Dear House of Hope,

Each year on Ash Wednesday, we remember our mortality as we hear the words "Remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return." We remember our belovedness in Christ that promises to hold us in death and everlasting life as ashes are marked on our foreheads in the shape of a cross. We remember our creation in God and the promise of God to walk with us in life.

As we begin the Holy Season of Lent, we look for ways to align our life more closely with God's through prayer, generosity of giving, self-examination and repentance, and works of love. This year, we think especially of the ways that our love in God allows us to love others more fully since Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day, February 14th.

1 Corinthians 13 reads, "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable; it keeps no record of wrongs; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends."

Certainly, we can read this as a description of God's great love for us and all creation, shown most fully in the cross and resurrection of Christ. In Lent, we might add in practices that help us to notice God's love for us more fully. We might take a break from things that tend to take our attention away from God's love for us. We also attempt to shift our love for those around us to this ideal love described in First Corinthians.

No matter how we mark this holy season, we know that as we walk with Christ to and through the cross, Christ walks with us every day of our lives.

Stewardship Corner:

Stewardship of God's Story

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they [Mary and Joseph] brought him [Jesus] up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. Luke 2:22

In the Christian church, Sunday is the basic festival, the weekly festival of the resurrection of Jesus. In the ELCA, we also celebrate principal festivals such as Ash Wednesday, Easter, and Pentecost. We also have "lesser festivals" which celebrate, among other things, events in the life of Christ. On February 2, the lesser festival of The Presentation of Our Lord is observed. The Biblical reference for this lesser festival is in Luke 2:22-40. The law of Moses states that each first-born baby boy belongs to the Lord. So, 40 days after Jesus' birth, Mary and Joseph took Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem and presented him to the Lord.

At this time, there was a man named Simeon in Jerusalem. The Holy Spirit had told him that he would not die before he had seen the Messiah. The Spirit guided Simeon to the temple the day that Jesus was presented to the Lord. "Simeon took him [Jesus] in his arms and praised God, saying, "Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel." Luke 2:28-32. Simeon is declaring what God has done and is testifying to this.

There was also a prophet named Anna in the temple that day. "She never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day. At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem." Luke 2:37b-38. Anna also declares what God is doing. She shares the news and tells the story.

How are we stewarding God's story? We might share some about what we have seen God doing in our lives or in the life of House of Hope. We could share how God is showing up yet again in unexpected ways. We are all a part of God's ongoing story and God has entrusted it to us to share. May we be as joyful and grateful as Simeon and Anna are in sharing this good news.

This hymn text was written by the American author Mary Louise Bringel (b. 1953). The text is paired with the delightful Welsh tune Suo Gan. The title Suo Gan means, simply, Lullaby and its original Welsh text is a lullaby. This was the song sung during the opening scenes of the movie Empire of the Sun (1987). Since then this gentle tune has been paired with several hymn texts.
