Making peace by the blood of his cross -Colossians 1:15-20

Grace, peace, and mercy to you from our Savior and King, Jesus Christ. Amen.

As we begin November, many of our thoughts will be towards elections in our country. Who will rule us over the next term? At the end of the month, I hope our thoughts settle around something wonderfully certain, the advent of our King, Jesus. The first Sunday of Advent is November 29, beginning a season of hope and preparation.

A book of the Bible that also pairs political concerns with faith and hope in the kingdom of the Messiah is Daniel. Daniel lived in the time when Jerusalem was destroyed and so many Israelites were carried into Babylonian captivity. Daniel was privileged to serve the conquering king Nebuchadnezzar but that opportunity was fraught with danger. Displeasing kings who expected to be worshipped as gods could lead to being thrown into fiery furnaces (Daniel 3) or lions' dens (Daniel 6).

And yet, when Nebuchadnezzar has a dream that foretold his downfall, Daniel does not cheer the chastening of a murderous tyrant with delusions of godhood. He says, in effect, would that your dream fell on your enemies instead of you! How many years had it been since Israel had been Nebuchadnezzar's enemy, falling before him in war? Yet Daniel could love Nebuchadnezzar.

No doubt Daniel longed for Israel's captivity to end, for the walls and temple of Jerusalem to be rebuilt. But in that time of Israel's punishment, foretold by Israel's prophets, Daniel put his head down and served an evil king, even wishing that king be spared trouble.

Trusting that the times and the seasons are God's, that He will lift up the humble and bring down the mighty, allows us to live with hope and faithful service to our neighbor. As Daniel explains Neb-uchadnezzar's fearful dream, the king comes to know he will be humbled, humiliated even. But repentance will lead to mercy and restoration. What was true for Israel as a nation would be true for Nebuchadnezzar as a man. It is true for all generations. When humbled, we can turn to the Lord in hope and faith and He will raise us up at the right time.

Daniel 4 repeats this theme: "the Most High rules the kingdom of men and gives it to whom He will" (4:25, 32). As the chapter closes, even Nebuchadnezzar confesses, "All the works [of the King of Heaven] are right and His ways are just; and those who walk in pride He is able to humble" (Daniel 4:37). Did Daniel's gracious, faithful service help inspire the least expected Gentile to believe and be saved?

In this vein, our Advent theme this year will center around waiting for the Lord. The Psalms, Prov-

erbs, and Isaiah all use this phrase exactly, "Wait for the Lord" (Ps 27:14, Pr 20:22, Is 40:31). Even more widespread in the Bible than the exact phrase is the concept, reaching from Abraham and Sarah waiting for Isaac's birth to the church's waiting for the return of Jesus.

We will ask in Wednesday vespers and daily Advent devotions, how do we wait for the Lord? How does our hope lift us while our hearts cry, "How long, O Lord?" We will see His faithfulness, inspiring our faith. We will know the coming kingdom. I pray you join us in the Advent hope: "Come Lord Jesus!"
