

Due to the most recent guidelines from the CDC and the State of Wisconsin limiting assemblies to 10 or less people in order to stem the spread of the coronavirus (COVID 19), we will be cancelling public worship services at Good Shepherd until further notice.

Why?

As Christians we remember the words of the 4th Commandment where God tells us to honor those in governing positions. Even when we might disagree with government actions or decisions, we respect and obey them out of love for God who established government (Romans 13) for the benefit of society. As Christians we also recall the words of the 5th Commandment and remember our desire to care for not only our own health, but the health and lives of those in our congregation and community. Therefore, it seemed wise and loving for us to cancel public worship services at this point.

For how long?

We are purposefully not putting a date on resuming worship because the situation is constantly changing. Our prayer is that the spread of this virus is halted quickly and that we can return to public worship soon. We will resume worship as soon as we can safely and legally do so.

Now what?

Public worship is one of the primary ways that Christians connect with one another and to their Savior through his Word and Sacraments. While we may not be able to physically gather with one another we can stay connected! Here are some ways we plan to do that:
