregation, contacting potential candidates to ascertain their openness to considering a call and conducting online video interviews with several candidates.

Following that search process one candidate was recommended by the call committee for consideration by the Voters' assembly. Craig Evans then presented a brief biographical sketch of DCE Brian Pike presently serving at Grace Lutheran Church of Lafayette, Indiana.

The floor was opened for questions and comments following which a motion was made and seconded to extend a call to DCE Brian Pike to serve as the Parish Assistant of Grace Lutheran Church of Wayne, Nebraska at an initial salary of \$49, 674 per year plus benefits.

Ballots were distributed, marked, and counted. The votes counted 37-yes and 5-no. A motion was made and seconded to make the motion unanimous. The motion carried.

The call committee was thanked for their efforts in helping our congregation reach this point in the calling process.

A motion was made to adjourn the meeting. The motion carried. Pastor Buchhorn closed the meeting with prayer.

### **October 16, 2023**

Mission Council for Grace Lutheran Church met at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, October 16, 2023.

The following members were present: Craig Evans, Ron Sebade, Pastor Buchhorn, Doug Heithold, Lowell Johnson, Pam Janke, Diana Langemeier, Louise Green, and Michelle Ekberg

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Craig Evans.

Pastor Buchhorn led with an opening prayer and small devotion.

The minutes from the Mission Council meeting on September 11, 2023 were reviewed; motion to approve by Lowell; seconded Louise. Motion carried. Minutes from the special called voters' meeting was motioned to approve by Louise; seconded Pam. Motion carried.

#### **Treasury Report**

Louise Green presented the financial reports September 2023. Lowell motioned to approve; Dwight seconded. Motion carried.

**Elder's report** – Doug Heithold reported the Board of Elders met at 7:30 p.m. on September 26, 2023. Pastor Buchhorn opened the meeting with prayer. Official Acts included the marriage of Mathew Frevert and Eley Navrkal, officiated by Pastor Lilienkamp on September 9, 2023. Junior Confirmation classes are proceeding well with three students in the 8th grade and nine students in the 7th grade. Midweek classes and Sunday School are continuing successfully. Campus Student Ministry is hosting Sunday night dinners and future activities are being planned by the LSF leadership team. The Youth enjoyed a camping trip September 8th-9th at Camp Luther. A "Pumpkins and Hayride" get together took place at Doug and Lora Heithold's farm on October 7th and a Pack Away Hunger event is planned for Mercy Meals in Norfolk on October 14, 2023. District Circuit Meetings have resumed and a Circuit Forum was held September 24, 2023 at Grace. Pastor Lilienkamp has begun serving Grace in September. Salary proposals for the budgeting process were discussed and approved by the Elders. The proposed Advent Christmas Worship Schedule was approved. The first Midweek Advent service will begin on Wednesday December 6, 2023. Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year. There will be a Communion service at 8:00 a.m. and the Children's Program will take place at 10:30 a.m. that morning. A Candlelight Carol Service will be held at 8:00 p.m. that night. A Christmas Day

Service will be on Monday. New Year's Eve also falls on a Sunday. There will be Communion at both the 8:00 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. services. There will be no evening service. Pastor Buchhorn will be on vacation November 6- 18, 2023.

### **Committee Reports:**

**Call Committee-** A call has been issued to Brian Pike, DCE through a special voters' meeting. Mr. Pike has plans to come visit Wayne in person the weekend of October 28<sup>th</sup>.

**Trustee Report** – Roof leak from the bell tower into the sanctuary will require the lifting of the bell and replacement of the bell mount; recent rains have helped define where the leak is. Repairs in the lower-level bathroom ceiling along with repairs and wall touch ups in the Preschool Sunday School room are needing to be completed. Roof leak over the bell room in the front of the sanctuary from the heating vent pipe. The roofing company has been called to find a date to come fix a new leak that has developed from the roof valley above the sanctuary southwest door. A proposed resolution concerning cement work along main street in front of the preschool was considered and approved for action by the voters' meeting in November.

**Campus Ministry-** There have been 10-12 students attending Sunday night suppers. Dan and Bonnie Hansen had guest servers from Wakefield. It is still hoped to connect the new television to the existing building audio system.

**Auxiliary (Altar Guild/LWML): (Pam)** Ellen Heinemann reports for LWML that tied blankets have been completed and delivered. Mary reports that the Altar Guild will have packets to make Chrismons available soon. Please contact Karen Schardt or the church office. Their monthly meeting will be coming up soon with Pam Janke attending.

