Making peace by the blood of his cross — Colossians 1:15-20

Grace, peace, and mercy to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!,

Five hundred years ago the Western world was in Renaissance. Writers, painters, sculptors, musicians, and more were rediscovering the old masters. Their battle cry was "Back to the sources!" They felt like travelers moving upstream to the spring itself finding how pure the water was at the source. They cast off years of encrusted tradition to work in the spirit of the first artistic stirrings they could find.

A man named Erasmus of Rotterdam brought that spirit to religion. He published the first Greek New Testament in use for a very long time. For years, church teachers had been working with a Latin translation made centuries before. They discovered, among many other things, that where the Latin said, "Do penance," the Greek said, "repent." That Latin translation laid the first layer of tradition that had people saying 20 Hail Marys where the Greek demanded a change of mind, attitude, and heart.

"Back to the sources" for Erasmus and his religious Renaissance school meant getting a purer New Testament Christianity. They hoped to see a reformation in the church that swept away the corruptions of the church.

When Luther started his work as a professor, people thought he and Erasmus would be Renaissance allies. But Luther began to speak of a righteousness of faith in Christ apart from works of the law. That's a righteousness that follows Biblical repentance rather than traditional penance. But Erasmus balked. He urged the church to reform in morals only, not in doctrine.

Luther came to realize that division was impossible. The church's corruption in morals was the fruit of its corruption in teaching. You couldn't sweep away the indulgence sellers without addressing the idea that salvation could be bought and sold in the first place.

When we read the warnings of the New Testament, especially the book of 2 Peter, we see that Jesus and His apostles believe bad fruit came from a diseased tree (Matthew 7:15-19). You don't heal the tree by removing the bad fruit. 2 Peter teaches us to recognize false teaching by the corruption attending the false teachers themselves.

What does Peter urge us to do knowing false teachers will come among us? "We have something more sure, the prophetic word, to which you will do well to pay attention as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts" (2 Peter 1:19). Peter sends us back to the source, to God's Word.

It's that pure teaching that is living water to heal our roots, strengthen our core, enliven our branches, and sweeten fruits of mercy.

If you are looking for strength and new growth in your own life, you can look at Christians around you and at the examples of history. More than that, you can follow the stream back to Jesus Himself, the author and perfecter of our faith. He truly does make all things new!

Can bishops and popes help shepherd a church or are they institutionally part of the problem? In all this discussion, we'll center in on Jesus, who sent His disciples out to preach without wallet or staff, reliant completely on the power of His Word. Join us Thursday, October 18, at 7pm.






