THE BAPTISM OF OUR LORD

January 7, 2023

Lectionary Summary: "In the beginning, God created the heavens and the earth" (Gen. 1:1). Then, as "the Spirit of God was hovering over the face of the waters" (Gen. 1:2), God spoke His Word: "Let there be light,' and there was light" (Gen. 1:3). In the same way, "the beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ" (Mark 1:1) brings about the new creation through the waters of Baptism by the same Word and Spirit of God. When John the Baptist came, "proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins," Jesus also came "and was baptized by John in the Jordan" (Mark 1:4, 9). Although He had no sins of His own, He took His stand with sinners in His Baptism and took the sins and mortality of the world upon Himself. He was baptized into His own death, by which the heavens are opened and the Spirit is given to us. God the Father is well pleased with His beloved Son and raises Him from the dead. As we share His Baptism and are "united with him in a death like his" (Rom. 6:5), we also share His resurrection unto "newness of life" (Rom. 6:4).

CHILDREN'S SERMON NOTE: The Lutheran worship service begins with the Invocation, "In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." These words come from our Lord's institution of the sacrament of Baptism, Matthew 28:19, through which God brought each of us into his Holy Christian Church. The pastor makes the sign of the cross, likewise reminiscent of Baptism when we received the sign of the cross on our heads and hearts to mark us as redeemed children of God. (These same words are spoken many times in the life of the church, confession, confirmation, marriage, installations, and committals at the cemetery.) Additionally, when the pastor calls out, "In the name of the Father, and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit," it acts as a simple creed. We are confessing whom we believe the one true God is. We worship the Trinity and none other. When visitors come to the Divine Service, if they are paying attention, they will realize that the people they are with are worshipping the Triune God. We are clear right up front; in whose name we gather and who we are worshipping. Finally, in the Invocation, we are asking for and acknowledging God's presence in the service, "For where two or three come together in my name, there am I with them" Matthew 18:20.

CHECK IT OUT: Colleen Coble has written three books in the "Annie Peterson Novel" series: 1) Edge of Dusk", 2) Dark of Night", and 3) Break of Day". In book one nine-year-old Annie Pederson's life changed the night she and her sister were playing on the dock and her sister was kidnapped. Annie never forgave herself for her role in her sister's disappearance. Twenty-four years later and now a law enforcement ranger, Annie is still searching for answers as she grieves a new loss, the death of her husband and parents in a boating accident. In book two the kidnapped sister returns but is she truly the sister who disappeared? Her appearance throws Annie's life into an upheaval. In book three Annie's life, full of tragedy, seems to be headed in the right direction when a man escapes law enforcement custody and Sarah's safety is suddenly in question. When she discovers the terrible truth about the men who are stalking her, she realizes that she is in for the fight of her life if she's going to redeem the sister she once lost, build the family she dreams of, and keep all those she loves safe. The reader will fast turn the pages to see what happens next. FIC/COB
