"Remember your leaders, those who spoke to you the word of God.

Consider the outcome of their way of life, and imitate their
faith." (Hebrews 13:7)

Somewhere, I remember reading an old quote which said, "Anyone can count the seeds in an apple, but only God can count the number of apples in a seed." It was a simple but eloquent way of declaring that it is impossible for us to know the full impact of things we see, say and do. Each seed of an apple holds within it life which in the right surroundings can grow into a tree. A single tree if it reaches maturity can produce more apples. Over its productive lifetime a healthy tree can produce thousands of apples which in turn would cumulatively contain tens of thousands of new seeds. Certainly, most seeds never make it that far, but the ones that do should lead us to marvel.

I got to thinking about this reflecting on the life of our beloved pastor emeritus Carl Lilienkamp taken from us so suddenly through death. If you scoured enough church record books and old bulletins, you could probably count up the number of baptisms he performed, the confirmations he officiated, the sermons he preached. Each sharing of the word was like a seed being planted. At the service held in honor, I heard a number of stories about his work. I got a glimpse into some of the fruitful trees those seeds had grown to be. But even that was but a glimpse. For him and for each of us we will not know the full significance of our lives until God shows it to us in eternity. We have to wonder if his parents realized how they would impact future generations in Nebraska and Alaska through their son.

I think about that in terms of the work we still carry on together. We can count the seeds. We can easily enough count the number of dollars given for ministry, we can count the number of people baptized or

confirmed. The numbers in Sunday School classes or worship. But what we cannot fully know this side of heaven is what this work will grow into. Which of those children baptized or instructed will be used by God to bring others to the Savior? Which of them will grow up to be that church worker who touches countless more lives? How many lives will be blessed for all eternity by the ministry our offering funded? What good will someone instructed by God's Word do to make the world better? What sin leading to pain and heartache for someone else will be resisted, avoided or overcome? We can't know the answer for sure. We can't look into the future.

We can trace back the way that the seeds planted in the past have been a blessing to us. It began with Jesus who said concerning himself in John 12: Truly, truly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. Jesus like the grain of wheat lived, died and was buried. But Jesus also rose from the dead as the first-fruits of them that have fallen asleep. Jesus brought life to his apostles, the apostles went into all the world to make more disciples and share that life. Generation to generation the faith was passed on, the seed was planted in new places. The life Jesus won was spread.

In time that precious gift was shared with us. We are part of the church, because someone in an earlier time spread the seeds of life. They made an investment in baptizing and teaching. One day in heaven we will see how the seeds of life planted during our lifetime grew and flourished. Until that blessed day when we are in heaven, we realize that now is our time to bear fruit for God.

As we await the day when the complete impact of the work we have done will be seen, may we hold fast to his promise. "Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain" 1 Cor. 15:58.

Just as God alone knows the potential of an apple seed, He alone also knows the full potential of our acts of service. So may we abound in such acts and trust God to bring them to their fruitful conclusion.

Lenten Questions: The theme of our midweek Lenten worship services for this year will be questions asked by Jesus and others in the hours leading up to his crucifixion. As we consider the story of Jesus' suffering these questions can help us to examine our own connection to Jesus, His suffering, and the amazing love of God. We will begin on Ash Wednesday, Feb 14 with the question Jesus asked of his disciples in the Garden of Gethsemane "Are you sleeping?" In the weeks following we plan to take up questions such as: "Are you betraying the Son of Man with a kiss?" "What is your verdict?" "Are you one of this man's disciples?" "What did you do?" "Which of the two do you want me to release to you?" And finally, "My God why have you forsaken me?" May God bless our Lenten journey as we grow nearer to Jesus in anticipation of the question of the angels, "Why do you seek the living among the dead?"

The Season of Lent: Ash Wednesday, February 14, begins the season of Lent. Lent is a 40 day season of prayerful and penitential reflection. Our attention is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. From ancient times the season of Lent has been kept as a time of special devotion, self-denial, and humble repentance born of a faithful heart that dwells confidently on His Word and draws from it life and hope. We pray that our dear Father in heaven might richly bless this Lenten season for us so that we may come to Easter with glad hearts. We will observe Ash Wednesday with both morning and evening worship services with communion. The services will be at 9:00 a.m. and 6:15 p.m. Note that due to the penitential nature of the day there will be no Lenten Supper on Ash Wednesday. These will begin February 21.

Lenten Suppers: Beginning February 21 a light fellowship meal will be served beginning at 5:15 p.m. each Wednesday in Lent. Groups or individuals who would like to sponsor one of these meals are encouraged to contact the church office.

