

ADULT FORUM:

Harold McCue continues to lead our Adult Forum in the fellowship hall which is using the video series "The Gospel according to Mark" by Alistair Begg. Rev. Begg is the senior pastor of Cleveland's Parkside Church. He is the voice behind the Truth For Life Christian radio preaching and teaching ministry, which broadcasts his sermons daily to stations across the USA.

This course is at the "halfway" point having reached chapter 8 of Mark's 16 chapter Gospel. Mark's Gospel emphasizes the certainty that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and the fulfillment of God's purpose. As Rev. Begg takes us through this gospel, we discover that Jesus deals with a common theme – sin. Whether we are indifferent towards sin or think that our goodness neutralizes our sin, every person must realize that we are lost apart from the forgiveness available in Christ. We are reminded that Christ's arrival onto the stage of human history was a redemptive event that was ordained by God.

In a time of stress and strain, such as the current global Coronavirus pandemic, its helpful to gather (with appropriate space) to be fed by God's reassuring word of hope and peace as found in Mark's gospel.

ADULT FORUM:

Chuck McCabe continues to led the "Charlie's Angels" Bible Study class which meets in our Chapel room off of the Fellowship Hall during the Sunday morning 9:15 am to 10:15 am Sunday School hour. Each week Chuck dives deep into interesting topics of Bible Study. Most recently has been an in depth look at John 3:16. It might be the "gospel in miniature" but this little verse's impact is Gigantic!

Rally Day attendance was the lowest in years but thankfully we bounced back on the following Sundays of Sept. with anywhere from 4 to 8 in the elementary ages.


