He's Risen! In our March newsletter, I quoted extensively Dr. Albert Mohler's article, *Moralism is Not the Gospel (But Many Christians Think It Is)*, in which he wrote of false gospels, based on Paul's words in Galatians 1:6-9<sup>(1)</sup>; Dr. Mohler offered moralism as a prime example of a contemporary and particularly seductive false gospel. In my article, I encouraged you to read the Scriptures in order to know the true Gospel so that, beyond knowing and being certain that you are saved by grace through faith in Jesus, you will also:

- 1. Be able to recognize false gospels
- 2. Be prepared to give a reason for your hope in Christ because of the Gospel<sup>(2)</sup> Continuing the same theme, I encourage your to read the Gospel accounts of Christ's resurrection. Read also 1 Corinthians 15, 1 Thessalonians 4, John 11, Acts 2, Romans 6, etc., and look up other passages that speak directly of, or allude to, Christ's resurrection and our future resurrection so that you would be ready to share the Good News of resurrection.

Then think about Christ's resurrection and what His resurrection means for us. For example, consider:

What is Christ's resurrection?

What testimony do we have in Scripture that Jesus arose from the dead?

How did Christ's resurrection changed the way His followers lived?

What hope does Christ's resurrection give to us for what comes after death?

What difference does Christ's resurrection make in the way you live?

How does Christ's resurrection and His promise of your resurrection through faith in Him

inform and help you face challenging circumstances in your life and the life of others dear to you, for example, illnesses, grief, even death?

#### Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 15:

<sup>12</sup>Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? <sup>13</sup>But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. <sup>14</sup>And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain.

<sup>20</sup>But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. <sup>21</sup>For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. <sup>22</sup>For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive.

<sup>51</sup>Behold! I tell you a mystery. We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed, <sup>52</sup>in a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, and the dead will be raised imperishable, and we shall be changed. <sup>53</sup>For this perishable body must put on the imperishable, and this mortal body must put on immortality. <sup>54</sup>When the perishable puts on the imperishable, and the mortal puts on immortality, then shall come to pass the saying that is written: "Death is swallowed up in victory." <sup>55</sup>"O death, where is your victory? O death, where is your sting?" <sup>56</sup>The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. <sup>57</sup> But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

<sup>58</sup>Therefore, my beloved brothers, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain.

People might question us about the resurrection and challenge us to prove that Christ arose from the dead. We might fail to answer adequately their challenge and so to avoid such failure, we shy from sharing the Gospel.

Share the Gospel as God gives opportunity. Tell people about Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection and what they mean for you, them, and all people, and not just for the future but in the here and now. And then let the Holy Spirit do what He has promised to do, that is, to work through his Word to bring people to faith.

- (1) <sup>6</sup>I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel <sup>7</sup>not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ. <sup>8</sup>But even if we or an angel from heaven should preach to you a gospel contrary to the one we preached to you, let him be accursed. <sup>9</sup>As we have said before, so now I say again: If anyone is preaching to you a gospel contrary to the one you received, let him be accursed. (Galatians 1:6-9)
- (2) Always being prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and respect." (1 Peter 3:15b)


