Pastor's Letter:

Dear House of Hope,

On Valentine's Day, we began our journey of Lent with a reading from the book of Acts and the reminder that Jesus calls us saying, "you will be my witnesses...to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). In the season of Lent, especially, we are tasked with witnessing to God, that is, noticing the ways that God is present in our lives, in our neighbors, and in our world.

To aid us in these witnesses, we mark this season of Lent. Perhaps in this season of Lent, you have taken on a practice: reading the Bible daily or a new prayer walk or writing a card to a loved one- to notice, to witness where God is present that you maybe haven't spent time looking for before. Perhaps in this Lent, you've given something up- taking out chocolate or Facebook or meat on Fridays- to notice, to witness to the ways God shows up to fill the gaps. We, as a church, have taken on the practice of meeting additionally each Wednesday to eat together and worship, to witness to one another and to the ways that God is working here at House of Hope. (If you haven't joined us yet, why not try this Wednesday?)

Whether or not you've taken on a new practice this Lent, we are all invited to witness to God in this time and place. What is God doing in you? What is God doing in those around you? How is God active in our community?

As we notice God's work in us and around us, we remember the journey that Jesus took to the cross, through death, and into resurrection. At the end of March, we'll remember Jesus' last supper on Maundy Thursday, his trial and crucifixion on Good Friday, and his triumphant defeat of death in resurrection on Easter Sunday. As we walk this journey alongside Jesus through our Bible readings, you, too, are invited to notice the ways that Jesus walks with you in your life- in seasons of death and in invitations to new life. We know that our death and resurrection are tied to Jesus' and we give thanks for the grace filled love of God that accompanies us on our journey.

Blessings on your Lent and hope to see you in the celebration of Easter at the end of the month!



Stewardship Corner:

Stewardship of Encouragement

And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds" Hebrews 10:24

Proverbs 27:17 teaches that "Iron sharpens iron, and one person sharpens the wits of another." As believers meet in fellowship, we are meant to encourage and sharpen the wits of one another. (Usually the word "provoke" is used in a negative sense, but in Hebrews 10:24 it is used positively, as encouragement, stirring up, and prodding and pushing.) There are lots of instances of encouragement to love and to do good deeds at House of Hope. We invite others to Quilting, Every Meal, Respite, and a host of other activities to help our neighbors. We ask House of Hopers to pray for those on the prayer list and we welcome members to Racial Justice meetings and Bible studies to learn how to better love our neighbors.

We are pretty good at provoking each other to get involved in acts of love and good deeds. One important act of love that we don't often encourage each other about is giving. Yes, we have our fall Stewardship Program where we urge the entire congregation to increase their giving and we regularly ask the congregation to give to specific causes. But how often do we have conversations in which we talk about our own giving or encourage a fellow member about their giving? We are quite uncomfortable having these discussions.

That's okay. In our culture, we share personal financial information with very few people. Also, note Matthew 6:2, which states, "So whenever you give alms, do not sound a trumpet before you, as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, so that they may be praised by others. Truly I tell you, they have received their reward." So we should be careful to avoid pride. But Jesus also said, "..., let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:16.

As you are all aware, we have a shortfall in our budget this year that needs to be made up during 2024. This is an opportunity for anyone (and everyone) at House of Hope "to provoke one another to love and good deeds" by telling your story about how you (and your family) have helped or will be helping to make up the shortfall. We are looking for volunteers to do a short talk during worship describing their plan for extra giving to House of Hope this year. There is no need to discuss amounts, only ideas. For example, Paul Hansen described at the February Ministry Teams meeting that his family is going to cut back on trips to Starbucks and use the saved money toward the shortfall.

So let your light shine and give glory to your Father in heaven by encouraging us House of Hopers to consider your idea for freeing up some of your money to give to House of Hope this year to cover the shortfall.

Hoċokata Ti tour scheduled for April 6

The Racial Justice teams of House of Hope and Valley of Peace have scheduled a field trip to Mdewakanton: Dwellers of Spirit Lake on Saturday, April 6, at 10:30 a.m. The 3,805-square-foot exhibit is a historical timeline shared through the eyes of the Mdewakanton Dakota people via storytelling, artifacts, and historical artifacts shared to enhance visitors' knowledge and understanding of Minnesota history and Native American culture.

The exhibit is at Hoċokata Ti (ho-cho-ka-tah-tee), the Shakopee Mdewakanton Sioux Community's cultural central and gathering space that is used to interpret and encourage traditional Mdewakanton Dakota cultural heritage, language, and history.

The one-hour tour can accommodate up to 75 people. The cost is: General 18+ - \$8.00, Child 5 and Under - FREE, Student K-12, post-secondary, or homeschool groups - \$5.00, Seniors Ages 65+ - \$5.00. Admission fee can be paid upon arrival. Free wheelchairs are provided upon request.

He was treated immediately for the condition and will need to be monitored. Currently, it is every 6 months.
