Making peace by the blood of his cross — Colossians 1:15-20

Grace, peace, and mercy to you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

As we publish this letter, I will be in Milwaukee for our Synod's Convention. I had a professor in college who used to joke, "Why do they call those Lutherans 'Missouri Synod'?" The answer he almost scowled, "They never sin, so they are very odd!" Would that it were so! If we never sinned, that would be odd, but it would also cut down immensely on the work it takes to do things together across the borders of nations and languages.

The word "synod" actually means "walking together." We don't call our national body a "church," because we reserve the word "church" for groups that baptize, celebrate the Lord's Supper, encourage one another in daily discipleship, forgive sins, and gather around God's Word. Instead, the Synod helps individual churches by organizing schools, training pastors, supporting missionaries, and publishing books from VBS craft guides to commentaries on Hebrew poetry. Synod organizes churches to walk together.

What is some of the business of this year's Synod Convention? A lot of our focus will be on the challenges our Lutheran schools face. We get to celebrate the formal recognition of unity with several Lutheran denominations around the world. We'll craft responses to cultural movements of our day. Leaders will be elected and re-elected.

Preparation for me has taken hours, learning about the issues. Why devote these hours, instead of focusing on matters closer to hand? The institutions passed on to us are worth the work it takes to maintain them and pass them to the next generation. Increasingly, I see around me people less inclined to do the work to maintain institutions. At a local level, a troop leader says, "I'll just do all this myself," rather than work with others in the institution. But when that leader burns out, there's no one who worked alongside and knows what the previous leader did or how she did it. It seems easier to do things on our own, but walking together is how work continues from one generation to the next. Why doesn't that worker ask for help? People promise to help and do not follow through. Others don't even offer to help. Walking together means both asking for help and answering that call.

Ecclesiastes 2:18-19 laments, "I hated all my toil in which I toil under the sun, seeing that I must leave it to the man who will come after me, and who knows whether he will be wise or a fool? Yet he will be master of all for which I toiled and used my wisdom under the sun. This also is vanity." Solomon was indeed followed by a foolish son, Rehoboam. When Solomon was freshly buried, Rehoboam's foolish demands split Israel from a united kingdom into Samaria and Judah. Monarchies are unstable, rarely stringing together several good generations in a row. The institutions of our era were expected to be more durable, built with democratic buy-in. If instead we watch our institutions crumble, we can join Solomon's lament, "Vanity of vanities!"

But the day is not done. We can make wiser choices. If different choices are not made, we will see

schools and churches shuttered. We will be the generation who drops the ball, disappointing both those who went before and after. But the day is not done. We can put in the time and effort to pass on what was given to us.

It starts for most of us not at a Synod level. For all of us, we decide each week what kind of church we will be. Will we be a vibrant church where Sunday school teachers rejoice to find full classrooms with children eager to learn? Will we be a loving congregation, rejoicing to gather together weekly? Will we grow in the Word or choose instead the recreation that does not recharge us spiritually, recreation that does not build community, recreation that dissipates the good other generations had gathered?

I will come back from Synod Convention and go straight to working to gather us for Rally Day, August 20. Every year, I hope and pray and encourage Rally Day to regather us with enthusiasm and joy. Each week we pour time and energy and love into Holy Cross, we find we get so much more back. It never crosses our minds to regret those decisions. We are so thankful for Holy Cross and the work God does among our church when we gather around His Word.

Gathering as a church is the opposite of "vanity of vanities." Gathering as a flock is humbling. You wait and see what God is doing, what He is bringing through His people. "Vanity of vanities" is anxious fear of when things will fall, but gathering with God's people is thrilling security, knowing the Good Shepherd is providing. All praise to Him, the king who cannot be removed from the throne, Jesus, our Lord!





DEFINE YOUR LIFE BY HOW YOU GIVE

Winston Churchill reportedly said that "we make a living by what we get, but we make a life by what we give." According to Churchill, our lives are defined not by what we have gotten, but by what we give away.

Our Lord's life is defined in this way. He gave completely of Himself for us. He became man for us. He taught the truth of God's Word. He healed those with many and various diseases. He died the death that we deserved for our sins. He gave of Himself in order to save us from sin, death and hell. And so it is that by giving completely of Himself, He got for Himself us, making us cit-izens of His eternal kingdom by grace.

As it was for Jesus, so it also is for us. We get more from giving than we do from simply getting. For giving softens our hearts and frees us from the grip which the worries of this world and mak-ing a living has on us. For when we are singularly focused on making a living, we are singularly focused on what we get. That mindset begins to bleed into all areas of our lives — our relation-ships with friends and family, with neighbors and coworkers, and with the Lord. It shifts our fo-cus from asking the question, "How can I be a friend, family member, neighbor and servant to others," to asking the question, "What have they done for me lately?" We become more selfish instead of selfless.

But when we give, we do not have less, we do not become less; rather, we have more and be-come more. When we give, we join in the bond of friendship and family, the bond of service to those around us out of love for them. And love is the fulfillment of the Law. It is the nature of God Himself, for God is Love. Thus, we are participating in the divine nature. As Jesus said, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).
