Making peace by the blood of his cross — Colossians 1:15-20

Grace, peace, and mercy to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

Job 1:21 records the lament of the righteous and wealthy man who lost everything: "Naked I came from my mother's womb and naked shall I return. The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord."

We do enter the world naked, but rarely remain so for long. Parents or nurses are quick to give a blanket and clothing. Not much time passes and the baby adds a stuffed animal, a crib, a rattle, and so the collection of stuff grows. Over the weekend, I met a few ladies who hoped to shop our yard sale. They were a week early and in addition to inviting them back, I said there was a yard sale going on in my neighborhood. The ladies responded, "Oh, there's only baby stuff at that one."

So naked we come into the world, but quickly we get stuff, but then we grow out of that stuff. Yard sales are a good time to reflect, how much stuff we can collect that we have no use for.

And yet it can be so hard to get rid of stuff we no longer have use for. Our memories collect around the stuff, so that even if our hands don't have a use for them, our hearts still do. We may not have used that kitchen gadget, but it reminds us of the party we threw and the people we miss and let's keep it for another year.

When we think of all the stuff we don't want to lose, the words of Job hit home: "and naked shall I return." None of the stuff goes with us. Not a lick of it passes into the next life.

Job did not give away his stuff. It was taken. And his response is amazing. "The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away; blessed be the name of the Lord." Job not only blesses the God who gave, he blesses the God who took.

When I was a child, I had a blanket I would take with me everywhere, like Linus from *Peanuts*. My parents told me I couldn't keep carrying a blanket around as I got older. Of course, I didn't understand this. It was my stuff! So my parents took to cutting away part of the blanket, a piece at a time. Eventually, I had just a handkerchief. And then one day after school, that was gone.

As a parent now, I see their wisdom. My parents gave and my parents took away; blessed be my parents who loved me both in the giving and the taking.

Through faith, we learn to approach stuff the same way. None of it can go with us anyway. In the taking, as well as the giving, we may learn to see the loving hand of God.

Please take as many bottles as you like, fill them, and return them to the church on Father's Day, June 16. You may also drop them off at ALC if you'd prefer. They are located at: 7121 Henry Clay Street in the back of the same building as Operation Care. Their hours are Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, 9am to 5pm or you may call them at (502) 647-0300. Your donation assists them in saving the lives of unborn children and ministering to their parents. Last year, Holy Cross requested 35 bottles and returned 29 with a total of \$182.79 donated!




