Confirmation Day

Pastor Chu

On July 2, four young people will go through the Rite of Confirmation during the Divine Service. I had the privilege of baptizing three of them when they were infants and watching all four of them grow in their faith in Christ by the grace and work of the Holy Spirit through the hearing and learning of the Word and God. Credit and thanks go to their parents and Sunday school teachers who taught them the Word of God and about Jesus and — along with other Christians in their lives, including members of Holy Cross — encouraged and prayed for them.

These four young people — Alex R., Brandon V., Kamryn C., and Kayleigh C. are active in the life of the fellowship of believers here at Holy Cross. They attend and participate faithfully in the divine service and Sunday school. They serve in the divine services as usher (Brandon) and acolytes (Alex, Kamryn, and Kayleigh). Along with their families, they host Christmastime bake sales to raise money for charity.

Their past three years of confirmation instruction (one year overview of Scripture and two-year study of the Small Catechism) and their life in the church from their baptism, where they were washed in what St. Paul calls the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit (Titus 3:5), to the present have prepared them for their Rite of Confirmation. This "journey" that started at their baptism is a lifelong journey and their Day of Confirmation is not the end but the continuation — albeit a new phase — of this journey that is their life in Christ. The Holy Spirit nourished their faith along the way with His Word; from this point, He will continue to sustain and strengthen their faith with the Word of God but also with the Sacrament of Christ's body and blood in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Their parents will continue to play a vital role in encouraging them in the faith by bringing them to the means of grace on Sundays. However, by answering the following questions in their Rite of Confirmation with "I do, by the grace of God," they vow and commit to making the means of grace an integral and indispensable part of their lives:

- Do you confess the doctrine of the Evangelical Lutheran Church, drawn from the Scriptures, as you have learned to know it from the Small Catechism, to be faithful and true?
- Do you intend to hear the Word of God and receive the Lord's Supper faithfully?



 Do you intend to live according to the Word of God, and in faith, word, and deed to remain true to God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, even to death?

 Do you intend to continue steadfast in this confession and Church and to suffer all, even death, rather than fall away from it?

As we give thanks to God for the faith in Christ that He gave to Alex, Brandon, Kamryn, and Kayleigh in Holy Baptism and for their affirmation of that faith on the Day of Confirmation, we are reminded to give thanks for the faith He has given us and to reflect on the vows we once made to our Savior and Lord, Jesus Christ. And as we give thanks to God for nourishing their faith with the means of grace, we are reminded and encouraged to be faithful in hearing the Word of God and receiving the Lord's Supper, the means of grace through which the Holy Spirit nourishes and strengthens our faith and faithfulness.

Please join me in continuing to support Alex, Brandon, Kamryn, and Kayleigh with our words of encouragements, examples of the life in Christ, and, above all, our prayers.



Nifty Fifty Senior Outings for July and August

JULY OUTINGS

The first is to a restaurant called Digger's Diner located at 1895 Farm Bureau Road in Concord, CA 94519 on **Thursday**, **July 6th** at our regular time of 1:00. I have never been there, but it is highly recommended for its hamburgers which are all 1/3 lb. except where you request a double which is 2/3 lb. A regular hamburger is \$3.99 and a cheeseburger is \$4.49. They have Bacon Burgers and Turkey Burgers and others as well. It's a little like Giant Hamburger because you order everything a la cart. Fries are \$2.49. They have Cajun Fries, Garlic fries, Ball Park fries and many more. They have a Rueben Special and they also have Wraps, New York Steak sandwiches, on and on. I also took a peek at their breakfast menu and was totally impressed to the point that (if I can get someone to go for breakfast) I would like to try it. Breakfast in all other Diggers is served all day except the one we are going to, it ends at 11 a.m. It looks like something worth our trying. Our second outing is on Thursday, July 20th to an old favorite, D J Bistro, a German restaurant located at 1825 Sutter St. Concord, CA 94520 where the food is outstanding, especially if you like German food. Wiener Snitzel, Sauerbraten, Red Cabbage and of course the glass of beer for those of you who want to imbibe. The beer comes in half liters which is an excellent stimulus to great discussions!
