Making peace by the blood of his cross -Colossians 1:15-20

Grace, peace, and mercy to you from our Lord Jesus Christ!

Soon, our tree branches will be bare, evening darkness will stretch longer, and we won't think twice about grabbing a jacket on the way out the door. In the world, there are gifts to be sold and family gatherings to manage. In the church, the changing of the seasons remind us of Jesus' promised return, when the family of God will be gathered together eternally in perfect love. We do not know when Jesus will return but our confidence in that return gives us both hope and peace.

Advent, beginning this year November 27, is a season to be more conscious of time. As Moses reflected in his great prayer about time, "teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom" (Psalm 90:12). Through Advent we mark the Sundays, lighting candles on a wreath. While the growing light reminds us to hope in Jesus' coming, the evergreen reminds us of our invitation to join God's eternal life.

The world will blare that there are only 13 more shopping days until Christmas. For us, the countdown is not simplistic. "The years of our life are seventy, or even by reason of strength eighty; yet their span is but toil and trouble; they are soon gone, and we fly away" (Psalm 90:10). On the one hand, eighty years sounds long; on the other hand, "they are soon gone." Who has not looked up at a child or grandchild and wondered how they aged so quickly.

The candles on the Advent wreath burn down, the first shorter than those that come after. The evergreen retains its color, wrapping in that endless circle. Our lives on this earth "are soon gone," while simultaneously, we are made for eternity. "Make us glad for as many days as you have afflicted us, and for as many years as we have seen evil" (Psalm 90:15).

The wisdom that comes in numbering our days realizes we don't have time for everything in this world; we have time for everything in the next world. This world is full of toil and trouble; the next world is full of gladness. We can mark time morning after morning with God's steadfast love (90:14). Turning to God, gathering with His church, being constant in prayer, singing the hymns of grace in our homes, marking time that way leads to satisfaction, peace, love.

Otherwise, your days will fritter away in hustle, bustle, toil and trouble, and before you know it, the season will have changed and night fallen. May it not be, Lord! Rather, "let your work be shown to your servants, and your glorious power to their children" (90:16). Putting God's work before our eyes, reading the Bible, gathering around His gifts, that is what "establishes the work of our hands" (90:17).

Finally, the Advent wreath will have all the candles on the perimeter lit and the pattern will break. We will find one last candle in the center, the white candle that represents Jesus' coming to us. There is the wisdom that comes from numbering our days: Christ in you, the hope of glory (Colossians 1:9-29). I pray God's steadfast love satisfy you all through the end of this year and into eternal life, brothers and sisters in Christ.



What Makes for a Cheerful Giver?

St. Paul wrote to Church of Christ in Corinth: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). God loves a cheerful giver. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, he gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in God's sight. Abraham was. By faith, he prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israel's God and they His people.

What more shall we say? For time would fail us to tell of all those who gave not simply for the joy of giving but for the joy of knowing the One to whom they gave.

So also our Lord, who for the joy set before Him, gave everything – yes, even His life – enduring the cross and scorning its shame. He gave to the shedding of His blood, willingly and resolutely setting His face toward Jerusalem to die for the life of the world. Though He was rich in every way, He became poor, so that by His poverty, we might be rich beyond measure.

So then, let us like Abel and Abraham, like David and Solomon, and even like our Lord Jesus Christ, give cheerfully to God for the work of His kingdom in our midst. Like them, let us decide in our heart for the joy set before us. It's the joy of knowing the One to whom we give is the One who gives us all good things.
