Read & Review Read Exodus 19:1-8
1. Where did the Israelites stop at the 3-month mark of their journey to the Promised Land?
2. What exciting news did the Lord send Moses to deliver to the Israelites?
3. How did God's people respond to this exciting news?
Read Exodus 19:9-23
5. Let's go back to how the Lord told the people to prepare for the Lord's arrival at Mount Sinai. What were the Israelites to do and not do?
6. Why did God want barriers placed between himself and the people with the penalty of death for those who crossed that barrier?
7. What would you have seen, felt, smelled, and heard if standing there at Mount Sinai?

Read Exodus 20:18-21

8. Why did God show himself in this way as he revealed in spoken and written form his will for his people?

Read Exodus 20:1-17

- 9. Later in Exodus 34, these commandments will be referred to as "The Ten Commandments." However, what is missing from these Ten Commandments?
- 10. We see that the first three Commandments describe our relationship with God, and Commandments 4-10 describe our relationship with our neighbor. Why do you think that God ordered the Commandments as he did and placed emphasis and explanation where he did?
