Making peace by the blood of his cross — Colossians 1:15-20

Grace, peace, and mercy to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

We are averaging about one major superhero movie per month this year. Last year's superhero movies made literal billions of dollars. From mutant genes to symbiotic aliens to vibranium armor to incredibikes, we watch in awe as human beings who are just like us in some ways do things only modern special effects (or good old-fashioned imagination) make credible.

These are not new stories. Homer sang of an Achilles who could only be hurt in the ankle by which he was held when dipped in a magic fountain. One of the first English poems tells of Beowulf's great fights with monsters high and low. Stan Lee and Jack Kirby revolutionized comics over fifty years ago. Movie magic has finally met the technological threshold to tell onscreen the kind of stories human beings have long loved to hear.

The recipe Stan Lee and Jack Kirby perfected was making their heroes both fantastic and flawed. Readers could relate even as they wondered. It's not just raw spectacle that sells these tales. They are connecting to a desire deep in our souls.

Jesus is the archetype, the original, for what the best of these stories are reaching toward. Hebrews 4 describes Jesus in superheroic terms as a high priest who has "passed through the heavens" (4:14) but has also been "tempted as we are" (4:15), though he didn't fall to temptation. We want to see humanity capable of more without losing our grounding. Jesus walks on water and weeps at Lazarus' tomb. He is fully God and fully man.

When He rose from the dead, Jesus' body cast off the limitations He had lived under to save us on the cross. He passed through locked doors. He appeared and disappeared. And yet He still stopped to break bread and eat fish with His friends.

In Paul's great chapter on the resurrection, 1 Corinthians 15, Jesus' apostle builds to the promise that we, too, shall be changed. "For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality" (15:53).

We long to see the mortal become immortal, to watch bullets bounce off a shining hero. We long to see it because it is the hope the Holy Spirit writes deep into our hearts. There is more to us than anyone has yet seen. "Beloved, we are God's children now, and what we will be has not yet appeared; but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, because we shall see him as he is" (1 John 3:2).

This is not a tale movie magic can yet or ever tell. For the changes will not just be wind-blown capes, flashing energy patterns, or glowing gems. Our hearts will be supercharged with love, our consciences left unperturbed, our spirits uplifted with true praise.



YARD SALE: JUNE 1



NEW MEMBERS CLASS: SATURDAYS



During this campaign baby bottles will be available in our church for members / friends of our congregation. Please consider taking one or more bottles and filling them with loose change (cash or checks if you prefer).

Monies raised will fund the ministry of ALC which is a 501c3 nonprofit offering services free of charge to anyone experiencing an unplanned pregnancy and / or who needs peer counseling, pregnancy tests, baby clothing and items, food and formula, diapers, classes in Parenting, Bible Study and Homemaking, Abstinence information., Adoption referrals, Male Mentoring or Post Abortion Recovery.

Please take as many bottles as you like, fill them, and return them to the church on Father's Day, June 16. You may also drop them off at ALC if you'd prefer. They are located at: 7121 Henry Clay Street in the back of the same building as Operation Care. Their hours are Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, 9am to 5pm or you may call them at (502) 647-0300. Your donation assists them in saving the lives of unborn children and ministering to their parents. Last year, Holy Cross requested 35 bottles and returned 29 with a total of \$182.79 donated!