Imposition of Ashes: On Ash Wednesday, February 14 there will be the opportunity for the optional imposition of ashes. In the Bible following his sin Adam was told "for dust you are and to dust you will return." Dust or ashes became a symbol of mortality and death. In the Old Testament, being covered in ashes and wearing sackcloth was an outward sign that a person was in mourning. In the Christian church it became a custom to observe the beginning of the season of Lent with penitents being marked by ashes. It is from this custom we get the name "Ash Wednesday." Those desiring to be marked by ashes as a part of your Ash Wednesday worship are invited to come to the Altar area for the imposition of ashes prior to the beginning of Ash Wednesday services or after the conclusion of the service.

Women's Bible Study for February is scheduled for Sunday, February 11th @ 5:30pm in the church basement. This month as we dive into a short devotional: we plan to do a soup swap. How does this work? There are plastic containers and Ziplock bags in the front of the church to fill up with soup options. How many soup options are up to you. We just ask that you bring a sample of soup to share as well as the recipe to our Bible Study. Then we will swap away. It time allows, we will also plan to make our candles and soap. As always, bringing items is optional. This is open to all ladies and friends are always welcome. *Reminder;* this is a low key group so if you are unable to make it every time that's okay you are always welcome to come when it works in your schedule. SECRETARY REPORT

Elder's Report: The Board of Elders met at 7:30 p.m. on January 3, 2024. Pastor Buchhorn opened the meeting with prayer and we continued with the study of the Seventh Commandment in Luther's Large Catechism. There were no Official Acts or Membership Transactions to report. Junior Confirmation and Midweek classes are continuing successfully. The Sunday School Christmas Program was very well received. Thank you to all the students and teachers for their efforts. Thank you also to Symphony Jareske for her service as program director. There will be a one-day Easter VBS on March 23, 2024. It will be called "Journey to Easter" and will highlight the events of Jesus during Holy Week. Preparations are underway. A new meal schedule has been posted for anyone wishing to provide a meal to college students on Sunday evenings at Cup of Grace. The Youth enjoyed a successful ham sale and their January events are in the planning stage. A Circuit Meeting was held at Grace on January 2, 2024, and a Circuit Bible Institute is planned for January 28, 2024 from 2-4:00 p.m. at Grace. Pastor Russ Sommerfeld from Concordia University will be presenting. The Advent/Christmas Worship Schedule was discussed and reviewed. Christmas will be on a Wednesday in 2024. Pastor Lilienkamp will be conducting the Midweek series for Lent. Ash Wednesday is on

February 14, 2024, with two services being offered at 9:00 a.m. and 6:15 p.m. There will be an optional imposition of ashes at each service. There will be five Midweek Lenten services following Ash Wednesday, starting at 6:15 p.m. A Lenten meal will be offered before each service. Palm Sunday is on March 24, 2024. On that day there will be a Communion service at 8:00 a.m. and the Rite of Confirmation will take place in the 10:30 a.m. service. There will be no communion in that service. Maundy Thursday is March 28, 2024. It will be at 7:00 p.m. and communion will be offered. There will be two Good Friday services on March 29 at 9:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. On Easter Sunday there will be 7:00 a.m. Sunrise Service with communion followed by an 8:00 a.m. breakfast sponsored by the youth. A 10:30 a.m. Festival Worship Service will be held with communion. The bulk mailing of the newsletter was discussed in light of USPS price and process changes. It was decided sending the newsletter is still a valid way to reach and make contact with our members and that we will be continuing to send it at this time. Pastor Buchhorn will be on vacation January 29-February 5, 2024.

2024 Mission recipients for the Congregation Direct Mission Support budget line was discussed. A motion was made to support Jesus our Savior Lutheran Preschool in Winnebago, Alaska Mission for Christ, and the Wayne Circuit in the amount of \$1,200 each by Michelle; seconded by Nick. Motion carried.. The remaining \$1,2000 of the direct mission support budget was not allocated at this time. Previously Siouxland Hispanic Ministry was supported. Since it is still without a full time pastor it was decided to wait until their needs become clearer before designating a fourth mission fund recipient. This will be considered mid-year

Meeting was adjourned and followed by the Lord's Prayer.

Call Committee Update

Following the direction of our voters' assembly our call committee has been working to fill our associate pastor vacancy by going through the process reguired to call a candidate for ordination from one of our seminaries. These seminarians are presently completing their training and will be assigned calls in late April and graduate in mid-May. Unlike calling a pastor presently serving another congregation, seminarians are matched with calling congregations through a cooperative effort of the seminary placement departments and the district presidents. During the month of January our call committee was able to conduct interviews with four possible candidates for our associate pastor position to evaluate whether it was believed that they would be a good fit for our setting. It was concluded that any of the candidates we interviewed would be acceptable. Presently there are more requests for pastors from the seminary than pastors available to fill those positions. We hope to learn in February whether our congregation is likely to receive a candidate from this spring's graduating class. We ask you to continue to pray that God would guide this selection process and bless our congregation with a new associate pastor to serve our congregation and community.


