Pastor's Letter:

DECEMBER 2023

Dear House of Hope,

In December, as the world around us turns to the holiday hubbub, to lights and shopping, decorating, and baking, the church turns to a short season of the year called Advent. Advent is a time of preparation and excitement, yes, but also acknowledges the hardship of the world as we wait and hopes for a new kingdom to be born among us. Advent holds space for anger and mourning, for noticing the ways that the world is not as it should be. And, Advent points us to quiet, to prayer, to pause. In the midst of the darkening days and growing winter, Advent offers us the reminder of glowing candles and deep breaths. I find, amidst the busyness of Christmas preparation, that the space of Advent is just what I need.

A beloved Advent hymn is Come, Thou Long-Expected Jesus (ELW 254), which begins like this:

Come, thou long expected Jesus, born to set thy people free; From our fears and sins release us; let us find our rest in thee. Israel's strength and consolation, hope of all the earth thou art, Dear desire of every nation, joy of every longing heart.

The holidays can bring out the longing of our hearts- for a world of peace and justice, for a time with friends or family in the past, for a break from the chaos, for the true joy we hope for at Christmas. Advent is a time where we as Christians notice our longing, our fears, our worries. Advent is a time where we see the world as it is and know that God promises to be present among us even as we wait and hope for a new kingdom.

So, take the invitation of Advent this year. Light a candle. Take a deep breath. Notice your feelings, notice your neighbor, notice God beside you. Find your rest in the Spirit, hang your hope on Jesus soon to be born into our world, and know that God is with you in expectation and in joy. Always.

And, as we hold the anticipation and patience of Advent, we remember the words of the angels to the lowly shepherds on that cold Bethlehem Christmas Eve so long ago:

"Do not be afraid, for see, I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord."

(Luke 2:10-11)

May Jesus be born in our hearts and our world again today.

Every other Tuesday I volunteer at our Respite group. As caretakers (usually spouses) meet together with our parish nurse to find answers, we volunteers interact with our clients. We visit a lot as we have lunch together, do coffee time, and work at craft projects. Hearing our clients stories helps us to know them and enables us to encourage them. Stewardship Corner



First, thank you to all who filled out and returned pledge cards for 2024! As of November 30, 2023, we have pledged a total of \$252,800 for the 2024 budget. We have also received pledges of \$239,835 for the **Stories of Hope** Capital Campaign.

Clearly, the Holy Spirit is at work at House of Hope when we receive pledges totaling \$492,635 since November 30, 2023!! We are all so grateful for everyone's generosity. As we celebrate House of Hope's successes, please note that the budget for 2023 is \$383,083 and our pledges for the 2024 annual budget are substantially lower than that amount.

There are approximately 125 giving units (couples or single persons) at House of Hope. A total of 56 giving units have completed pledge cards so far this year. For those 69 giving units that have not completed a pledge card for 2024, it is not too late! Pledge cards are available in the church office.

The Stewardship Ministry Team and the *Stories of Hope* Campaign Committee want to express their gratitude to everyone for participating in this year's stewardship program and capital campaign. There are also a few specific shout-outs that need to be made. Thank you, George Zirbes and Peggy Anderson for the fabulous brunch. It was a wonderful time of fellowship with delicious food. Thank you too to playwright and actor Mark Jensen and actors Randy Wangen and Sam Wangen for the skit "The Playoff Game." Your performance was great, and you taught us an important lesson about hope. To those who helped prepare mailings, decorate Fellowship Hall, serve beverages, and/or clean up, thank you as well.

STEWARDSHIP OF HOPE

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord, make straight in the desert a highway for our God." Isaiah 40:3

As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness; 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight'". Mark 1:2-3

Our readings for the season of Advent give us more **Stories of Hope**.

The First Reading for the second Sunday in Advent this year is Isaiah 40:1-11. The first 39 chapters of Isaiah predict God's judgment on Israel for their trust in foreign powers, worship of idols, and neglect of the needs of the poor. That judgment came when Nebuchadnezzar conquered and destroyed Jerusalem and took many of the people of Judah into captivity in Babylon. The emphasis of the rest of Isaiah, however, is **hope**. God gave the people of Judah **hope** by promising them that he was coming to release them, which happened when Cyrus the Persian captured Babylon.

That same Sunday's Gospel Reading is Mark 1:1-8. In this reading, the "voice in the wilderness" points to the work of John the Baptist, preparing the way for Jesus just as the people of Isaiah's day were to prepare for the coming of God. John the Baptist gave his followers and us **hope** when he said that Jesus will baptize his followers and us with the Holy Spirit. In Martin Luther's Small Catechism, Luther says that Baptism "is a grace-filled water of life and a 'bath of the new birth in the Holy Spirit' as St. Paul says to Titus in chapter 3, 'through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the **hope** of eternal life." Titus 3:5b-7


