The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2018

"The season of giving ends, but the need remains" is the caption that flashes across the screen in a recent State Farm ad encouraging charitable work.

The ad opens with a scene at a bustling soup kitchen filled with people engaged in conversation and enjoying a meal together, as volunteers serve and children cheerfully run to and fro. In the background, a man (musician Willis Earl Beal) is playing the piano and singing, in a low, barely audible voice, a somber version of the Simple Minds song, "Don't You (Forget About Me)"

The ad transitions to a scene of the same, but now nearly empty, soup kitchen, with what appears to be a single volunteer, and as the ad ends, Beal audibly sings the song's refrain and one other line from the song, Don't you, forget about me. Don't, don't, don't, don't. Don't you, forget about me... As you walk on by... and the caption, "The season of giving ends, but the need remains" appears across the screen.

The State Farm ad calls attention to what we know or at least can imagine: the spirit of volunteerism and charity that peaks during the Christmas season fades dramatically after Christmas, yet the needs of the beneficiaries of such charitable work remain after Christmas.

Thank God that His giving of spiritual and material blessings to us are not confined to Christmas or any other season of the year. Thank God that in the Incarnation and Birth of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, God gave us a gift that keeps on giving. For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall perish, but have eternal life. (John 3:16). The Son of God, Immanuel — God with us — came into our world to live, suffer, and die for us to atone for our sins and guilt, and arising from the dead guaranteed our resurrection to life upon His return.

God didn't show us His grace just at Christmas but He continues to meet our needs. The forgiveness bought and paid for with the blood of Jesus is renewed to us again and again in the assurance of forgiveness in the Gospel and the Sacrament of Christ's body and blood that we receive by grace through faith. He continues to comfort and give peace that passes understanding and transcends circumstances.

On top of spiritual blessings, God gives us daily what we need for life and countless gifts, including material blessings, none of which we deserve but all which He gives because of His goodness and mercy.

As we continue to receive spiritual and material blessings from the God who doesn't and won't stop giving, may God move us to charity toward those whose needs remain even though the world's "season of giving" has come and gone; we

Long Range Planning and Call Committee Update

In November the Council and Elders shared with you our plan to create a Long Range Planning and Call Committee to work together as Pastor Chu moves toward his planned retirement. Pastor is supporting us in this transition with his advance notification, flexible window of timing and advice in the process. He has also encouraged that the selection and calling of a new pastor is the responsibility of our congregation and church family. We are starting our work as long range planning because this change is a natural time to review how we are fulfilling the Great Commission and our Mission in serving God, our church family and community, and confirm how we will proceed in our Mission and in selecting a new pastoral leader.

We have a core committee of volunteers and room for more. Please consider volunteering to participate in the committee. We are starting with planning meetings each Sunday after worship, convening concurrent with coffee fellowship except on Sundays with other scheduled meetings such as Voter's Assembly meetings.

As a first step, all members and worshippers are invited to complete our short survey in early February. It is intended to collect important information from you about our ministry at Holy Cross and opinions and desires as we proceed in the call process. We ask that the survey is returned by Sunday, February 11, so that we can compile and share summary information in our February 18 Voter's Assembly meeting.

We ask that all members of our church family pray about this matter, that we will be guided by the Holy Spirit and act in ways that glorify and please God, and that He will reveal and send a new Pastor to us who will continue His plans for us. Mike Liebe

Facilities and Maintenance Committee Update

Our Holy Cross Facilities and Maintenance Committee has been in place for a few months now and has been making good progress in working together to take care of physical needs at our church. The Committee has set up a monthly-rotating, on-call person to share duties and provide a point of contact for facility needs.

Some F&M projects completed in 2017 include heavy duty trimming of the Ed Building privet and other shrubs, fence post repairs, removal of a dead tree in the courtyard, re-staining of handrails and benches, and sanctuary roof repair; in addition to our ongoing inspections and preventive care such as fire extinguisher and EXIT sign servicing.

For 2018 we have a number of projects already in the hopper that include tractor servicing, more roof repair, painting, grinding lifted sidewalks, and adding more motion-sensor lighting on the grounds. You may have noticed two of our signs have had dazzling makeovers, thanks to coordination by Marilyn Neumann and Women of Holy Cross funding from Corner Café proceeds. Thank you! And a big project we expect to finally accomplish this year is the replacement of our Parish Hall roof.

Ed Building Alarm System - A SimpliSafe monitored alarm system was installed in December as an Eagle Scout project and is now operational. If you have a key that will open any of the Ed Building entry doors (including the wing doors such as the library), it is important that you receive instruction about the alarm system and a PIN code to allow turning the system off and on. If in doubt, please contact our office or a Facilities Committee or Council member.



In addition to ongoing planning and projects, there are five Saturday work parties scheduled for 2018 - February 10, April 14, August 11 and November 10 for Holy Cross volunteers; and a Troop 484 Boy Scout work party on July 14. Our wish list for our next work party on February 10 includes:

- More Ed Building privet trimming to expose our pole lighting better.
- Adding motion-sensor lighting at the back of the Parish Hall, and Ed Building entrances.
- Weed abatement for all the green we are seeing sprouting up.
- Refurbishing the sanctuary doors.
- Starting to organize our tool inventory.

We have projects to fit all abilities.





how many to plan on. Bring a friend and meet at church at 12:00. We leave at 12:15. Marv Kreitz
