We're pretty good at complaining probably because we've had so much practice at it! The Israelites were good at complaining. How did the Lord answer their complaints as they made their way to the Promised Land of Canaan? Let's see!

Read & Review

Read Exodus 16:1-8

1. What were the Israelites grumbling and complaining about?

- 2. He would give them bread from heaven each morning.
- 3. God! Were not trusting that the Lord would take care of them as he had promised.

2. What did Moses say the Lord was going to do for the Israelites?

3. Look at verse 8. While the Israelites were voicing their complaints to Moses, who were they actually complaining about?

Read Exodus 16:9-18

4. In addition to the bread from heaven, what did God also give to the Israelites to eat that evening?



- 5. Why was this bread called "manna?"
- 6. How much manna/bread were the Israelites to gather each day?

Read Exodus 16:19-30

- 7. What were the Israelites NOT to do with the manna/bread?
- 8. Although God's directions were clear, what did some of the Israelites do? Why do you think they did that?
- 9. What was the one exception to God's rules about only gathering as much manna/bread for one day?

Read Exodus 16:31-35

- 10. What did the manna/bread taste like?
- 11. For how long did God provide manna/bread for his people each morning?

Answers

- 4. Quail
- 5. "manna" means "what is it?" they Israelites did not know what the bread was when it first appeared on the ground.
- **6**. As much as they could eat. Generally it was an omer per person.
- Not keep it overnight.Only enough for that one day.
- 8. They gathered more than they could eat that day and kept some overnight for the next day. They were probably worried that there might not be any manna/bread the next morning.
- 9. The day before the Sabbath Day (Saturday) they were to gather twice as much so they'd have enough for the Sabbath, the day that they were to go to church and not do any work.

- 10. Flat bread wafers with honey
- 11. 40 years until they reached the Promised Land of Canaan
