

Families First Scavenger Hunt

An important announcement from young leader Natalie Schepisi:

Turkeys have gotten into Grove! Families First needs your help "hunting" them! Thankfully, they have left behind some clues.

How well do you know your church? Your hymns? Your Bible? Working individually or as a team, use the following clues to find each turkey. Once you find the turkey, write down the letter on its back next to its corresponding clue to spell out a special message from us to you!
1. This tricky turkey is the hardest to find and will gobble up your time with a hidden clue: between being a wretch and being blind, your hint sits in verse 1 of UMH #378: and if you rifle around along the way: perhaps discover another missed thing or two.
2. It's no secret that this small, quiet place allows for silent reflection: perhaps on the meaning of John 1:32, not a turkey coming down from heaven.
3. This turkey found fellowship at the cross, remembering what was spoken to Zaccheus. Need a hint: read Luke 19:4-5 and ponder the words of Jesus.
4. This turkey lies right in Luke 2:12.
5. This turkey is backed by Acts 22:16, a sacrament based in the scripture.
6. This turkey stands at the door but will not knock until you rehearse Psalms 96:1.
7. May this clue illuminate Luke 22:19 and give the turkey sanctuary.
8. We pray that this turkey stands beside a symbol of Psalms 33:12, not Deuteronomy 32:28.
9. Neither the turkey nor its clue is in the Bible, yet we celebrate his spirit of generosity by merrily receiving this jolly old soul in a room that holds his festive chair.
10. If you can't find this clue in Ezra 6:1, look closer! Around the globe, our collected words continue to remind us of Deuteronomy 10:19.
11. In fellowship, read the clue found in Matthew 19:14, and do not table its lesson or upstage it! Keep it keyed in your heart.
12. Matthew 6:21 may put you close to this turkey, but in case of Proverbs 6:27, it's best to Act out the doors 2 by 2, or else be sent to heaven.
BONUS: Write down what the message means to you and drop it in the "turkey bucket" before you leave church.
