As we celebrate the Reformation, we praise God for the faithfulness of Martin Luther and the other 16<sup>th</sup> century reformers who, by the grace of God and the power of the Holy Spirit working through the Word, re-anchored and reoriented the Church in and toward the Scriptures and the Gospel that sinners are justified (declared "not guilty") by grace alone (sola gratia) through faith alone (sola fide) for the sake of Christ alone (solus Christus, whose sacrificial death at the cross atoned for the sin of the world), which truth God has revealed in Scripture alone (sola Scriptura).

Every generation presents challenges to the truth of Scripture, including the Gospel of justification by faith. Some of the challenges we face are reincarnations of those the Church faced in generations past; others are unique to the spiritual, moral, social, and political context.

The bigger danger to the Church and to Christians is not unbelievers or their challenges to our faith in Christ; the bigger danger comes from Christians who espouse and cajole us not with outright false teachings but with false teachings sprinkled with truths from Scripture.

Our biggest test is how we will respond to attacks on the Gospel and the *Word of God:* 

Will we yield, compromise, and scratch itching ears by telling people what they want to hear (2Timothy 4:3-4) under the banner of "being all things to all people... and save some" (1Corinthians 9:22b)?

Or will we stand on the Word of God as the final authority on truth and let it dictate, inform, and guide us in all areas and arenas of life?

We don't quote the Reformation principles of grace alone, faith alone, Christ alone, Scripture alone because they're fun to say, especially in Latin, but because they reorient us to the source, the content, and the anchor of our faith.





We are again planning on two activities for October. The first is to the Clayton Oktoberfest on Saturday, October 6th.



#### Bio of Rev. Jerry and Patty Lawson

Serving the Lord in Russia

Rev. Jerry and Patty Lawson serve the Lord through The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) as missionaries in Russia. In this role, Jerry teaches courses in Lutheran theology at the Theological Institute of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ingria in Russia (ELCIR), located in Koltushi.

Jerry's hometown is San Jose, Calif., where his home congregation, First Immanuel Lutheran Church, is located. He received a bachelor's degree in English from the University of Maryland, College Park, and a bachelor's degree in social studies from Utica College, Utica, N.Y. He received his Master of Divinity from Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Ind. Prior to serving in Russia, Jerry served as the pastor at Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Fort Myers, Fla. (2001-2009), and the pastor at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, North Fort Myers, Fla. (2010-2018). He also served in the United States Air Force from 1986-1994. His hobbies include history, jazz, reading, anime and cooking.

Patty's hometown is San Jose, Calif., and her home congregation is First Immanuel Lutheran Church, San Jose, as well. She received her college degree from Mohawk Community College, Utica, N.Y. She has worked as a registered nurse since 1993. Patty's hobbies include sewing and crafting. Jerry and Patty have three children - Cosette, Juliette and Aleksander. Prayers

#### **Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ingria**

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ingria is a Lutheran Church in Russia. It is the second largest Lutheran Church in Russia, with 75 congregations and 20,000 members, and is mostly active in Ingria and Karelia, and also in other regions.

The Church was officially established in 1992, following the separation from the Estonian Evangelical Lutheran Church, though the first Lutheran parish in Ingria was founded in 1611, and the church recognizes this date as the date of its original foundation.

The history of the Church is deeply connected with the history of the Ingrian Finns, and the Church, being confessional and traditional, follows the Nordic Lutheran tradition, though being more conservative.

It is a member of both the Lutheran World Federation and the International Lutheran Council.

Day 83, September 21, 2018

We are sitting in the warm car on the roof of the parking garage at the VA enjoying the jets overhead (sunroof open) and the beautiful view of the Olympics and Elliott Bay and downtown Seattle. Quite an interlude between appts this am and the next one at 1 pm. Gotta take advantage of the opportunities presented.

Ric started his 3 month evaluations today and will continue through next week. They checked bone density and pulmonary today. Heart, eyes, CT 's, dermatology and probably bone marrow biopsy next week. Gotta get comparisons to before the stem cell transplant.

Good news is he has gained 9 lb since his low of 2 weeks ago. Pretty amazing since he has been on a roller coaster ride during that time with a respiratory virus which turned into a low grade pneumonia and hospitalized for 5 days...blood counts that have been fluctuating resulting in 3 blood transfusions, and shots to boost his white cell count. Just part of the roller coaster ride..and reality check of why we will be here till next May.

So now he builds back up. The weather is definitely telling us it is turning to fall. Smells and colors are definitely changing. Soon the Olympics we are looking at today will be glistening with snow...and my walks with friends will be harder to capture opportunities. Then I will have to resort to the equipment in the exercise room and watch the screens to view "scenery".

Gotta go get lunch before the next appt. Besides it is getting really warm here in the car! Hope all is well with you. Thanks for your continued support. The emails and text messages usually come through at a time when we most need the boost. Speaking of which we will be enjoying a visit from Peg and Mickey (Ric's sister and husband from AZ) tomorrow. Really looking forward to that.
