Making peace by the blood of his cross — Colossians 1:15-20

Grace, peace, and mercy to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

"Turned in on yourself": This phrase describes sinful self-destruction to a "T." Luther rediscovered the concept in the writings of a fourth-century African bishop named Augustine. How frightening that this self-ish turn proves universal, whether in the waning days of the Roman Empire, the first breaths of the Renaissance, or carried along the torrent of the information age!

No matter the continent or level of technology, human beings turn away from the wider world to their lonely individual being. The fearfulness of hoarding replaces the joy of sharing. The anxiety of defensiveness pushes aside the freedom of grace. Even God we try to transform into a means to an end, a vending machine of cheap grace, rather than Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

The world recommends this time of year for New Year's resolutions. We look at ourselves and decide in which way we think we can self-improve. There's certainly a time for self-reflection, confession, and absolution.

There's also a time to set your own self aside, to break the inward curve and look outside. What is God doing among my brothers and sisters? His mercies are new every morning!

Our congregation has concerns of our own, repairs and aspirations. God has always provided for us. There will be times this year to focus on those items. To start the year, we want to look outside and see how we can join His work around us.

Our bake sale fundraiser on January 20 is going toward hurricane relief and mission work in sister congregations, specifically toward roofs for Lutheran churches in Puerto Rico. Over these first weeks of the New Year, we'll get you information about what is going on. I think you will be inspired.

Everywhere, God's amazing grace is in action. As Luther taught us in the Small Catechism, "The kingdom of God certainly comes by itself without our prayer, but we pray in this petition that it may come to us also." When Jesus breaks our inward curve, we don't just see the kingdom coming. We are joined to the kingdom coming.

There are so many other movements or fads that dissipate or frustrate. This one is eternal. It started with a King who left His throne, who turned Himself out to the world, no matter its rejection. In His very posture of salvation, crucified, He opened Himself to a world that looked hostile. But what He saw in His faithful praying was a world redeemed, a kingdom coming. Thanks be to God!