**Endowment-** The Endowment Committee met tonight to discuss recommendations for the distribution of \$40,401.57 from the endowment fund. These funds are a portion of those entrusted to the congregation from the Baker estate to be used toward mission outreach. It was recommended that for this year eight mission projects be funded in the amount of \$5,000 each. The recommended recipients are 1) Missionary Daniel Conrad for work in the Dominican Republic. 2) Seminary Riley Hvalac for tuition assistance 3) Jesus Our Savior Lutheran Preschool in Winnebago 4) Lutheran Hour Ministries 5) Mainstreet Living- television ministry out of Sioux City 6) Alaska Mission for Christ 7) Missionaries Rev. Brian/Deaconess Keah Prayne in Tanzania. 8) Siouxland Hispanic Ministry. A motion

to approve the list was made by Michelle; seconded by Ron. Motion approved.

**Memorial Fund-** Louise reports from KimBerly Hansen. Balance carried forward was \$2,448. 19. A deposit of \$385.00 was made increasing the monthly balance to \$2,833.19.

**Education (Sunday School, Midweek, VBS, Children Programming)**

– Diana reports that there is a Sunday School and Midweek Teacher’s meeting on October 23, 2023. Youth group students participated in Pumpkin carving/hayrack rides at Doug and Lora Heithold’s home. They will be looking forward to a Cornhole Tournament. Meal packing was at the Orphan Grain Train last Saturday for a couple of hours, thank you to all who helped. Aluminum cans are still being collected in the small white shed. November newsletter will have more details on Youth Ham Sale.

**Preschool-from Megan-** Tree replacement in the playground needs completed.

**Stewardship/Finance:** Mike has no new reports.

**Administrative Handbook:** Louise reported October items have been completed.

**Evangelism/Publicity/Community Engagement:** No new reports.

**Fellowship/Kitchen:** Ron reports from KimBerly. A bridal shower was held in the basement. The kitchen ladies assisted with two funerals that served 100. Meat and potatoes was served by Vel’s Bakery and the congregation was called for salads/desserts. The first meal for Advent will be Dec. 6<sup>th</sup>. Next year’s Senior Dinner’s date will be discussed and finalized. Three new 30 cup coffee makers were purchased to replace the old.

**Old Business:**

**District & Circuit Items-** District Fall Pastor’s conference held for October 9-10 in Columbus. Emphasis was on Spiritual Growth through Bible Study. Circuit Bible Institute is tentatively scheduled for Grace in late January or early February. The Concordia University President will be asked to come up from Seward to present if available.

Senior Dinner was held September 17, 2023 in the basement of Grace Lutheran Church, a thank you to all who assisted.

Nomination committee report and the Budget Committee Report were reviewed. Both were approved as presented for inclusion in the voters’ agenda.

Annual Voters' meeting will be held on November 19, 2023 at noon. A motioned was made by Louise; seconded by Diana to approve asking Vel's Catering to prepare the meal before the meeting. Motion carried. Mission Council will provide desserts for the meal. It was requested that photos of nominees be presented as a part of the election process.

### **New Business:**

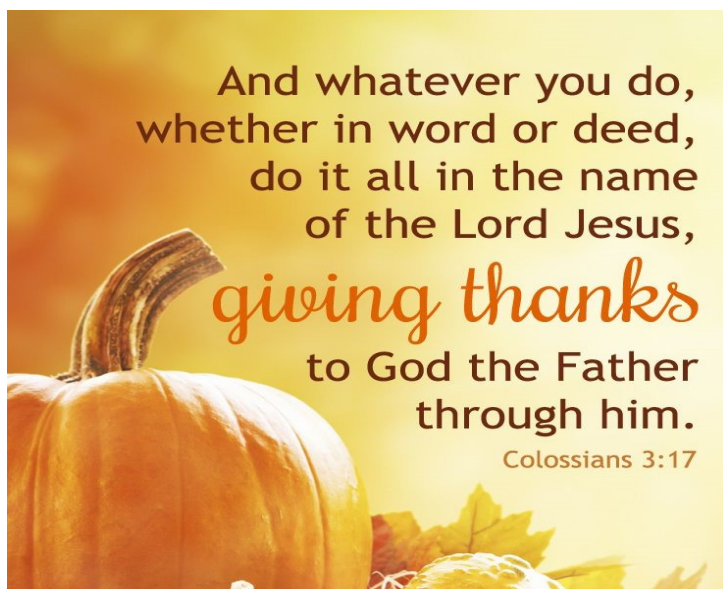
