Welcome: We are glad that you are here or are watching our worship service online. May you be blessed through this time of worship. We pray you find today's service a source of encouragement and strength. Offerings are received at the door as you enter or leave. Please take a moment to complete an attendance registration slip found in the pew rack and return it to the offering plates also.

The Lord's Supper: As we come to the Lord's Supper we both receive and proclaim. We receive into our mouths not only bread and wine but the very body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ to eat and to drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with him and with one another. Through our participation in this Holy Meal we proclaim his death until He comes. By our participation in the sacrament at this congregation which is a member of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod, we are indicating our agreement with the confession of the LCMS. We request that only those who share this confession and are instructed in the sacrament take part today. For those desiring to receive the sacrament using the common cup (large chalice), it is offered at the 8:00 a.m. service in addition to the individual cups. Those with special dietary needs such as gluten free or alcohol free are encouraged to speak with the pastor.

Lectionary Summary: The Lord Jesus calls Philip and Nathanael to "come and see" that He is "the Son of God" and "the King of Israel" (John 1:43–49). And they shall see even "greater things than these" (John 1:50). For His body is the temple of God on earth, and by His priestly sacrifice the heavens will be opened to all who believe and are baptized into Him. Therefore, He calls Philip and Nathanael, first to hear His Word and then to speak as apostles, even as He once called Samuel and established him "as a prophet of the LORD" (1 Sam. 3:20). As the Lord was with Samuel "and let none of his words fall to the ground" (1 Sam. 3:19), He also accompanies and upholds the preachers of His Word in our day. Thus, by the Gospel that is preached to you, "your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you" (1 Cor. 6:19). Since your body thus belongs to the Body of Christ, is meant "for the Lord" and shall be raised up like Him, now "glorify God in your body" (1 Cor. 6:13–20).

She struggles with his lack of faith in God and his drinking problem but maybe her friendship can save him. The power of addiction drives this story of three lives. "Red Rose Bouquet" finds Cheryl struggling because some things just can't be forgiven. Brock learns that falling in love with a woman who keeps secrets is dangerous all on its own. "Finding Evergreen" is about Ethan and Brandi wrapped in a story where he thought he found the thrill of his life and she, the romance she hadn't dared hope for. Falling in love had been easy but married—totally different story. FIC/ROD

CHILDREN'S SERMON NOTE: The Confession and Absolution (from the Latin word meaning "to absolve" - to grant forgiveness) keeps us honest - honest with ourselves, honest with fellow brothers and sisters in Christ, and especially honest with God. God's Word teaches that we are sinful, therefore, we confess that "we are by nature sinful and unclean," thus completely deserving God's "present and eternal punishment." The Confession of sins is the acknowledgement that God's Law is true and right, and that when we measure ourselves against its demands, we come up short as Romans 3:10 says, "No one is righteous, no not one" (see also Romans 7:8-25, Psalm 51). After confession, the pastor speaks God's Word of forgiveness to the congregation, the word of absolution is a reminder of the gift of Holy Baptism "in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." In John 20:21, the risen Lord Jesus promised His disciples, "If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven." With this proclamation of Good News, the congregation again responds with a resounding "Amen!"
